### Things to Know

- Tony Finau wins fourth PGA TOUR title, and second in as many weeks on the heels of 3M Open victory
- Finau is the first player to win in back-to-back weeks during the FedExCup Regular Season since Brendon Todd in 2019
- Patrick Cantlay posts 10<sup>th</sup> top-10 of the season, most of any player
- With his fifth runner-up finish of the season, Cameron Young ties six other players for most in a season on TOUR in the last 40 years
- Three PGA TOUR rookies finish in the top six: Young (T2), Taylor Pendrith (T2) and Taylor Moore (6<sup>th</sup>)
- Joohyung Kim equals the 18-hole tournament scoring record with 9-under 63
- After making the cut on the number, defending champion Cam Davis finishes T14 at 15-under

- Wins fourth PGA TOUR title, and second in as many weeks, in his 213<sup>th</sup> start at 32 years, 10 months, 17 days (2016 Puerto Rico Open at Coco Beach, 2021 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2022 3M Open, 2022 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- Becomes one of eight multiple winners on TOUR this season
- Becomes second 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the Rocket Mortgage Classic (Nate Lashley/2019) and the 17<sup>th</sup> third-round leader/co-leader to win an individual stroke-play event on TOUR this season; now 1-for-6 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead (5<sup>th</sup>/2018 U.S. Open, P2/2018 WGC-HSBC Champions, P2/2020 WM Phoenix Open, 4<sup>th</sup>/2021 American Express, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2022 RBC Canadian Open, Won/2022 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- 26-under 72-hole total marks best of his career in relation to par; 262 total marks his career best 72-hole total (previous: 263/-17/2022 RBC Canadian Open/2<sup>nd</sup>)
- With 3M Open and Rocket Mortgage Classic victories, becomes third player to win in back-to-back starts this season (Xander Schauffele/Travelers Championship/Genesis Scottish Open, Scottie Scheffler/World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play/Masters Tournament)
- Becomes the first player to win back-to-back tournaments on TOUR since Patrick Cantlay in 2021 (BMW Championship, TOUR Championship)

- Becomes the first player to win back-to-back tournaments during the FedExCup Regular Season since Brendon Todd in 2019 (Butterfield Bermuda Championship, World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba)
- Hits a career-high 66 of 72 greens in regulation, tying third-most on TOUR since 1980 (69/Peter Jacobsen/1995 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 67/Willie Wood/1996 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Moves to No. 7 in the FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List; seeking to finish in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 at the end of the Regular Season (after this week's Wyndham Championship), where the player ranked No. 1 will earn \$4 million and the player who finishes No. 10 will earn \$1 million
- Victory marks his first in seven attempts when holding the lead/co-lead following the first round

## Joohyung Kim (7<sup>th</sup>/-18)

- In his 50<sup>th</sup> round on the PGA TOUR, fires 9-under 63 to tie the 18-hole tournament record, highlighted by an eagle 2 at the par-4 10<sup>th</sup> hole where he holed out from 127 yards; other 63s in tournament history (est. 2019): Nate Lashley (R1/2019), J.T. Poston (R2/2019), Lashley (R3/2019), Davis Thompson (R1/2021), Cameron Young (R2/2022)
- Earns 90 non-member FedExCup points and now has 417 for the season, which is expected to be enough to earn full PGA
  TOUR status for the 2022-23 season (needs to finish the FedExCup Regular Season with as many or more points as No. 125
  in the FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List)
- Accepted Special Temporary Membership after The Open Championship and has played the 3M Open and Rocket Mortgage
  Classic as a sponsor exemption; his top-10 finish earns a spot in this week's Wyndham Championship (had previously
  accepted a sponsor exemption into Wyndham Championship)
- At age 20, is currently the youngest player in the top 50 of the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 34)
- Seven international victories to date and led the Order of Merit in 2021 on both the Asian Tour and Korean Tour (Genesis points list)
- In his last 20 worldwide starts, has finished in the top five 10 times including his 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish at the Genesis Scottish Open

## **Additional Player Notes**

- Patrick Cantlay (T2/-21) plays the front nine in 15-under for the week and the back nine in 6-under; results in his last nine starts: P2, Win, MC, T3, T14, T13, T4, T8, T2; now owns 10 top-10s this season, most of any player; seeking to become the first player to win the FedExCup in back-to-back seasons (currently No. 5)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Cameron Young** (T2/-21) has five runner-up results and two T3 finishes in 22 starts this season; five runner-up finishes ties six other players for the most in a season on the PGA TOUR in last 40 years (Vijay Singh/2003, Ernie Els/2000, Jesper Parnevik/1997, Fuzzy Zoeller/1994, Mark Calcavecchia/1990, Mark O'Meara/1984)
- PGA TOUR rookie Taylor Pendrith (T2/-21) posts best 72-hole total of his career on TOUR (previous-best: 270/2021
  Barbasol Championship/T11) en route to his best result on TOUR (previous: T5/2021 Butterfield Bermuda Championship);
  finished T13 at THE PLAYERS Championship in March before taking time off to heal a fractured rib; records three top-15
  results in his three starts since returning to the TOUR in July (T13/Barbasol Championship, T11/Barracuda Championship,
  T2/Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- Making his 91<sup>st</sup> PGA TOUR start, six-time Korn Ferry Tour winner **Stephan Jaeger** (5<sup>th</sup>/-20) posts his second top-10 finish on TOUR (T6/2022 Wells Fargo Championship)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Taylor Moore** (6<sup>th</sup>/-19) posts his third top-10 of the season (T8/RSM Classic, T4/Zurich Classic of New Orleans) and his best result in an individual stroke-play event on TOUR (Note: Zurich Classic team event)
- Wyndham Clark (T8/-17) notches 10 birdies en route to 7-under 65 to equal his most birdies in a single round on TOUR (61/R1/2020 WM Phoenix Open)
- Four-time TOUR winner **Charley Hoffman** (T10/-16) moves to No. 148 in the FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List and is one of six players who have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in all 15 years
- Following a T8 at the Travelers Championship and T4 at the John Deere Classic, **Scott Stallings** (T10/-16) records three consecutive top-10 finishes for the second time in his career (2013 Charles Schwab Challenge/T4, Memorial Tournament sponsored by Workday/T4, FedEx St. Jude Classic/T2)
- After a 6-over 78 in round three, **Adam Scott** (T37/-10) cards 7-under 65 to move from T66 to T37 and sits No. 73 in the FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List
