Things to Know

- Coming off a T14 at last week's U.S. Open, Xander Schauffele makes big strides towards his sixth career PGA TOUR title and first individual stroke-play victory since the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Patrick Cantlay, who partnered with Schauffele to win this season's Zurich Classic of New Orleans, closes in on a seventh top-5 finish of the season
- Harris English aims to become the second player to successfully defend a Travelers Championship title (Phil Mickelson/2002) and fifth player to successfully defend a title in the 2021-22 season
- After making his professional debut at the 2018 Travelers Championship (T61), Nick Hardy seeks first career TOUR title in his 28th start
- Rory McIlroy takes a quadruple bogey (par-4 12th) for the sixth time in his PGA TOUR career and first since the 2021 PLAYERS Championship
- In search of a fifth TOUR victory this season, FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler enters the weekend nine strokes back

- With back-to-back scores of 7-under 63, is the only player bogey-free through 36 holes; 126 marks his lowest opening 36-hole score on the PGA TOUR
- Five-stroke lead ties this season's largest after 36 holes (Keith Mitchell/THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT, Scottie Scheffler/Masters Tournament)

- Marks the largest 36-hole lead at the Travelers Championship since 1984 (previously four strokes on three occasions)
- Ties Justin Rose (2010) for lowest opening 36-hole score at the Travelers Championship since 1984
- Sank a total of 116' 1" of putts (23 putts)
- Is 0-for-4 when attempting to convert a 36-hole lead/co-lead into victory
- Fourth start in the Travelers Championship (T14/2017, MC/2018, T20/2020)
- Seeking his sixth career TOUR title and second of the season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans, partnering with Patrick Cantlay); most recent individual stroke-play title came at the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Has finished inside the top 20 in last five starts; comes off a T14 at last week's U.S. Open

Additional Notes

- Reigning FedExCup Champion **Patrick Cantlay** (T2/-9) opens his eighth Travelers Championship in 64-67; in his first start at TPC River Highlands in 2011, posted a second-round 10-under 60, which still stands as his career-low score; best of six top-5 finishes this season was his victory with Xander Schauffele at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans
- In his third TOUR start since returning from hip surgery, defending champion **Harris English** (T2/-9) offset two bogeys with eight birdies to post 6-under 64; looks to become the second player to successfully defend the tournament's title (Phil Mickelson/2002) and fifth to successfully defend this season; won last year's event after eight holes of sudden death against Kramer Hickok
- Illinois native Nick Hardy (T2/-9), who made his professional debut at the 2018 Travelers Championship (T61), made four consecutive birdies (16-1) en route to a 6-under 64, one shy of his career-low score; needed 20 putts to sink 117' 11" of putts; matched his career-best finish of T14 (2021 Sony Open in Hawaii) at last week's U.S. Open
- Rory McIlroy (T7/-8) took a quadruple bogey on the par-4 12th en route to an even-par 70; marks his sixth such score and first since the 2021 PLAYERS Championship; the last player to win on TOUR in spite of a quadruple bogey was Adam Scott at the 2016 Honda Classic; has improved finishes in each previous Travelers Championship start (T17/2017, T12/2018, T11/2020); seven top-10s this season, including five in his last six starts
- Coming off a T12 at last week's U.S. Open, Ireland's **Seamus Power** (T7/-8) opens his fifth Travelers Championship in 67-65; best finish at TPC River Highlands came with T19 honors last year after Monday Qualifying to get into the field
- In search of a fifth TOUR victory this season, FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler enters the weekend nine strokes back at 5-under 135; en route to his first two career TOUR titles earlier this season at the WM Phoenix Open and Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, came from nine and eight strokes back, respectively, after 36 holes
- Notables to miss the cut: Jordan Spieth (+1) Sam Burns (E), Rickie Fowler (+3), Joaquin Niemann (+3)
- Jason Kokrak was disqualified during round two for failing to record a score on his final hole and subsequently failing to return a scorecard
