**Things to Know**

- Scottie Scheffler wins the WM Phoenix Open on the third playoff hole (par-4 18<sup>th</sup>), draining a 25' 7" birdie putt to edge Patrick Cantlay to earn his first PGA TOUR victory in his 71<sup>st</sup> career start
- Scheffler becomes the third consecutive first-time winner of the season and the fifth overall; is the 13<sup>th</sup> first-time winner in tournament history and first since Brooks Koepka in 2015
- Cantlay, a six-time PGA TOUR winner, finishes runner-up for the sixth time
- Playoff records: Scheffler (1-0), Cantlay (3-2)
- Five of the top 10 players who entered the week inside the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking finished inside the top 10 at the WM Phoenix Open
- Sahith Theegala falls to 0-for-2 on the PGA TOUR with the 54-hole lead
- Carlos Ortiz aced the par-3 16<sup>th</sup> with a 9-iron from 178 yards; combined with Sam Ryder's ace on Saturday, marks the first time the WM Phoenix Open has had multiple holes-in-one in the same week since 1997 (Tiger Woods, Steve Stricker)

- Wins the WM Phoenix Open over Patrick Cantlay with a birdie-3 on the third extra hole (No. 18), earning his first career PGA TOUR victory in his 71<sup>st</sup> start at the age of 25 years, 7 months, 23 days
- Wins in his first playoff on the PGA TOUR
- Moves to No. 4 in the FedExCup standings; best finish in the FedExCup was a fifth-place finish in 2020
- Wins in his third start at the WM Phoenix Open (1<sup>st</sup>/2022, T7/2021, MC/2020)
- Had the round of the week, tying the back nine record (29) at TPC Scottsdale en route to a third-round 9-under 62
- Becomes the fifth first-time winner on TOUR this season and third in the last three weeks, joining Luke List and Tom Hoge; marks the first time since 2020 with three players earning their first TOUR victory in consecutive weeks (Tyrrell Hatton/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Sungjae Im/Honda Classic, Viktor Hovland/Puerto Rico Open)

- Becomes the 13<sup>th</sup> player to earn his first PGA TOUR title at the WM Phoenix Open and first since Brooks Koepka in 2015; is the second to do so in a playoff (Ed Furgol/1954)

#### Patrick Cantlay (2<sup>nd</sup>/-16)

- Finishes runner-up to Scottie Scheffler in attempt to become the first player to win the WM Phoenix Open in his debut since Brooks Koepka (2015)
- Six-time winner picks up the sixth runner-up finish of his career; playoff record falls to 3-2
- Has the second-longest current streak of rounds at par or better on TOUR (31, two behind Jon Rahm's 33)
- 2021 FedExCup champion moves to No. 9 in the FedExCup standings
- Fourth top-10 in as many starts this season (4/Sentry Tournament of Champions, 9/The American Express, T4/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, P2/WM Phoenix Open)

#### Carlos Ortiz

- Picks up the third hole-in-one of his career with an ace on the par-3 16<sup>th</sup> with a 9-iron from 178 yards; finishes T33
- Combined with Sam Ryder's ace on Saturday, marks the first time with multiple holes-in-one on No. 16 in the same week since 1997 (Tiger Woods, Steve Stricker)
- Tee shots at No. 16 between the last two holes-in-one: 2,863 (from Francesco Molinari/R3/2015 to Sam Ryder/R3/2022), 33 (from Ryder to Ortiz/R4/2022)
- 11<sup>th</sup> ace at No. 16 (tournament moved to TPC Scottsdale in 1987)
- Followed up with an eagle on the par-4 17<sup>th</sup> hole, driving the green and holing a 12' 9" putt; first player with back-to-back eagles since Bryson DeChambeau (2021 BMW Championship)
- Accounts for two of the five instances of back-to-back eagles since the start of last season (2021 Sony Open in Hawaii)

#### Miscellaneous Notes

- **Xander Schauffele** finishes T3 in bid to become the first player to win on TOUR after finishing runner-up the year prior since Dustin Johnson at the 2020 Masters Tournament (T2/2019); finished no worse than T17 (2018) in five event starts
- Second- and third-round leader **Sahith Theegala** finishes T3 following a final-round 1-under 70; was bidding to become the first Sponsor Exemption to win on the PGA TOUR since Martin Laird (2020 Shriners Children's Open); is 0-for-2 to date with the 54-hole lead/co-lead (2021 Sanderson Farms Championship/T8, 2022 WM Phoenix Open/T3)
- Two-time WM Phoenix Open champion **Brooks Koepka** finishes T3 in bid to become the seventh player to successfully defend a WM Phoenix Open title
- **Billy Horschel** (T6) picks up his 50<sup>th</sup> top-10 finish in 283<sup>rd</sup> PGA TOUR start
- **Hideki Matsuyama**, the last back-to-back champion at the WM Phoenix Open (2016-17), finishes T8 in bid to become the season's first three-time winner; maintains his lead atop the FedExCup standings
- World No. 1 and Arizona State graduate **Jon Rahm** (T10) has finished no worse than T16 (2017) in seven starts at the event
- **Kevin Chappell** (T43) failed to meet the requirements of his Major Medical Extension; he will be eligible for some events with his past champion status
