TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

New name, same game: The World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba returns to El Camaleon Golf Club in Riviera Maya, Mexico, for the 15th edition of the event. Defending champion Viktor Hovland, who went on to finish the 2020-21 season No. 5 in the FedExCup standings, will attempt to become the first player in tournament history to win back-to-back titles.

Participants from Mexico: The two active PGA TOUR members from Mexico, Abraham Ancer and Carlos Ortiz, are set to compete in their home country. Both players earned their first PGA TOUR victory last season, with Ortiz winning the Hewlett Packard Enterprise Houston Open and Ancer taking the title at the World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational. Ancer is making his seventh career start at the event (first as a PGA TOUR winner) and has two top-10s (T9/2017, T8/2019), while Ortiz has three top-10s in seven prior appearances (T9/2014, T2/2019, T8/2020).

Traveling the world: This is the PGA TOUR's third consecutive event played outside the United States, following the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP (in Japan) and the Butterfield Bermuda Championship. Four players in the field will have competed in all three tournaments: Kramer Hickok, Garrick Higgo, Peter Malnati and Sepp Straka.

Mexico is one of seven countries/territories hosting at least one of the nine PGA TOUR events outside the United States this season; Scotland is the only other country with more than one.

Down to the wire: In each of the last four years, the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba has been decided by one stroke. The only tournament on the PGA TOUR schedule that has a longer active streak of being won by one stroke or in a playoff is the Barbasol Championship (5).

FEDEXCUP and SEASON STORYLINES

Last time out: First-year member Lucas Herbert won the Butterfield Bermuda Championship, earning his first career PGA TOUR victory at the age of 25 years, 10 months, 26 days. Herbert, a two-time winner on the European Tour, made 11 starts as a non-member on TOUR last season, making him ineligible for the Arnold Palmer Award as Rookie of the Year.

Four consecutive international winners: Players from outside the United States have won on the PGA TOUR four weeks in a row, the longest such streak since the 2019-20 season.

SPONSOR EXEMPTION SPOTLIGHT

Guido Migliozi, a two-time winner on the European Tour, is competing on a sponsor exemption. The 24-year-old Italian is making his fifth career PGA TOUR start and second consecutive; he finished T57 at last week's Butterfield Bermuda Championship as an international player designated to compete by the Commissioner.

Migliozi's best performance on the PGA TOUR to date came at the 2021 U.S. Open, his first start on the PGA TOUR. He recorded a final-round 68 to finish T4 and followed with a T13 at the Travelers Championship the next week.
