### TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

**Strong field:** The WM Phoenix Open field features six of the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking (most since 2003) and 28 of the top 50 (most since 2004). In addition, there are 99 PGA TOUR winners in the field, tied for the most of any event on TOUR since the 2021 PLAYERS Championship.

Headlining the field are World No. 1 Jon Rahm, a graduate of Arizona State and Scottsdale resident; World No. 3 Viktor Hovland, who won his third PGA TOUR title earlier this season at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba; and Patrick Cantlay, the reigning FedExCup Champion who is making his tournament debut. In addition, FedExCup leader and two-time WM Phoenix Open champion Hideki Matsuyama looks for his third victory of the season.

**The famous 16th:** In 2020-21, there were 206 par-3s played on the PGA TOUR. With a scoring average of 3.000, TPC Scottsdale's famous par-3 16th was tied for 53rd-easiest on TOUR.

### FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

**Last time out:** Tom Hoge won the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am by two strokes over Jordan Spieth, earning his first PGA TOUR victory in his 203rd career start. Hoge became the fourth first-time winner of the season on TOUR and 13th in tournament history. Hoge's first win followed Luke List's the previous week at the Farmers Insurance Open; the last time two players earned their first PGA TOUR title in consecutive weeks on the schedule was in March 2020 (Sungjae Im/The Honda Classic, Tyrrell Hatton/Arnold Palmer Invitational). Hoge moved to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings with his third top-five in a five-start stretch.

**Top players taking the title:** The winner of the first 11 events in the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season entered the week inside the top 60 of the Official World Golf Ranking. The average OWGR position of winners in the fall portion of the season was 31.8, more than 20 spots higher than the previous record since the TOUR went to a wraparound schedule in 2013-14 (53.2, 2013-14). In the fall of 2020, the average winner's OWGR position was 169.8.

**PGA TOUR LIVE on ESPN+:** New streaming partner ESPN+ features four live feeds per day including Featured Groups, a Marquee Group, Featured Holes, and a Main Feed. More than 4,300 hours of live coverage are scheduled for 2022, more than triple the PGA TOUR LIVE coverage from previous years.
