Things to Know

- After tying his career-low score and course record of 61 in round one, Matthew Wolff follows with a 3-under 68 to claim his first 36-hole lead on TOUR; this week marks his first start in the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba
- Scottie Scheffler birdies five consecutive holes on his inward nine to close in on his first career PGA TOUR title
- In bid to become the first player to successfully defend a World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba title (2007), Viktor Hovland heads into the weekend T3 at 10-under 132
- Guadalajara native Carlos Ortiz birdies five of his last eight holes in bid for third consecutive top-10 finish in the event
- In search of his first top-10 finish in two years, 2011 FedExCup champion Bill Haas remains bogey-free through 36 holes
- Following last year’s solo-second in the event, Aaron Wise overcomes a double bogey and three bogeys with an eagle and four birdies to post a 1-under 70 and remain in the mix

Matthew Wolff (1st/-13)

- After tying the course record and his career-low score of 10-under 61 in round one, bogeyed two of his last three holes, Nos. 16 and 18, to get in with a 3-under 68 in round two; is making his first start in the event
- First occasion to sit higher than T3 after 36 holes on TOUR
- Hit 11-of-14 fairways, 16-of-18 greens in regulation in each of the first two rounds
- Making his third start of the season, comes off a solo-second most recently at the Shriners Children's Open
- Seeks a second career PGA TOUR title in his 52nd TOUR start (2019 3M Open)
- Advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs for a third consecutive season in 2020-21; ended his season at No. 71 in the standings

Scottie Scheffler (2nd/-11)

- Reeled off five consecutive birdies on his inward nine (Nos. 4-8) en route to a bogey-free 7-under 64
- One of two players who remain bogey-free through 36 holes (Bill Haas)
- Making his second start in the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (T18/2019)
- In two previous starts this season, missed the cut at the Shriners Children's Open and finished T38 most recently at THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT
- Seeks his first career PGA TOUR title in his 66th start this week; best finish is solo-second at the 2021 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play

Additional Notes

- Guadalajara native **Carlos Ortiz** (T3/-10) birdied five of his last eight holes in search of a third straight top-10 finish in the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba (T2/2019, T8/2020); making his eighth consecutive start in the event
- **Viktor Hovland** (T3/-10) offset a double-bogey with eight birdies to post a 6-under 65 as he seeks to become the first player to successfully defend his World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba; with a win this week, would become the first player on the PGA TOUR to successfully defend his title since Brooks Koepka at the 2019 PGA Championship
- In search of his first top-10 finish since the 2019 John Deere Classic (T10), 2011 FedExCup champion **Bill Haas** (T5/-9) is one of two players who remain bogey-free through 36 holes (Scottie Scheffler); seeks a seventh career TOUR title and first since The American Express in 2015
- After starting with nine straight pars, **Anirban Lahiri** (T5/-9) played his inward half in 5-under 31; making his fourth start in the event (T28/2016), T14/2017, T10/2018); searching for his first TOUR title in his 145th start
- After a solo-second at last year's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba, **Aaron Wise** (T5/-9) followed an 8-under 63 in round one with a 1-under 70 which included four birdies, an eagle, three bogeys and a double bogey; seeks a third straight top-10 finish this season (Shriners Children's Open/T8, THE CJ CUP @ SUMMIT/T5); seeks a second career PGA TOUR (2018 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- 2017 FedExCup champion **Justin Thomas** (T5/-9) made seven birdies and one bogey, good for a 6-under 65; in two previous starts at the World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba, finished T23 in 2014 and T12 last season
- Mexico's first Presidents Cup participant (2019) and winner of the 2021 World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational **Abraham Ancer** (T28/-6) opened his seventh consecutive World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba with a pair of 3-under 68s; seeks a third top-10 finish in the event (T9/2017, T8/2019); comes off a T12 showing at Mayakoba last year
- There are 11 Latin American players in this week's field: **Mexico (5)** – Carlos Ortiz (-10), Abraham Ancer (-6), Roberto Diaz (-6), Juan Carlos Benitez (MC), Juan Diego Fernandez (MC); **Argentina (1)** – Emiliano Grillo (MC); **Chile (2)** – Joaquin Niemann (-7), Mito Pereira (MC); **Colombia (2)** – Camilo Villegas (MC) and Monday qualifier Camilo Aguado (MC); **Venezuela (1)** – Jhonattan Vegas (-3)
- **Kelly Kraft** withdrew during round two (illness)
