TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

What happens in Vegas: The PGA TOUR remains in Las Vegas, Nevada, with THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT being played in Las Vegas following the Shriners Children's Open for the second consecutive year due to challenges related to the ongoing COVID-19 global pandemic. 45 players are making the trip from TPC Summerlin to The Summit Club, including three that finished in the top 10 (Sungjae Im/Won, Marc Leishman/T3, Aaron Wise/T8).

First of many: In all four seasons THE CJ CUP has been played, the champion went on to win at least once again before the end of the season:

Justin Thomas (2017-18 season): The Honda Classic, World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational
 Brooks Koepka (2018-19 season): PGA Championship, WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational
 Justin Thomas (2019-20 season): Sentry Tournament of Champions, WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational
 Jason Kokrak (2020-21 season): Charles Schwab Challenge

The field: The 78-player field features seven of the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking and 36 players from the top 50. The last time seven or more of the top 10 competed in a 500-point FedExCup event was the 2021 Sentry Tournament of Champions (8) and 36 marks the most top-50 players in such an event since the 2020 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP (36).

"Home" game: Fresh off his victory at the Shriners Children's Open for his second PGA TOUR win, Sungjae Im, the highest-ranked Korean in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 21), headlines the 12 Koreans in the field. Two other players from Korea have won on the PGA TOUR since the last playing of THE CJ CUP and both are in the field: K.H. Lee and Si Woo Kim.

Ryder Cup representation: 17 players who played in the the 2020 Ryder Cup at Whistling Straits are in THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT field. Harris English, Tony Finau, Dustin Johnson, Brooks Koepka, Collin Morikawa, Xander Schauffele, Scottie Scheffler, Jordan Spieth and Justin Thomas were members of the U.S. team which defeated Europe 19-9, while European members Paul Casey, Tommy Fleetwood, Sergio Garcia, Tyrrell Hatton, Viktor Hovland, Shane Lowry, Rory McIlroy and Ian Poulter will also compete at The Summit Club.

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: Sungjae Im picked up his second PGA TOUR victory at the Shriners Children's Open in his 100th start. At the age of 23 years, 6 months, 10 days, Im became the second-youngest winner of the event behind 1996 champion Tiger Woods (20 years, 9 months, 6 days). With the victory, Im recorded the 20th win by a Korean on TOUR. Im shot an opening-round 63 and final-round 62, marking the first time he recorded two rounds of 63 or better in the same event and the 13th time a player on TOUR has accomplished this feat since the start of the 2018-19 season.

30 and under: All three winners during the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season have been 30 years old or younger: Max Homa, Fortinet Championship; Sam Burns, Sanderson Farms Championship; Sungjae Im, Shriners Children's Open. Eight of the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings are 30 or younger, led by Burns at No. 1.

Rookie watch: Three of the 27 PGA TOUR rookies are in the top 10 in the FedExCup standings after the first three events of the 2021-22 season: Cameron Young (8), Mito Pereira (9) and Hayden Buckley (10).

Streaks extended in 2020-21: Dustin Johnson qualified for the TOUR Championship for the 13th consecutive season, the longest streak in the FedExCup era (2007-present). Six other players have active streaks of five years or more: Hideki Matsuyama (8), Patrick Reed (8), Justin Thomas (6), Tony Finau (5), Jon Rahm (5) and Xander Schauffele (5).

Six players have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each year during the FedExCup era (2007-present): Charley Hoffman (finished 32nd in the FedExCup), Phil Mickelson (70), Bubba Watson (81), Adam Scott (90), Brandt Snedeker (97) and Matt Kuchar (122).

EXEMPTION SPOTLIGHT

Among the eligibility criteria for THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT is the winner of the 2021 KPGA Championship (Yoseop Seo), winner of the 2021 KPGA Genesis Championship (Jaekyeong Lee), and the top three available players from the KPGA Genesis Points List as of Monday, October 11: Hanbyeol Kim, Joohyung Kim, Sanghun Shin; in addition, the next three available players of Korean nationality from the Official World Golf Ranking on Monday, October 4: Byeong Hun An, Sung Kang and Seonghyeon Kim.

Joohyung Kim (No. 151 OWGR) won the 2020 Gunsan Country Club Open as an 18-year-old to become the youngest winner on the Korean Tour, which moved him into the top 100 in the OWGR and earned a spot in the field for the 2020 PGA Championship (MC). He be making his seventh PGA TOUR start (most recent: T15/2021 Puerto Rico Open).
