Things to Know

- 2014 FedExCup Champion Billy Horschel leads by five-strokes, tying largest 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR this season
- Horschel holds the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the fifth time in his career and is 2-for-4 to date converting to victory
- Second-round leader Cameron Smith seeks first top-10 in seventh start at the Memorial
- Reigning FedExCup Champion and defending Memorial Tournament champion Patrick Cantlay sits T7 and seven-strokes off the lead
- Last two winners on TOUR began the final round seven strokes back

- 10 Third-round leaders/co-leaders at the Memorial Tournament to win (since 2000)
(most recent: Jon Rahm/2020)
- 10 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win an individual stroke-play event on TOUR in 2021-22

- Records a field-best 7-under 65 and marks second consecutive bogey-free round
- Last player to record back-to-back rounds without a bogey at the Memorial: Byeong Hun An/2018/R2, R3
- Five-strokes matches largest 54-hole lead/co-lead in an individual strokeplay event on TOUR this season: Daniel Berger/The Honda Classic
- Last player to lead by five or more strokes through 54 holes and fail to convert to victory on TOUR: Daniel Berger/2022 Honda Classic
- Lone bogey through 54 holes came at the par-4 first hole in round one (started on No. 10)
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the fifth time on TOUR; 2-for-4 to date converting to victory (Won/2014 BMW Championship, Won/2014 TOUR Championship)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (12.321 total) through three rounds
- Making ninth start at the event (best: T9/2019)

- Has four top-10s in 14 starts this season: T6/WM Phoenix Open, T2/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, T9/WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, 2nd/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Sam Burns
- In search of his seventh PGA TOUR win (most recent: 2021 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play)

Additional Player Notes

- **Aaron Wise** (T2/-8) seeks second PGA TOUR victory in his 117th start (2018 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- Second-round leader **Cameron Smith** (T2/-8) falls five behind the leader following an even par 72; with six starts at the Memorial Tournament, marks his most career starts in a tournament (non-major) without a top-10 finish
- **Denny McCarthy** (T7/-6) seeks first PGA TOUR title in his 128th start; would become the eighth player to pick up his first PGA TOUR victory at the Memorial Tournament, joining Keith Fergus (1981), Kenny Perry (1991), Tom Lehman (1994), Justin Rose (2010), Hideki Matsuyama (2014), David Lingmerth (2015), William McGirt (2016)
- Defending champion and two-time Memorial Tournament winner (2019, 2021) **Patrick Cantlay** (T7/-6) seeks to join Tiger Woods (1999-2001) as the only players to win the Memorial Tournament in consecutive years
- Last two winners on TOUR began the final round seven strokes back (Justin Thomas/PGA Championship, Sam Burns/Charles Schwab Challenge); players currently seven strokes off the lead:
