Weather: Partly cloudy. High of 70. Wind NNW 14-18 mph, gusting to 28 mph.

54-hole cut: 70 players at 7-under 209 from a field of 156 professionals. The final round will feature threesomes off split tees on the Stadium Course.

#### Things to Know

- Through 54 holes, a pair of PGA TOUR rookies, each making their 14th TOUR start, sit tied for the lead
- PGA TOUR rookie Paul Barjon has played his last six holes each round this week in 4-under par
- PGA TOUR rookie Lee Hodges shoots 64, two rounds removed from an opening-round 10-under 62
- With one bogey through 54 holes, **Tom Hoge** closes in on his first career PGA TOUR title in 201st start
- Seamus Power plays first six holes in 6-under in bid for second-consecutive top-5 finish on TOUR; with a win Sunday, is projected to move to No. 2 in the FedExCup
- 2017 American Express champion Hudson Swafford birdies four of last five holes to get within three of the lead
- An even-par 72 (Stadium Course) ends Patrick Cantlay's streak of consecutive rounds in the 60s on TOUR at 21

## Lee Hodges (T1/-18)

- Making his 14<sup>th</sup> career start on TOUR and eighth of the season, PGA TOUR rookie birdied six of his last nine holes on the Stadium Course en route to an 8-under 64
- Opened the week with a career-low 10-under 62 at La Quinta to claim a share of the 18-hole lead with Patrick Cantlay
- Prior to this week, best position after any round on TOUR was T2 after round one of the 2021 Puerto Rico Open (T13)
- Alabama native earned TOUR status after finishing No. 8 on Korn Ferry Tour points standings last season

- Won 2020 WinCo Foods Portland Open presented by KraftHeinz; paired in the final group with Paul Barjon, who finished T2
- Best finish in 13 prior TOUR starts is T11/2021 Barracuda Championship

### Paul Barjon (T1/-18)

- PGA TOUR rookie native offset a lone bogey with eight birdies to post a 7-under 65 on the Stadium Course; has played his last six holes in each round this week in 4-under par
- Prior to this week, best position after any round on TOUR was T15 after round two of the 2021 Sanderson Farms Championship (finished T39)
- Best finish in five starts this season is T39/2021 Sanderson Farms Championship
- Best finish on the PGA TOUR (13 starts) is T20/2019 RBC Canadian Open
- Earned PGA TOUR status by virtue of finishing inside the top-50 from the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour; lone victory on that Tour came at the 2020 Huntsville Championship

### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- Seeking his first career PGA TOUR title in his 201<sup>st</sup> start, **Tom Hoge (3<sup>rd</sup>/-17)** strung together four consecutive birdies on Nos. 4-7 at La Quinta en route to a 4-under 68; 17-under 199 mark his lowest 54-hole score to par in 191 stroke-play starts on the PGA TOUR (previously: -16/2018 Sony Open in Hawaii); played first 36 holes bogey-free for the first time in his PGA TOUR career (stroke-play events); lone bogey through 54 holes came at his first hole of the day in round three (No. 1/LQ)
- Seeking a second consecutive top-5 finish on TOUR (T3/Sony Open in Hawaii) and third of the 2021-22 season (T4/The RSM Classic), Ireland's Seamus Power (4<sup>th</sup>/-16) was 6-under through six holes (P-B-B-B-B-E) before finishing with a 6-under 66; with a win Sunday, is projected to move to No. 2 in the FedExCup; claimed his first career PGA TOUR title at the 2021 Barbasol Championship in a playoff victory over J.T. Poston
- Making his second start in The American Express (MC/2020), Harry Higgs posted a bogey-free 5-under 67 on the Stadium Course and sits T5 at 15-under 201; best of 60 career PGA TOUR starts are two runner-up finishes (2019 Bermuda Championship, 2020 Fortinet Championship)
- Following missed cuts in the 2020 and 2021 American Express, 2017 champion **Hudson Swafford (T5/-15)** birdied four of his last five holes on the Stadium Course (Nos. 5, 6, 8, 9) to post a 6-under 66
- After opening his fourth start at The American Express with a 10-under 62 (LQ) and 4-under 68 (NT), **Patrick Cantlay (T11/-14)** lost ground with an even-par 72 on the Stadium Course, ending his streak of consecutive rounds in the 60s on TOUR at 21; comes off a solo-second in the event last season, largely due to a course record 11-under 61 in the final round; in only other start of the season, finished fourth at the Sentry Tournament of Champions two weeks ago
- World No. 1 and 2018 American Express champion Jon Rahm (T15/-13) offset one bogey with six birdies on the Stadium Course to post a 5-under 67
- In his bid to become the first player to successfully defend his American Express title since Johnny Miller in 1976, Si Woo Kim sits T24 at 11-under 205
- Making his 19<sup>th</sup> start in The American Express, two-time tournament champion (2002, 2004) **Phil Mickelson** missed the cut for a third consecutive season (7-over 223)
