## TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

**Elevated event No. 3:** The Memorial Tournament presented by Workday is one of three PGA TOUR events with elevated status, along with The Genesis Invitational and the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard. Those three events offer a larger purse (\$12 million; up from \$9.3 million in 2021), an increased allotment of FedExCup points (550 to the winner and a three-year PGA TOUR exemption for the winner).

**Muirfield Village:** With another year of growth at Muirfield Village Golf and after a hearty renovation effort through 2020 and into 2021 - the Jack Nicklaus' signature course's green speed is back up to the traditional Memorial tournament zip. The renovation saw irrigation work done, bunkers rebuilt, the reconstruction of greens, resurfaced tee boxes and length added. The course opened in 1974 and has hosted the PGA TOUR every year since 1976.

**Attempt to go back-to-back:** Reigning FedExCup Champion Patrick Cantlay returns to defend his title at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday. Cantlay, who won in both 2019 and 2021, seeks to join Tiger Woods as the only players to win the Memorial Tournament in consecutive years (1999-2001). There have been three successful title defenses on TOUR this season, marking the most since the 2016-17 season (4).

**Rahm returns:** Spain's Jon Rahm, who enters the week No. 2 in the Official World Golf Ranking returns as a past event winner (2020). At the 2021 Memorial Tournament, Rahm held a six-stroke lead after the third round, what would be the largest 54-hole lead on TOUR in the 2021-22 season, but was forced to withdraw on Saturday evening after testing positive for COVID-19.

**Playoff prone:** Five of the last eight Memorial Tournaments have ended in a playoff.

## PLAYER STORYLINES

**Bryson DeChambeau** is set to return to competition after having surgery on his left wrist on April 14 following consecutive missed cuts at the Valero Texas Open and Masters Tournament. The 2018 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday champion is set to make his sixth appearance and finished T18 in his most recent start (2021).

**Jordan Spieth** is set to make his 10th start at the event and has three top-20 finishes in last three consecutive starts (T7/2019, T13/2020, T18/2021).

PGA TOUR rookie **Cameron Young** will make his tournament debut as he makes his first start since the PGA Championship (T3). Young, who is coming off top-three finishes in his last three starts, has three runner-ups on TOUR this season, the most of any player: T2/Sanderson Farms Championship, T2/The Genesis Invitational, T2/Wells Fargo Championship. Louis Oosthuizen collected four runner-up finishes in 2020-21, the most in a season on TOUR since Kevin Chappell in 2015-16 (4).

Reigning PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year **Will Zalatoris** will make his second start at the Memorial (MC/2018). Zalatoris missed the cut at last week's Charles Schwab Challenge following his second playoff appearance of the season at the PGA Championship. Zalatoris is 0-for-2 in career playoffs, both coming this season. The last player to lose three playoffs in a season: Kevin Kisner/2015. (Patrick Cantlay also has two playoff losses this season).

Columbus, Ohio resident and Muirfield Village Golf Club member **Jason Day** will make his 13th start at the event (best: T4/2020).

Japan's **Hideki Matsuyama** won his first of eight PGA TOUR titles at the 2014 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday at the age of 22, marking the youngest winner in tournament history.

Sponsor exemption **Bo Hoag**, a former Ohio State player, will make his third tournament start (MC/2012, T62/2020, T13/2021). His grandfather, Robert Hoag, was involved with Mr. Nicklaus in establishing Muirfield Village Golf Club.

Sponsor exemption and 2021 Jack Nicklaus Award recipient **John Pak** will be making his tournament debut and 12th PGA TOUR start. The Florida State alum finished atop last year's PGA TOUR University Velocity Global Ranking.

In his only other prior start at the 2014 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, Akron, Ohio native **Justin Lower** missed the cut with scores of 74-75 in 2014. The PGA TOUR rookie has one top-10 in 15 starts this season (T10/Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with partner Dylan Wu).

## FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

**Last time out:** Sam Burns defeated World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler in the first playoff hole at the Charles Schwab Challenge to earn his fourth career PGA TOUR title, and third of the season, at the age of 25 years, 10 months, 6 days in his 102nd start.

**Lucky Number Seven:** The last two weeks on the PGA TOUR schedule experienced final-round comebacks of seven strokes: Justin Thomas/PGA Championship, Sam Burns/Charles Schwab Challenge. There have been four instances of come-from-behind wins of five or more strokes this season on TOUR. In addition to Thomas and Burns, Luke List (Farmers Insurance Open) and Sepp Straka (The Honda Classic) won after starting the final round five strokes back.

**Rookie Update:** There are three rookies in the top 30 of the FedExCup, each who have three or more top-10s: Cameron Young (No. 12), Davis Riley (No. 20) and Mito Pereira (No. 25). Chad Ramey, No. 48 in the FedExCup, is the only rookie winner of the season.

**No. 1:** FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler has won four times in his last 10 starts. Scheffler earned his first major championship title at the Masters Tournament, becoming the first player since Jason Day in 2015 to win four times in a six-start stretch. Scheffler joined Tiger Woods (eight times) as players to win four times in a PGA TOUR season, including a major and a World Golf Championships event. With his third TOUR victory at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Scheffler took over the No. 1 position in the OWGR on March 27 for the first time in his career. Scheffler is the 25th player to hold the World No. 1 title (est. 1986) and sixth-youngest. The last player to win five times in a season was Justin Thomas (2016-17).
