### Things to Know

- Four players tied for the 54-hole lead is the most on TOUR since the 2020 RBC Heritage (four)
- Four players tied for the 54-hole lead at the Valero Texas Open is the most since moving to TPC San Antonio (2010)
- Of the top 20 players on the leaderboard, only Si Woo Kim, Gary Woodland and Lucas Glover are in next week's Masters Tournament field
- 54-hole leads on TOUR: Brandt Snedeker (4-for-11), Beau Hossler (0-for-3), J.J. Spaun (0-for-1), Dylan Frittelli (0-for-0)
- Hossler is seeking to become the first sponsor exemption to win on TOUR since Martin Laird at the 2020 Shriners Children's Open
- Seeking a third top-10 finish in his fifth Valero Texas Open start, Brandt Snedeker posts 5-under 67, his 18<sup>th</sup> score of par-or-better in 19 rounds in the event (73/R1/2022)
- Snedeker seeks first top-10 finish in an individual stroke-play event on TOUR since the 2021 Valero Texas Open (T6)
- Scott Stallings makes over 90 feet of putts for third consecutive round in bid for first top-10 finish in eighth Valero Texas Open start
- Defending champion Jordan Spieth turns in a 2-over 74, just his fifth over-par score in 25 rounds in the event

### **Third-Round Lead Notes**

- 7 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Valero Texas Open since it moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010 (most recent: Jordan Spieth/2021)
- 6 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win in 2021-22 season (most recent: Ryan Brehm, Puerto Rico Open)

# Beau Hossler (T1/-10)

- Birdied three of his last five holes, and seven total, against two bogeys, to turn in a 5-under 67
- After sinking 132' 0" of total putts in round two, Dallas resident followed with 127' 3" in round three
- Was T89 after round one (+1) and T13 after round two (-5)
- Seeking to become the first sponsor exemption to win on TOUR since Martin Laird (2020 Shriners Children's Open)

- Is 0-for-3 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR
- Best finish in four previous Valero Texas Open starts was T36 in 2019
- Seeks first career TOUR title in his 130<sup>th</sup> start; two runner-up finishes (P2/2018 Houston Open, T2/2018 Travelers Championship)
- With a win, would join Jordan Spieth (2021) and Andrew Landry (2018) as the third Texan to win the Valero Texas Open in the last four editions of the event (Corey Conners/Canada/2019)

#### **Brandt Snedeker (T1/-10)**

- Seeking his first top-10 finish in an individual stroke-play event on TOUR since the 2021 Valero Texas Open (T6)
- Following a second-round 6-under 66 in which he made five consecutive birdies, posted a bogey-free 5-under 67
- Third-round 5-under 67 marks his 18<sup>th</sup> score of par-or-better in 19 rounds in the event (73/R1/2022)
- Is 4-for-11 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR
- Seeks a third top-10 finish in his fifth Valero Texas Open start: 2011/4<sup>th</sup>, 2016/T25, 2018/15<sup>th</sup>/ 2021/T6
- Most recent of nine TOUR titles came at the 2018 Wyndham Championship

### J.J. Spaun (T1/-10)

- Offset two bogeys and a double bogey (par-4 ninth) with seven birdies to post a 3-under 69
- Takes a 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR for a second time (2017 Shriners Children's Open/T10)
- A win Sunday would earn him his first start in the Masters Tournament
- Best finish in four previous Valero Texas Open starts was T26/2018
- Best finish in 146 PGA TOUR starts prior to this week was solo-second at the 2017 RSM Classic

# Dylan Frittelli (T1/-10)

- Followed a bogey-free 6-under 66 in round two with a 2-under 70
- Best 54-hole position on TOUR before this week was fifth at the 2020 Masters Tournament (T5) and T5 at the 2019
   John Deere Classic (won)
- Making his third Valero Texas Open start (2018/T20, 2019/T42)
- Needs a win Sunday to earn a spot in next week's Masters Tournament

# **Additional Player Notes**

- Seeking a first top-10 finish in his eighth Valero Texas Open start, **Scott Stallings** (5<sup>th</sup>/-9) dropped his only shot of the day with a bogey at the par-5 18<sup>th</sup> to post a 5-under 67; has made over 90 feet of putts in each of the first three rounds this week: R1/94′ 1″, R2/90′ 2″, R3/95′ 1″; seeks a fourth career TOUR title and first since the 2014 Farmers Insurance Open
- Making his 500<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start, Matt Kuchar posted an even-par 72 in round three and sits in sixth place at 8-under 208; three top-10 finishes in 16 previous starts in the event: T2/2001, T4/2014, T7/2019
- Defending champion **Jordan Spieth** (T63/E) turns in a 2-over 74, his sixth over-par score in 25 rounds in the event; marks his fifth over-par score in his last seven rounds on TOUR (stroke-play events)
