Things to Know

- FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler cards his fifth round of 66 or better in his 10th round at East Lake Golf Club
- The No. 1 seed has gone on to win each of the last two years (Dustin Johnson/2020, Patrick Cantlay/2021)
- With an eagle on the par-5 18th hole, Xander Schauffele shoots 63 for his lowest career round at East Lake Golf Club
- Jon Rahm adds a 63 in search of his fourth top-five finish in the FedExCup in six seasons
- Max Homa's 62 marks the lowest round at the TOUR Championship since 2007

- 18 Second-round leaders/co-leaders at the TOUR Championship to go on to win (most recent: Patrick Cantlay/2021)
- 12 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR in 2021-22 (most recent: Joohyung Kim, Wyndham Championship)

Scottie Scheffler (1st/-19)

- With rounds of 65-66, marks the lowest opening 36 holes by a No. 1 seed since Starting Strokes were introduced in 2019; has one bogey through two rounds (No. 9/R1)
- Second-round 66 marks his fifth score of 66 or better in his 10th career round at East Lake Golf Club
- Sixth 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recently: 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge/P2); 1-for-5 in converting to victory (2022 Masters Tournament)
- Has spent 24 of the last 25 weeks at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings; first took over the top spot after winning the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, fell to No. 2 after Will Zalatoris won the FedEx St. Jude Championship and moved back to No. 1 after a T3 at last week's BMW Championship
- Two players (three times) entered the FedExCup Playoffs at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings and went on to win the FedExCup: Tiger Woods (2007, 2009) and Jordan Spieth (2015)
- Three players who entered the TOUR Championship at No. 1 in the FedExCup standings went on to win the FedExCup: Tiger Woods (2009), Dustin Johnson (2020), Patrick Cantlay (2021)

- Three players (four times) entered the TOUR Championship at No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking and went on to win the FedExCup: Tiger Woods (2007, 2009), Justin Rose (2018), Dustin Johnson (2020)
- Makes third consecutive TOUR Championship start (5th/2020, T22/2021)
- During the 2021-22 Regular Season, won four PGA TOUR titles in six-week stretch, including the WM Phoenix Open, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play and Masters Tournament; Jordan Spieth is the only player to win the Masters and FedExCup in the same season (2014-15)
- No player has won five times in a season on TOUR since Justin Thomas in 2016-17
- Bobby Locke (6 wins, 1947) and Joe Kirkwood Sr. (5 wins, 1923) are the only players to win their first five PGA TOUR titles in the same season
- Four players who were named PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year have gone on to win the FedExCup: Vijay Singh, Tiger Woods, Brandt Snedeker, Jordan Spieth

Xander Schauffele (2nd/-17)

- Eagles the par-5 18th to play his final three holes in 4-under for a 63, marking his lowest score in his 22nd career round at East Lake Golf Club; hit 13 of 14 fairways in round two
- Has shot under par in 20 of 22 rounds at the TOUR Championship
- Earned three wins during the PGA TOUR Regular Season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans, Travelers Championship, Genesis Scottish Open) and entered the week No. 4 in the FedExCup, his highest position in six TOUR Championship appearances
- Won the TOUR Championship in his rookie season (2016-17) and has finished in the top 10 in all five previous starts (1st/2017, T7/2018, 2nd/2019, T2/2020, T5/2021)

Miscellaneous notes

- With a 63, Jon Rahm (3rd/-13) records his lowest score in his 22nd career round at East Lake Golf Club; seeks his fourth topfive finish in the FedExCup in six seasons, including a runner-up in 2021
- Rahm is one of two players to finish in the top 10 in each of the first two FedExCup Playoffs events this season (other: Adam Scott); is the only player to record top-10s in each of the FedExCup Playoffs events in three different seasons (2017, 2020, 2021) and has eight consecutive top-10s in the Playoffs (dating back to the start of the 2019 Playoffs), the longest such streak in the FedExCup era

- Defending FedExCup champion Patrick Cantlay (T4/-12) seeks to become the first-ever back-to-back FedExCup champion; no defending champion has finished higher than 7th in the FedExCup (Justin Thomas, 2018); his largest come-from-behind victory after 36 holes on TOUR is seven strokes (2017 Shriners Children's Open)
- Making his TOUR Championship debut, **Max Homa** (T8/-9) carded a bogey-free 62, his career-low round on TOUR and the lowest 18-hole score at the TOUR Championship since 2007 (Zach Johnson/60/R3); eclipses Tiger Woods' 63 in 2007 as the lowest second-round score in tournament history
- Two 2021-22 PGA TOUR Rookies are in the field: Cameron Young (T8/-9), Sahith Theegala (29th/+3)
- Qualifying for the TOUR Championship at No. 30 in the FedExCup, **Aaron Wise** (T11/-8) opens with rounds of 65-67 to move to T11; making his second TOUR Championship appearance (2018) and one of eight players in the field without a win during the 2021-22 season
