## Things to Know

- Xander Schauffele claims sixth career PGA TOUR title, second of the season and first individual stroke-play title since the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Schauffele improves to 1-for-5 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR
- After making his professional debut at the 2020 Travelers Championship (MC), Sahith Theegala succumbs to a double bogey on the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole to finish T2 by two strokes to Xander Schauffele in his 38<sup>th</sup> start
- Patrick Cantlay makes nine bogeys, a double bogey, five birdies and just three pars in the final round to shoot 6-over 76
- In his third PGA TOUR start, 20-year-old amateur Michael Thorbjornsen finishes solo-fourth in bid to become the first amateur to win on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at 1991 Northern Telecom Open

## Xander Schauffele (1st/-19)

- Offset two bogeys with four birdies to win his sixth career PGA TOUR event, and second of the season, at the age of 28 years, 8 months, 1 day in his 134<sup>th</sup> start
- Wins in his fourth start at the Travelers Championship (T14/2017, MC/2018, T20/2020, won/2022)
- Improves to 1-for-5 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 8 in the standings (from 20<sup>th</sup>)
- With the win, is projected to move to World No. 11
- Last individual stroke-play title on TOUR before this week came at the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions; claimed his fifth title earlier this season at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, partnering with Patrick Cantlay
- Becomes the seventh multiple winner in the 2021-22 PGA TOUR season
- Win at TPC River Highlands marks his sixth consecutive top 20 finish on TOUR; comes off a T14 at last week's U.S. Open
- Becomes the eighth 54-hole leader/co-leader to convert for the win at the Travelers Championship and first since Chez Reavie in 2019
- Becomes the 14<sup>th</sup> player to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR into victory this season and second in as many weeks (Matt Fitzpatrick/U.S. Open)

## **Additional Notes**

- PGA TOUR rookie **Sahith Theegala** followed a 6-under 64 in round three with a 3-under 67 Sunday to claim T2 honors, his best PGA TOUR finish in 38 starts; playing in the second-to-last group, held a one-stroke lead at 19-under before taking a double-bogey-six at the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole to eventually finish two strokes back with J.T. Poston; the finish marks his fifth top-10 finish of the season and supplants a previous-best career showing of T3 from the WM Phoenix Open earlier this season; made his first start as a professional at the 2020 Travelers Championship (MC), competing on a sponsor exemption
- After opening the week with an 8-under 62, **J.T. Poston** closed with a bogey-free 6-under 64 to finish T2 at 17-under 263; was in search of a second career PGA TOUR title (2019 Wyndham Championship); best of two top-10 finishes this season before this week was T3 at the RBC Heritage
- In his third PGA TOUR start, 20-year-old **Michael Thorbjornsen** (4<sup>th</sup>/-15) from Wellesley, Massachusetts was competing on a sponsor exemption in bid to become first amateur to win on TOUR since Phil Mickelson (1991 Northern Telecom Open); last player to win competing on a sponsor exemption was Martin Laird (2021 Shriners Children's Open)
  - o Best finish by an amateur at the Travelers Championship before this week: Jim Grant/T6/1966
  - Best finish in a PGA TOUR event by an amateur this season before this week: Christopher Gotterup/T7/Puerto Rico Open
  - Best finish in a PGA TOUR event by an amateur since 2000: Robby Shelton/T3/2015 Barbasol Championship
- Following birdies on four of his first six holes, Chesson Hadley (5<sup>th</sup>/-14) holed his second shot at the par-4 15<sup>th</sup> from 28' 1" en route to a 6-under 64; began the week with missed cuts in each of five previous Travelers Championship starts
- With five birdies, nine bogeys and a double bogey, Patrick Cantlay (T13/-10) made just three pars en route to a finalround 5-over 75; was seeking his eighth career TOUR title and second of the season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans, partnering with Schauffele)
- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler finished T13 at 10-under 270 in his third Travelers Championship
- World No. 2 Rory Mcliroy claimed T19 honors at 9-under 271 in his fourth Travelers Championship
- In his bid to become the second player to successfully defend a Travelers Championship title (Phil Mickelson/2002), Harris English finished T19 at 9-under 271
