Things to Know

- 2021 runner-up Scottie Scheffler advances to the Championship Match for the second consecutive year (sixth instance of a player doing so)
- Scheffler would ascend to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking for the first time in his career if he wins the tournament
- Scheffler seeks to join Kevin Kisner as the only players to win the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play the year after losing in the Championship Match
- Kisner advances to his third Championship Match, becoming the third player with three or more appearances
- Kisner has won 22 matches since making his debut in 2016 (most of any player in that span), including 14 of his last 15
- Scheffler and Kisner have combined for five total Championship Match appearances since 2018

 Tiger Woods: 2003, 2004
- Scheffler and Kisner have combined for five total Championship Match appearances since 2018:
 2018: Kevin Kisner vs. Bubba Watson
 2019: Kevin Kisner vs. Matt Kuchar

2021: Scottie Scheffler vs. Billy Horschel

2022: Scottie Scheffler vs. Kevin Kisner

- Would move to No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking for the first time in his career if he wins the tournament
- Would become the youngest winner in tournament history at 25 years, 9 months, 6 days; current: Rory McIlroy, 2015 (25 years, 11 months, 29 days)
- Kevin Kisner (2019) is the only player to win the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play a year after losing in the Championship Match
- Last player to win a PGA TOUR event after finishing runner-up the year prior: Dustin Johnson, 2020 Masters Tournament
- One of four players with multiple victories this season (WM Phoenix Open, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Last player to win three times in a season on TOUR before the Masters Tournament: Dustin Johnson and Justin Thomas, 2016-17 (three each)

Notes – Kevin Kisner (2019 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play winner)

- Improves record at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play to 22-6-1, including wins in 14 of his last 15 matches
- Making third appearance in Championship Match (2nd/2018, Won, 2019)
- Third player to advance to the Championship Match three or more times: Tiger Woods (2000, 2003, 2004, 2008), Geoff Ogilvy (2006, 2007, 2009), Kevin Kisner (2018, 2019, 2022)
- 22 match victories is the most of any player since Kisner made his tournament debut in 2016
- Three players have won multiple titles at the event: Jason Day (2014, 2016), Geoff Ogilvy (2006, 2009), Tiger Woods (2003, 2004, 2008)
- PGA TOUR wins (4): 2015 RSM Classic, 2017 Charles Schwab Challenge, 2019 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, 2021 Wyndham Championship
