Things to Know

- Sahith Theegala posts 2-under 69 to secure the second 54-hole lead of his career (0-for-1 to date)
- Defending champion Brooks Koepka is one off the lead in bid to become the seventh player to successfully defend a WM Phoenix Open title
- Beginning on No. 10 Scottie Scheffler records the round of the week, tying the back-nine record (29) at TPC Scottsdale en route to a 9-under 62
- Xander Schauffele (T3) seeks to become the first player to win on the PGA TOUR after finishing runner-up the year prior since Dustin Johnson at the 2020 Masters Tournament (T2/2019)
- Sam Ryder used a 54-degree wedge from 124 yards at the par-3 16th to make his first ace on the PGA TOUR; first hole-in-one on No. 16 since 2015 (Francesco Molinari/R3)

- Posts 2-under 69 to secure 54-hole lead heading into the final round of the WM Phoenix Open; is 0-for-1 to date with the 54-hole lead/co-lead (2021 Sanderson Farms Championship/T8)

- Earned his way to the TOUR this season by virtue of the Top 50 from the 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour category
- Claimed three top-10 finishes in 11 starts on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2021, highlighted by a T4 at the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship
- PGA TOUR rookie made his TOUR debut as an amateur at 2017 Genesis Invitational (T49) after winning the Collegiate Showcase to earn a spot in the field
- Making his 24th career start on TOUR and 22nd as a professional; lone top-10 finish (T8) came earlier this season at the Sanderson Farms Championship, where he led by a stroke after three rounds

Miscellaneous Notes

• Defending champion **Brooks Koepka** is one off the lead entering Sunday; with a win, would become the seventh player to successfully defend a WM Phoenix Open title; also looks to become the first player to successfully defend a PGA TOUR title since Viktor Hovland earlier this season at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba

- Scottie Scheffler (T3) had the round of the week, tying the back nine record (29) at TPC Scottsdale en route to a 9-under 62; becomes the seventh player to shoot 29 on the back nine (most recent: Russell Henley/R2/2021); marks his fifth career round of 62 or better hit all 18 greens in regulation for the first time in his career on TOUR (241st round)
- Sam Ryder used a 54-degree wedge from 124 yards at the par-3 16th to make his first ace on the PGA TOUR; first hole-in-one on No. 16 since 2015 (Francesco Molinari/R3)
- Patrick Cantlay (T3) looks to become the first player to win the WM Phoenix Open in his debut since Brooks Koepka (2015); has the second-longest current streak of rounds at par or better on TOUR (30, two behind Jon Rahm's 32)
- **Xander Schauffele** (T3) seeks to become the first player to win on the PGA TOUR after finishing runner-up the year prior since Dustin Johnson at the 2020 Masters Tournament (T2/2019)
- Kevin Chappell (T29) is making his last start on a Major Medical Extension. Here are the scenarios heading into Sunday:
 - Solo-5th, 3-way T4 or better: Major Medical category for the remainder of the season (needs 109.127 FedExCup points)
 - Solo-34th, 4-way T33 or better (up to 2-way T5): 126-150 category for the remainder of the season (needs 21.580 points)
 - 2-way T34 or worse: Beyond 150 category until the next reshuffle (after Genesis) when he will move into the Reorder category
