**Things to Know**

- Final grouping in R4 (Finau, McIlroy, Thomas): 37 PGA TOUR wins, three FedExCup titles, six majors, average OWGR of 10.7
- Defending champion and two-time FedExCup winner Rory McIlroy holds a share of the lead entering the final round
- With a victory, McIlroy would move into a tie for 31<sup>st</sup> on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list with 21
- Tony Finau ties his career-low score (62) to move into a tie for the lead
- Justin Thomas records his 19<sup>th</sup> score of 63 or better since joining the PGA TOUR, most of any player in that span
- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler cards a 1-over 71 and falls to T29
- Nick Taylor is T15 at 5-under 205, the best of any Canadian in the field

**Third-Round Lead Notes**

- 7 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the RBC Canadian Open since 2000 (most recent: Rory McIlroy, 2019)
- 11 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR in 2021-22 (most recent: Billy Horschel, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)

**Rory McIlroy (T1/-11) – defending champion**

- Has never successfully defended a PGA TOUR title (0-for-14 to date; three top-fives in those 14 starts, including a solo-5<sup>th</sup> at the Wells Fargo Championship in May)
- Three players have successfully defended a title this season (Viktor Hovland/World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba, Sam Burns/Valspar Championship, K.H. Lee/AT&T Byron Nelson); most in a season since 2016-17 (4)
- Second defending champion this season to hold the 54-hole lead/co-lead (Viktor Hovland/World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba)
- Three players since World War II have successfully defended RBC Canadian Open title: Jim Ferrier (1951), Jim Furyk (2007) and Jhonattan Vegas (2017)

- 8-for-14 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: T5, 2020 Genesis Invitational)
- Held the 54-hole lead at the 2019 RBC Canadian Open before tying his career-low with a final-round 61 (won by 7)
- T35 on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list with 20; with a win, would move to T31 (players with 21: Davis Love III, Willie MacFarlane, Lanny Wadkins, Craig Wood)
- One PGA TOUR win this season (THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT)
- Multiple titles in five PGA TOUR seasons to date (2012, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2018-19)
- Five multiple winners this season: Scottie Scheffler (4), Sam Burns (3), Hideki Matsuyama (2), Cameron Smith (2), Max Homa (2)

### Tony Finau (T1/-11)

- Ties career-low score on the PGA TOUR with a 62 (fourth instance; first since R3, 2020 WM Phoenix Open)
- 0-for-4 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (5<sup>th</sup>/2018 U.S. Open, P2/2018 WGC-HSBC Champions, P2/2020 WM Phoenix Open, 4<sup>th</sup>/2021 American Express)
- Ties career-low nine-hole score with a front-nine 29 (second instance; first: front, R2, 2020 American Express)
- 5-under on Nos. 8-11 (B-E-B-B), the longest birdie/eagle streak of his PGA TOUR career
- PGA TOUR wins (2): 2016 Puerto Rico Open, 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- Top-fives in two of his last four starts on TOUR (T2/Mexico Open at Vidanta, T4/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- One top-10 in four prior starts at the RBC Canadian Open (T5/2017)

### Miscellaneous notes

- **Justin Thomas** (T3/-9) records a 7-under 63, his 19<sup>th</sup> round of 63 or better since joining the PGA TOUR at the start of the 2014-15 season (most of any player in that span; second-most: 13, Kevin Na and Jordan Spieth)
- **Sam Burns** (T3/-9) can tie Scottie Scheffler for most PGA TOUR wins this season with four; last time two players won four or more times in a season: 2016-17 (Justin Thomas/5, Dustin Johnson/4)
- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** cards a 1-over 71 and falls to T29; Scheffler, who entered the week No. 2 on TOUR in Third-Round Scoring Average (68.62), snaps a streak of 11 consecutive under-par third-round scores (first in the 2022 calendar year)
