Things to Know

- Jordan Spieth defeats Patrick Cantlay in a playoff to win the RBC Heritage, earning his 13th PGA TOUR title and first since the 2021 Valero Texas Open
- Spieth becomes the 82nd player to reach 13 wins on the PGA TOUR and moves to T72 on the all-time wins list
- Spieth moves to No. 11 in the FedExCup standings with the win, his highest position of the season
- The playoff was the first in the FedExCup era (est. 2007) between two FedExCup Champions

- Wins the RBC Heritage in a playoff over Patrick Cantlay, earning his 13th PGA TOUR title in his 226th start at the age of 28 years, 8 months, 21 days
- PGA TOUR wins (13): 2013 John Deere Classic, 2015 Valspar Championship, 2015 Masters Tournament, 2015 U.S. Open, 2015 John Deere Classic, 2015 TOUR Championship, 2016 Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2016 Charles Schwab Challenge, 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2017 Travelers Championship, 2017 Open Championship, 2021 Valero Texas Open, 2022 RBC Heritage
- Becomes the 82nd player to reach 13 wins on the PGA TOUR and moves to T72 on the all-time wins list
- Moves from No. 47 to No. 11 in the FedExCup standings, his highest position of the season
- Moves from No. 20 to No. 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking (inside the top 10 for the first time since October 30, 2021)
- Made two eagles in the final round (Nos. 2 and 5), becoming the 16th different player (19th instance) on record (1983-present) to make multiple eagles in the final round and go on to win; second this season (Hideki Matsuyama, ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- Fourth career round on TOUR with multiple eagles and first since the third round of the 2022 WM Phoenix Open
- Began the final round T9 at 8-under, three strokes back of 54-hole leader Harold Varner III; eight of the last 10 RBC Heritage winners have now come from at least two strokes behind entering the final round
- Seventh winner this season to enter the final round trailing by at least three strokes and first since Sam Burns at the Valspar Championship

- With rounds of 69-68-68-66, posts four scores in the 60s for the first time since the 2021 Open Championship (2nd)

Playoff notes

- Spieth moves to 5-3 in playoffs on the PGA TOUR (most recent: lost to Dustin Johnson, 2017 FedEx St. Jude Championship – first event of FedExCup Playoffs)
- Cantlay moves to 3-3 in playoffs on the PGA TOUR (most recent: lost to Scottie Scheffler, 2022 WM Phoenix Open)
- Cantlay becomes the first player to lose in multiple playoffs in the same season since Joaquin Niemann in 2020-21
- Fifth playoff on the PGA TOUR this season (most recent: Sam Burns def. Davis Riley, Valspar Championship)
- 15th playoff in tournament history (most recent: Satoshi Kodaira def. Si Woo Kim, 2018)
- First playoff in the FedExCup era (est. 2007) between two FedExCup Champions
- First playoff in which both/all participants had won five times or more on the PGA TOUR since the 2018 WGC-Mexico Championship (Phil Mickelson def. Justin Thomas)

Miscellaneous notes

- **Patrick Cantlay** (P2) earns his third top-three finish and fourth top-10 in five starts at the event (T3/2017, T7/2018, T3/2019, MC/2021, P2/2022)
- 54-hole leader **Harold Varner III** (T3) now has three top-three results on the PGA TOUR, with two coming at the RBC Heritage (T3/2019 FedEx St. Jude Championship, T2/2021 RBC Heritage, T3/2022 RBC Heritage)
- **Shane Lowry** (T3) has finished in the top 15 in each of his last five stroke-play events, including a runner-up at The Honda Classic and back-to-back T3s (Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage)
- **Cam Davis** (T3) ties his career-low score on the PGA TOUR with a 63 (second instance; first: 2020 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- **Dylan Frittelli** (T66) was assessed a two-stroke penalty on No. 6 under Rule 10.1c (making stroke while standing across or on line of play)
- Defending champion **Stewart Cink** finished 68th
