Scottie Scheffler – No. 1 (-10)

2021-22 season notes:

Wins: 4, WM Phoenix Open, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Masters Tournament

Starts: 24

Top-10s: 10

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Recorded back-to-back top-5 finishes in the fall at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (T4) and Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open (T2), where he held the outright 54-hole lead, to move inside the top 20 in the FedExCup entering 2022
- In his third start of the 2022 portion of the season, won his maiden PGA TOUR title at the WM Phoenix Open in a playoff over Patrick Cantlay
- Grabbed his second title two starts later, winning the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard; moved to No. 1 in the FedExCup for the first time in his career and held the position for the remainder of the regular season
- Defeated Kevin Kisner, 4 and 3, in the Championship Match to win the World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play, earning his third career PGA TOUR victory and third in a five-start stretch; became the first player to win three times during the season; became World No. 1 for the first time in his career
- Collected his first major championship title and fourth PGA TOUR win in a six-start stretch, winning the Masters Tournament by three strokes over Rory McIlroy. Entered the week No. 1 in the FedExCup standings and Official World Golf Ranking.
- Added two runner-up finishes in his final nine starts of the regular season (Charles Schwab Challenge, U.S. Open)
- Missed the cut in the FedEx St. Jude Championship – his fourth missed cut of the season – to relinquish No. 1 in the FedExCup for the first time since before his win at the Arnold Palmer Invitational
- Finished T3 at the BMW Championship to reclaim the No. 1 seed heading into his third career TOUR Championship

- Three runner-up finishes this season included playoff losses at the WM Phoenix Open (Scottie Scheffler) and RBC Heritage (Jordan Spieth)
- Won the week after the RBC Heritage at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Xander Schauffele in wire-to-wire fashion for his seventh career PGA TOUR title; moved inside the top 5 in the FedExCup standings for the first time this season (No. 4)
- Closed the regular season with three consecutive top-10s at the Genesis Scottish Open (T4), Open Championship (T8) and the Rocket Mortgage Classic (T2)
- Finished the FedExCup Regular Season No. 5 in the FedExCup standings, earning a bonus of \$2 million via the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10; was one of three players to finish the Regular Season in the top 10 in 2021 and 2022, joining Sam Burns and Justin Thomas
- Won the BMW Championship to move to No. 2 in the FedExCup, becoming the first player to successfully defend a FedExCup Playoffs event

- Fell to Luke List in a playoff at the Farmers Insurance Open for his second career runner-up finish on TOUR; jumped from No. 46 to No. 17 in the FedExCup
- Earned a T6 finish at the Masters Tournament, his second top-10 in as many starts in the event
- Finished T4 at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Davis Riley for his third consecutive top-10 result
- Recorded his fourth top-10 in five starts with a playoff loss to Justin Thomas at the PGA Championship; elevated to No. 13 in the FedExCup with his second runner-up result of the season
- Added back-to-back top-5s at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (T5) and the U.S. Open (T2), where he missed a birdie putt on the 72nd hole to force a playoff with Matt Fitzpatrick
- In his FedExCup Playoffs debut, won the FedEx St. Jude Championship for his first career PGA TOUR title on the third hole of sudden death against Sepp Straka; became the second player to collect his first TOUR title in a FedExCup Playoffs event and first since Camilo Villegas at the 2008 BMW Championship; claimed the No. 1 spot in the FedExCup for the first time in his career

Xander Schauffele – No. 4 (-6)

2021-22 season notes:

Wins: 3, Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Patrick Cantlay), Travelers Championship, Genesis Scottish Open

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Earned his first top-10 of the season with a T3 at the WM Phoenix Open
- Partnered with Patrick Cantlay to win the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, the first TOUR victory for Schauffele since the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions; moved him inside the top 20 in the FedExCup for the first time this season (No. 20)
- In his next start, carded a final-round 61 at the AT&T Byron Nelson for a T5
- Won the Travelers Championship and Genesis Scottish Open in back-to-back starts, winning in consecutive starts for the second time in his career and becoming the second to do so on TOUR on the season, joining Scottie Scheffler; reached a season high 3rd in the FedExCup following the Genesis Scottish Open
- Has finished inside the top 5 in the FedExCup in four of his previous five appearances in the FedExCup Playoffs; entered the 2022 Playoffs at No. 4
- Has qualified for every TOUR Championship since becoming a member of the PGA TOUR (2017-2022)

