#### **TOP STORYLINES**

The Rocket Mortgage Classic, which is being contested for the fourth time since its inception in 2019, is the 43rd of 44 events during the FedExCup Regular Season. With only two weeks remaining until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs, the Rocket Mortgage Classic provides an opportunity for players looking to secure one of the 125 spots in the FedExCup Playoffs.

Cam Davis returns to the Rocket Mortgage Classic after defeating 54-hole co-leaders Troy Merritt and Joaquin Niemann in a five-hole playoff to earn his first career PGA TOUR victory. At No. 76 in the FedExCup standings, the Australian enters the week with three consecutive top-20 finishes (T8/John Deere Classic, 6th/Barracuda Championship, T16/3M Open. Four defending champions have won this season, the most in a season since 2016-17 (4).

#### Players to successfully defend a title this season

Viktor Hovland World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba

Reigning FedExCup champion **Patrick Cantlay** is the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 4 in the Official World Golf Ranking and No. 6 in the FedExCup, on the strength of one win (Zurich Classic of New Orleans) and eight top-10s, including his last two starts (T4/Genesis Scottish Open, T8/The Open Championship). Cantlay will make his Rocket Mortgage Classic debut. The seven-time PGA TOUR winner has won twice when making his tournament debut (2017 Shriners Children's Open, 2020 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP).

Four PGA TOUR rookies are currently in the top 40 of the FedExCup standings, and three of them are in the field this week: **Cameron Young** (No. 13 in the FedExCup standings) **Davis Riley** (No. 24) and **Sahith Theegala** (No. 38). The Rookie of the Year as voted on by PGA TOUR membership at the end of the season will receive the Arnold Palmer Award. **Top rookies in the FedExCup standings** (**bold** in Rocket Mortgage Classic field)

# **ADDITIONAL STORYLINES**

**Will Zalatoris**, the only player inside the top 10 of the FedExCup standings without a win this season (No. 9), will make his first start since The Open Championship (T28). The reigning PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year has eight top-10 finishes including three runner-ups, with playoff losses at the Farmers Insurance Open and U.S. Open. Zalatoris finished 77th in his lone start in the 2021 Rocket Mortgage Classic.

**Jason Day** is making his third event start (MC/2020, T14/2021). Day is currently No. 127 in the FedExCup standings and has qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since joining the PGA TOUR in 2008 (14 straight seasons).

World No. 39 **Joohyung Kim**, is competing on a sponsor exemption for the second consecutive week after joining the PGA TOUR as a Special Temporary Member. A native of South Korea, Kim is now eligible for unlimited sponsor exemptions for the remainder of the season as he attempts to earn his TOUR card for the 2022-23 season. To earn full status for the 2022-23 season, Kim must earn as many or more non-member FedExCup points as the final eligible player from the 2021-22 FedExCup standings to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs. After finishing T26 at the 3M Open last week, Kim currently has 327 points, which would fall between Nos. 130 and 131 in the standings.

**Wyatt Worthington** won THE JOHN SHIPPEN National Golf Invitational at Detroit Golf Club last weekend with rounds of 73-65—138 (-6) to earn a spot in the Rocket Mortgage Classic. Worthington, a PGA of America professional at The Golf Depot in Gahanna, Ohio, will make his third PGA TOUR start (MC/2016 PGA Championship, MC/2022 PGA Championship).

After making his first start on TOUR since 2018 at the Barracuda Championship (MC), eight-time PGA TOUR winner **Geoff Ogilvy** will compete again this week on a sponsor exemption. Three sponsor exemptions who made the trip from the 3M
Open to Detroit include **Chris Gotterup** (T31), **Cole Hammer** (MC) and **Brandon Matthew**s (MC).

Morgan Hoffmann returned to the PGA TOUR at the 2022 RBC Heritage (MC) for the first time since the 2019 Shriners Children's Open (MC) after taking a Major Medical Extension following his facioscapulohumeral muscular dystrophy diagnosis. Following his return to the TOUR at Hilton Head, Hoffmann played two remaining events on his Major Medical Extension (MC/Wells Fargo Championship, 68th/Travelers Championship) and failed to reach the minimum number of points to retain his card and has since moved to the 151-200 category on the Korn Ferry Tour. Playing on a sponsor exemption, this week will mark his 167th PGA TOUR start and second appearance at the Rocket Mortgage Classic (MC/2019).

### **FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES**

Last time out: Tony Finau earned his third PGA TOUR victory in his 212th start at the 3M Open, his second win in his last 24 starts on TOUR (2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship). Finau started the final round five strokes back, marking the fifth comebeack victory of more than five shots this season (7: Justin Thomas/PGA Championship, Sam Burns/Charles Schwab Challenge; 5: Luke List/Farmers Insurance Open, Sepp Straka/The Honda Classic, Tony Finau/3M Open). Finau moved to No. 17 in the FedExCup standings and seeks to reach the TOUR Championship for the sixth consecutive season. Finau returns to Detroit Golf Club after finishing T53 in his tournament debut in 2020.

No. 1: World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler finished T21 at The Open Championship and has now earned \$13,176,910, the most in a season in PGA TOUR history (previous: \$12,030,465/Jordan Spieth/2014-15).

Rookie watch: Four PGA TOUR rookies are currently in the top 40 of the FedExCup standings as they attempt to qualify for the TOUR Championship in their first season on TOUR. There has not been in a season in the FedExCup era in which more than two rookies qualified for the TOUR Championship (seasons with 2: 2015-16, 2016-17, 2019-20). Only one rookie has won this season: Chad Ramey, (No. 72) Corales Puntacana Championship.
