### Things to Know

- Ryan Palmer holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the 10<sup>th</sup> time on the PGA TOUR (2-for-8 to date in individual strokeplay events; 1-for-1 in team events/teamed with Jon Rahm to win the 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans)
- Making his 500<sup>th</sup> career start on the PGA TOUR, nine-time PGA TOUR winner Matt Kuchar sits T2
- First-round leader Russell Knox falls to T27 following a second-round 4-over 76
- Defending champion Jordan Spieth is currently T47 in bid to become the event's first repeat winner since Zach Johnson (2009)
- One week before defending his 2021 Masters Tournament title, Hideki Matsuyama withdraws during round two
  with a neck injury
- Among the notables missing the cut: Rory McIlroy, Bryson DeChambeau, Jason Day, Rickie Fowler

# **Second-Round Lead Notes**

- 4 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Valero Texas Open since it moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010 (most recent: Jimmy Walker/2015)
- 6 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win in 2021-22 season (most recent: Ryan Brehm, Puerto Rico Open)

- Holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the ninth time in an individual stroke-play event on the PGA TOUR (2-for-8 to date; won his first two attempts at the 2008 Ginn sur Mer Classic and the 2010 Sony Open in Hawaii
- Along with teammate Jon Rahm, carried the 36-hole lead to victory at the 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans the
  most recent of his four PGA TOUR victories
- Has just one bogey through 36 holes (No. 13/R1)
- In search of his first top-10 finish since the 2021 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with teammate Jon Rahm); last top-10 finish in an individual stroke-play event came at the 2021 Farmers Insurance Open (T2)

- Would join Jordan Spieth (2021) and Andrew Landry (2018) as the third Texan to win the Valero Texas Open in the last four editions of the event (Corey Conners/Canada/2019)
- Ranks third this week in Scrambling (11 of 12)
- Has already secured a spot in next week's Masters Tournament field

## **Additional Player Notes**

- Making his 500<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start, **Matt Kuchar** sits T2 following rounds of 67-69; scoring breakdown through two rounds (Nos. 1-13/Even par, Nos. 14-18/8-under)
- **Kevin Chappell** (T2) trails by two after turning in the round of the day with a 7-under 65; 2017 Valero Texas Open champion would become the ninth multiple winner of the event
- Making his 105<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start, Dylan Frittelli (T2) is in search of his second victory (2019 John Deere Classic)
- With rounds of 72-73, **Rory McIlroy** misses the cut in his second Valero Texas Open appearance (2<sup>nd</sup>/2013)
- **Bryson DeChambeau** misses the cut for the third time in as many attempts at the Valero Texas Open (2016/74-73, 2017/73-77, 2022/73-76)
- A week before defending his Masters Tournament title, Hideki Matsuyama withdraws during the second round with a neck injury
- Ben Kern withdraws during round two with an ankle injury
- Kevin Tway withdraws prior to the second round with a wrist injury