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Won his first start of the season at the 2021 Sanderson Farms Championship; moved to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the first time in his PGA TOUR career
- Led after the second and third rounds of the Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open before closing with an even-par 72 to finish T7
- Closed out 2021 portion of the season with top-10s in THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT (T5) and Hewlett Packard Houston Open (T7)

- Successfully defended his title at the Valspar Championship, where he converted his first of six career 18-hole lead/co-leads on TOUR; did not fall lower than 4th in the FedExCup standings for the remainder of the regular season
- Added a runner-up at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Billy Horschel before claiming his third victory of the season at the Charles Schwab Challenge in a playoff over Scottie Scheffler; entered the final round trailing by seven strokes before recording a 5-under 65 to force the playoff
- Was one of three players to finish the Regular Season in the top 10 in 2021 and 2022, along with Patrick Cantlay and Justin Thomas.

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- With a total of 34-under 258, won the Sentry TOC by one stroke over Jon Rahm and became the first player in PGA TOUR history to finish a 72-hole event 34-under or better.
- Won THE PLAYERS Championship by one stroke over Anirban Lahiri, earning his fifth PGA TOUR title and second of the season; made 10 birdies in the final round, becoming the fourth player to make 10 or more birdies in a round at THE PLAYERS on record (1983-present); moved to No. 2 in the standings for the first time this season
- Finished T3 at the Masters Tournament, his fourth consecutive top-10 at the event
- Won The Open Championship by one stroke over Cameron Young, earning his first career major championship title, third win of the season and sixth career win on TOUR; became the first player to shoot 64 or better in the final round and win a major since Collin Morikawa at the 2020 PGA Championship
- Advanced to the TOUR Championship for the third consecutive season and fourth overall

Rory McIlroy – No. 7 (-4)

2021-22 season notes:

Wins: 2, THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT, RBC Canadian Open

Starts: 15

Top-10s: 9

How he qualified for the TOUR Championship:

- Won his season opener for the first time in his career with a victory at THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT for his 20th career PGA TOUR victory
- Recorded back-to-back top-5 finishes at the Masters Tournament (2), and at the Wells Fargo Championship (5th) in his title defense
- Successful title defense from 2019 at the RBC Canadian Open elevated him back inside the top 5 in the standings to No. 4; first time he successfully defended a title on the PGA TOUR
- Followed the victory with a T5 at the U.S. Open
- Took a share of the 54-hole lead at The Open Championship and finished third with a final-round 70 and hit all 18 greens in regulation
- Finished in the top 10 in eight of his 13 regular season starts, including all four of the major championships (2nd-8th-T5-3rd), becoming the first player to accomplish the feat without a victory since Rickie Fowler in 2014
- Missed the cut in the FedExCup Playoffs opener for the first time in his career; followed it up with a T8 at the BMW Championship to remain inside the top 10 of the FedExCup

- Won the 3M Open and Rocket Mortgage Classic in back-to-back weeks, becoming the first player to win consecutive tournaments on the PGA TOUR schedule since Patrick Cantlay at the 2021 BMW Championship and TOUR Championship and first to do so during the FedExCup Regular Season since Brendon Todd in 2019
- Became the third player of the season to win in back-to-back starts and eighth player to win multiple titles on the season. Earned multiple victories in the same season for the first time in his career
- Opened with a 64 en route to a T5 in his title defense at the FedEx St. Jude Championship; climbed inside the top 5 in the FedExCup

- Entering the FedExCup Playoffs at No. 35, fell in a playoff to Will Zalatoris at the FedEx St. Jude Championship to move to No. 8 and secure his TOUR Championship debut; had missed the cut in six consecutive tournaments entering the Playoffs

- Played in the final pairing during the final round of the PGA Championship and carded a 73 to finish T5, his first career top-five in a major championship; climbed inside the top 10 of the FedExCup for the first time this season (No. 10)
- Won the U.S. Open by one stroke over Scottie Scheffler and Will Zalatoris, earning his first major championship title and first career win on the PGA TOUR
- Finished T6 in his next start at the Genesis Scottish Open for his ninth top-10 of the regular season
