TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

Strong field: The Shriners Children's Open field includes 26 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking, the most in the FedExCup era, including No. 8 Louis Oosthuizen and No. 9 Brooks Koepka. Oosthuizen made his tournament debut in 2020, finishing T19, while Koepka has two top-fives in five starts at the event (T4/2014, 2nd/2016).

Among the 26 players in the top 50 in the OWGR in the field, six competed in the September's Ryder Cup and are making their first start on the PGA TOUR since; three from the U.S. Team (Harris English, Brooks Koepka, Scottie Scheffler) and three that competed for Europe (Paul Casey, Viktor Hovland, Ian Poulter).

Milestone anniveraries: The 2021 Shriners Children's Open marks the 25th anniversary of Tiger Woods' first of 82 wins on the PGA TOUR (1996) and the 30th anniversary of Chip Beck's 59 in 1991.

Woods' victory came in a playoff against Davis Love III and led to Woods earning 1996 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year honors. Beck's 59, which came at the 1991 edition of the event, was the second sub-60 score in PGA TOUR history and stands as one of 12 such scores all-time.

Extra holes required: The Shriners Children's Open has gone to a playoff in three of the last four years, tied for the most of any PGA TOUR event in that span (The RSM Classic, BMW Championship).

Rookie watch: Four of the 27 PGA TOUR rookies are in the top 20 in the FedExCup standings after two weeks of the 2021-22 season, and all four are in the field this week: (5) Cameron Young, (6) Mito Pereira, (T13) Hayden Buckley and (19) Sahith Theegala.

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: Sam Burns won the Sanderson Farms Championship by one stroke over Nick Watney and Cameron Young, winning on TOUR for the second consecutive season. Burns entered the week as the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 25 in the Official World Golf Ranking and moved to No. 18 with the victory.

Nick Watney, who is using a one-time career earnings exemption in 2021-22 (top 50), finished T2 at the Sanderson Farms Championship, his sixth runner-up on TOUR and first since the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship (T2). Watney's last win on TOUR came at THE NORTHERN TRUST in 2012.

FedExCup standings: Two players that won on TOUR last season and won again in the first two weeks of the 2021-22 season share the lead in the FedExCup standings: Max Homa and Sam Burns. Homa won the season-opening Fortinet Championship, while Burns earned his second career TOUR title at the Sanderson Farms Championship.

Streaks extended in 2020-21: Dustin Johnson qualified for the TOUR Championship for the 13th consecutive season, the longest streak in the FedExCup era (2007-present). Six other players have active streaks of five years or more: Hideki Matsuyama (8), Patrick Reed (8), Justin Thomas (6), Tony Finau (5), Jon Rahm (5) and Xander Schauffele (5).

Six players have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each year during the FedExCup era (2007-present): Charley Hoffman (finished 32nd in the FedExCup), Phil Mickelson (70), Bubba Watson (81), Adam Scott (90), Brandt Snedeker (97) and Matt Kuchar (122).
