TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

The 47-event 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season will conclude at the TOUR Championship, where the FedExCup Champion will be crowned. World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler**, the PGA TOUR leader in wins this season (4), enters the TOUR Championship at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings and will begin the tournament at 10-under via FedExCup Starting Strokes. Scheffler is making his third consecutive appearance in the TOUR Championship, finishing No. 5 in 2019-20 and No. 22 in 2020-21. Scheffler, who won his first major championship title earlier this season at the Masters Tournament, looks to become the second player to win the Masters and the FedExCup in the same season (Jordan Spieth, 2014-15).

Reigning FedExCup Champion **Patrick Cantlay** can become the first player to win the FedExCup in back-to-back seasons. Cantlay successfully defended his title at last week's BMW Championship (first player to successfully defend a title in a FedExCup Playoffs event) to move to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings entering the TOUR Championship and will start two strokes behind Scottie Scheffler at 8-under. With a win, Cantlay would become the third player to win the season-long race multiple times, joining Tiger Woods and Rory McIlroy. Full list of FedExCup champions:

The FedExCup Starting Strokes system is now in its fourth year, implemented at the 2019 TOUR Championship. That year, Rory McIlroy entered the tournament in fifth place (five strokes back) and went on to win, while the No. 1 seed has gone on to win each of the last two years (Dustin Johnson/2020, Patrick Cantlay/2021).

Hideki Matsuyama has qualified for the TOUR Championship in each of the last nine seasons, the longest active streak on TOUR. Four other players have active streaks of six years or more: Justin Thomas (7), Tony Finau (6), Jon Rahm (6) and Xander Schauffele (6).

10 players in the field qualified for the TOUR Championship for the first time (rookies in **bold**): Sepp Straka, Scott Stallings, **Cameron Young**, Matt Fitzpatrick, Max Homa, Tom Hoge, K.H. Lee, J.T. Poston and **Sahith Theegala** (Will Zalatoris WD).

Two players have finished in the top 10 in each of the first two FedExCup Playoffs events: **Jon Rahm** and **Adam Scott**. Rahm has eight consecutive top-10s in the Playoffs (dating back to the start of the 2019 Playoffs), the longest such streak in the FedExCup era. Scott, who is making his first start in the TOUR Championship since 2019, has 20 top-10s in Playoffs events, the second-most of any player (most: 23, Dustin Johnson).

FEDEXCUP STARTING STROKES

The TOUR Championship features FedExCup Starting Strokes, a staggered, strokes-based system which rewards players for their FedExCup Regular Season performance as well as their play in the first two FedExCup Playoffs events (est. 2019).

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Xander Schauffele, who enters the week No. 4 in the FedExCup standings, has now advanced to the TOUR Championship in all six seasons on the PGA TOUR. Schauffele won the TOUR Championship as a rookie and has finished in the top 10 in all five starts, tied with Justin Thomas for the longest active streak on TOUR.

No. 5 **Sam Burns** is making his second consecutive appearance at the TOUR Championship, finishing 18th in 2021. Burns is one of four players who has three or more victories this season, collecting titles at the Sanderson Farms Championship, Valspar Championship and Charles Schwab Challenge (others with 3+ victories: Scottie Scheffler/4, Cameron Smith/3, Xander Schauffele/3).

No. 6 **Cameron Smith** has three wins this season, including THE PLAYERS Championship and The Open Championship. Smith withdrew prior to the start of last week's BMW Championship and fell from No. 3 to No. 6 in the FedExCup standings. With a win, Smith would become the second player to win THE PLAYERS Championship and the FedExCup in the same season, joining Rory McIlroy (2018-19), and the first to win The Open and the FedExCup in the same season.

If he wins the FedExCup, No. 7 **Rory McIlroy** would become the first player to win the FedExCup three times. When McIlroy won his second title in 2019, he joined Tiger Woods as the only two players to win the season-long race twice.

Scott Stallings finished runner-up at last week's BMW Championship to move to No. 12 in the FedExCup standings and qualify for the TOUR Championship for the first time in his 12-year PGA TOUR career. Stallings has a career-high seven top-10s this season (five in last nine starts).

J.T. Poston (No. 27) is making his first start in the TOUR Championship. Poston was No. 112 in the FedExCup standings after the U.S. Open and earned a runner-up (Travelers Championship) and win (John Deere Classic) the next two weeks, becoming the only player outside the top 75 after the U.S. Open to qualify for the TOUR Championship.

Will Zalatoris withdrew on Tuesday of tournament week due to a back injury. As a result of his WD, if all 29 players finish 72 holes, Zalatoris will finish 30th in the FedExCup, receiving \$500,000 in FedExCup bonus money. Starting Strokes for the remaining 29 players are unaffected.

Scottie Scheffler received a \$4 million bonus via the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 for holding the top spot in the FedExCup standings at the end of the FedExCup Regular Season and a \$1 million bonus for winning the Aon Risk Reward Challenge. The bonuses do not count towards his official money total of \$14,096,910 million, the largest in a single season in PGA TOUR history. His total of 3,556 FedExCup points during the Regular Season was the second-highest since the points format changed in 2009 (most: 4,169, Jordan Spieth, 2014-15). Cameron Young has earned \$6,520,598, the most official money earned in a single season by a player without a victory in TOUR history (previous: \$6,306,679, Louis Oosthuizen, 2020-21). Young also set the record for most by a rookie in PGA TOUR history (previous: \$4,312,674, Xander Schauffele, 2016-17).
