


#### 2022 Valero Texas Open

### Things to Know

- J.J. Spaun finishes two strokes ahead of Matt Jones and Matt Kuchar to pick up his first PGA TOUR victory in his 147<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 31 years, 7 months, 14 days
- Spaun moves to No. 10 in the FedExCup standings and earns a spot for the first time in the Masters Tournament
- Spaun is the first winner to overcome a double bogey on the first hole of a final round since Tiger Woods at the 2008 U.S. Open
- Spaun becomes the ninth first-time winner of the season; he is the sixth player to record his first TOUR title at the Valero Texas Open since it moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010 (fourth out of the last five)
- Career runner-up finishes on TOUR: Matt Kuchar (14), Matt Jones (2)
- Final results for the 54-hole co-leaders: J.J. Spaun (won), Beau Hossler (T4), Dylan Frittelli (T8), Brandt Snedeker (T18)
- Career results with the 54-hole lead/co-lead: Spaun (1-for-2), Hossler (0-for-4), Frittelli (0-for-1), Snedeker (4-for-12)
- Defending champion Jordan Spieth turns in his best round of the week, a 5-under 67, to finish T35; Zach Johnson remains the last player to successfully defend a title at the Valero Texas Open (2009)

- Picks up his first PGA TOUR victory in his 147<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 31 years, 7 months, 14 days
- Earns 500 points to move to No. 10 in the FedExCup standings
- With the win, earns a spot in next week's Masters Tournament field (debut appearance)
- Becomes the first winner on TOUR to overcome a double bogey on the first hole in a final round since Tiger Woods at the 2008 U.S. Open
- Ninth first-time winner this season and second in as many weeks (Chad Ramey/Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Sixth player to win his first TOUR title at the Valero Texas Open since it moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010, joining Brendan Steele/2011, Steven Bowditch/2014, Kevin Chappell/2017, Andrew Landry/2018 and Corey Conners/2019
- Improves to 1-for-2 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead (2017 Shriners Children's Open/T10)
- Best finish in four previous Valero Texas Open starts was T26 in 2018
- Best finish prior to this week was solo-second at the 2017 RSM Classic



## **Additional Player Notes**

- Making his 500<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start, nine-time winner Matt Kuchar finishes runner-up for the 14<sup>th</sup> time
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Matt Jones** finishes runner-up for the second time (2013 Greenbrier Classic); was hoping to join Adam Scott (2010) and Steven Bowditch (2014) as Aussie winners at TPC San Antonio
- Adam Hadwin has three-consecutive top-10 finishes for the first time in his PGA TOUR career (THE PLAYERS Championship/T9, Valspar Championship/T7, Valero Texas Open/T4)
- Three-time TOUR winner Charles Howell III (T4) records his 98th top-10 finish in 603 starts
- **Beau Hossler**, playing his week on a sponsor exemption, finishes T4 following a final-round even-par 72; falls to 0-for-4 when attempting to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory
- Defending champion **Jordan Spieth** turns in his best round of the week, a 5-under 67, to finish T35; the last player to successfully defend at the Valero Texas Open was Zach Johnson in 2009
