Things to Know

- Xander Schauffele seeks sixth career PGA TOUR title and first individual stroke-play victory since the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Patrick Cantlay, who partnered with Schauffele to win this season's Zurich Classic of New Orleans, closes in on his eighth career TOUR victory and seventh top-5 finish of the season with the low score of the day (63)
- Schauffele and Cantlay play in the final round together for the second time in their careers on TOUR
- After making his professional debut at the 2020 Travelers Championship (MC), Sahith Theegala seeks first career TOUR title in his 38th start to become the second rookie winner on TOUR this season
- In his third PGA TOUR start, 20-year-old amateur Michael Thorbjornsen (T7) seeks to become first amateur to win on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at 1991 Northern Telecom Open

- With 63-63-67 start, 193 marks his lowest opening 54-hole score on the PGA TOUR
- Lone bogey through 54-holes came at par-5 13th hole in round three
- Is 0-for-4 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory (T2/2021 WM Phoenix Open; T3/2020 Charles Schwab Challenge; T2/2020 Sentry Tournament of Champions; T2/2018 The Open Championship)
- Fourth start in the Travelers Championship (T14/2017, MC/2018, T20/2020)
- Seeks his sixth career TOUR title and second of the season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans, partnering with Patrick Cantlay); most recent individual stroke-play title came at the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Has finished inside the top 20 in last five starts; comes off a T14 at last week's U.S. Open
- Aside from the Zurich Classic of New Orleans when they were teammates in 2021 and 2022, Travelers Championship
 marks the fifth PGA TOUR event in which the duo were in the same grouping; the only time they were paired in the
 final round in the previous four events was 2022 WM Phoenix Open (Cantlay/67/T2; Schauffele/68/T3)

Additional Notes

- Reigning FedExCup Champion Patrick Cantlay (2nd/-16) records bogey-free 63, the low score in round three, and seeks
 his eighth career TOUR title and second of the season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans, partnering with Schauffele); in his
 first start at TPC River Highlands in 2011, posted a second-round 10-under 60, which still stands as his career-low score;
 holds six top-5 finishes this season
- PGA TOUR Rookie **Sahith Theegala** (3rd/-14) seeks first PGA TOUR title in his 38th start to become second rookie winner this season (Chad Ramey/Corales Puntacana Championship); carded one eagle, five birdies and one bogey for 64; 196 marks career-low 54-hole score on TOUR; earned sponsor exemption to 2020 Travelers Championship (MC), marking his first professional start
- In his third PGA TOUR start, 20-year-old amateur **Michael Thorbjornsen** (T7/-11) from Wellesley, Massachusetts is playing on a sponsor exemption; T7 marks best 54-hole position by an amateur at the event since 1984; seeks to become first amateur to win on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at 1991 Northern Telecom Open
- After missing the cut in his last four starts on TOUR, **Kevin Kisner** (4th/-13) cards 4-under 66 in search of his fifth career TOUR victory; sank total of 116' 3" of putts (22 putts); best finish at TPC River Highlands was T5 last year
- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T11/-10) cards bogey-free 5-under 65 and sits seven shots back heading into the final round
- In his third TOUR start since hip surgery, defending champion **Harris English** (T11/-10) records 1-under 69 in bid to become second player to successfully defend a Travelers Championship title (Phil Mickelson/2002)
