Things to Know

- John Huh cards a career-low 61 and holds a two-stroke lead after the first round of the Wyndham Championship
- Sungjae Im (2nd), who won the Shriners Children's Open earlier this season, needs a two-way T2 or better to have a chance to finish in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10
- There are three past recipients of the Rookie of the Year Award at T5 or better: John Huh (1st), Sungjae Im (2nd) and Aaron Wise (T5)
- Joohyung Kim (3-under 67) becomes the third player in the ShotLink era (est. 2003) to make a quadruple bogey on the first hole of a round and go on to record an under-par score

First-Round Lead Notes

- First-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Wyndham Championship since the move to Sedgefield CC in 2008 (most recent: Brandt Snedeker, 2018)
- First-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on TOUR in 2021-22 (most recent: Tony Finau, Rocket Mortgage Classic)

- Career-low score on the PGA TOUR (61); now has three scores of 62 or better in his TOUR career, with two coming at Sedgefield Country Club:
 - 61, 2022 Wyndham Championship (R1)
 - 62, 2016 Shriners Children's Open (R1); went on to finish T10
 - 62, 2013 Wyndham Championship (R2); went on to finish T3
- First 18-hole lead/co-lead of his TOUR career; only other time he led/co-led after a round was after the third round of the 2013 Wyndham Championship (T3)
- One top-10 in 24 prior starts this season (T9/The Honda Classic)
- Won the 2012 Mayakoba Golf Classic in his fifth career start on TOUR and via an eight-hole playoff, which remains tied for the second-longest sudden-death playoff in PGA TOUR history
- 2012 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year

Sungjae Im (2nd/-7)

- Third score of 63 or better this season; the first two came en route to victory at the Shriners Children's Open (63 in R1, 62 in R4)
- With a win, would become the ninth player with multiple wins this season; last season with nine or more multiple winners: 2017-18 (9)
- Two top-10s in three prior starts at the Wyndham Championship (T6/2019, T9/2020, T24/2021); 12th under-par score in 13 rounds at Sedgefield Country Club
- Entered the week No. 15 in the FedExCup; needs a two-way T2 or better to have a chance to finish in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which pays \$1 million to No. 10 (Scottie Scheffler clinched the top spot and will earn \$4 million)
- 2019 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year

Miscellaneous notes

- Joohyung Kim made a quadruple bogey on his first hole (No. 1) and went on to shoot a 3-under 67; Kim becomes the third
 player in the ShotLink era (est. 2003) to make a quadruple bogey or worse on the first hole of a round and go on to card an
 under-par score, joining Freddie Jacobson (R3, 2010 American Express) and Hank Lebioda (R1, 2019 Barbasol
 Championship)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Austin Smotherman**, who entered the week No. 125 in the FedExCup, (T5/-5) ties his career-low score on TOUR with a 65 (third instance; first since R1 of the 2022 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Rookie and Sedgefield Country Club member Alex Smalley is T5 (-5); Smalley finished T29 at the 2021 Wyndham
 Championship playing on a sponsor exemption, securing a spot in Korn Ferry Tour Finals, where he earned his PGA TOUR card for 2021-22
- **Brian Stuard** (entered No. 137) cards a 5-under 65 (T5) and is projected to move inside the top 125 in the FedExCup; Stuard needs at least a 14th-place finish to have a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- Rickie Fowler opens with a 1-over 71 and is projected to fall out of the top 125 in the FedExCup; Fowler, who is fully exempt on TOUR through the 2022-23 season, missed the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his career in 2021
