



# 2022 Wyndham Championship (44<sup>th</sup> of 47 events in the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season)

Greensboro, North Carolina August 4-7, 2022 FedExCup points: 500 (winner)

## Completed Second-Round Notes – Saturday, August 6, 2022

**Weather: Friday:** Mostly cloudy. High of 88. Wind SW 7-14 mph. The second round was suspended due to inclement weather at 5:36 p.m. ET and resumed at 7:06 p.m., a delay of 1 hour, 30 minutes. Due to darkness, the second round was suspended for the day at 8:20 p.m. with four players left to complete their rounds. **Saturday morning:** Mostly cloudy. High of 73. The second round resumed at 6:47 a.m. and was completed at 7:10 a.m.

36-hole cut: 87 players at 1-under 139 from a field of 156 professionals.

#### Things to Know

- Making their Wyndham Championship debut, co-leaders Brandon Wu and Joohyung Kim seek first career PGA TOUR victories
- Co-leader and 2009 Wyndham Championship winner Ryan Moore entered the week No. 183 in the FedExCup and seeks his sixth career TOUR title
- PGA TOUR rookie Austin Smotherman, who entered the week No. 125 in the FedExCup, makes a double bogey at his last hole (No. 9) to miss the cut by two strokes
- Kim has made 301 feet, 1 inch of putts through two rounds, marking the most in the first two rounds since the event moved to Sedgefield CC in 2008
- Defending champion Kevin Kisner, 2011 Wyndham Championship winner Webb Simpson and Rickie Fowler fail to advance to the weekend
- Three players tied for the 36-hole lead is tied for the most on TOUR this season (Sanderson Farms Championship, Farmers Insurance Open, AT&T Byron Nelson, Charles Schwab Challenge)

## **Cut statistics**

- **87 players:** most to make the cut on TOUR since the cut rule changed to low 65 and ties to start the 2019-20 season (previous: 84, 2022 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- The last time 87 players or more made the 36-hole cut on TOUR was at the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship (87)
- 1-under: highest 36-hole cut at the Wyndham Championship since 2013 (-1)

## **Second-Round Lead Notes**

- 6 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win since the event moved to Sedgefield CC in 2008 (most recent: Brandt Snedeker, 2018)
- Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win individual stroke-play events on PGA TOUR in 2021-22 (most recent: Cameron Smith/The Open Championship)

## Brandon Wu (T1/-9)

- At 9-under 131, records his best opening 36-hole score on TOUR (133/2021 Puerto Rico Open/T7)
- Will hold his second 36-hole lead/co-lead of PGA TOUR career (2021 Puerto Rico Open/T7)
- PGA TOUR rookie seeks his first career TOUR title in his 36th TOUR start
- With a victory, would become the first player to win in his Wyndham Championship debut since Brandt Snedeker in 2007
- Best career PGA TOUR finish: T2/2022 Mexico Open at Vidanta

## Joohyung Kim (T1/-9)

- After becoming the third player in the ShotLink era (est. 2003) to make a quadruple bogey or worse on the first hole of a round and go on to card an under-par score (3-under 67), posts a 6-under 64
- Seeks to become the first player to start an event with a score worse than double bogey and go on to win in the ShotLink
  era
- Second-round lead/co-lead will mark the first of his career after any round on the PGA TOUR
- Best 36-hole position prior to this week: T9/2021 Puerto Rico Open
- Has made 301 feet, 1 inch of putts through two rounds, marking the most in the first two rounds since the event moved to Sedgefield CC in 2008
- At 20 years, 1 month, 17 days would become the second-youngest PGA TOUR winner since World War II (youngest: Jordan Spieth/2013 John Deere Classic) and the first player born in the 2000s to win on TOUR
- Last Special Temporary Member to win on TOUR: Collin Morikawa/2019 Barracuda Championship

## Ryan Moore (T1/-9)

- Entered the week No. 183 in the FedExCup standings; is currently projected to move to the top 70
- 2009 Wyndham Championship winner is making his 14th start in the event
- Best finish in 15 starts this season: T24/John Deere Classic
- Seeks first top-10 since the 2021 John Deere Classic (T2)
- With a win Sunday, would become the 11th player to win the Wyndham Championship on multiple occasions
- Seeks his sixth career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2016 John Deere Classic

## Miscellaneous notes

- With his 67-65 start, Russell Henley (T4/-5) remains the only player bogey-free through 36 holes
- After carding a career-low 61, first-round leader John Huh (T4/-8) followed with a 1-over 71
- Sungjae Im (T4/-8) entered the week No. 15 in the FedExCup; needs a two-way T2 or better to have a chance to finish in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10; has two top-10s in three prior starts at the Wyndham Championship (T6/2019, T9/2020, T24/2021)
- PGA TOUR rookie Austin Smotherman, who entered the week No. 125 in the FedExCup, makes double bogey at No. 9 to miss the cut by two strokes
- **Brian Stuard** (entered No. 137) sits at 7-under 133 and is projected to move inside the top 125 in the FedExCup; Stuard needs at least a 14<sup>th</sup>-place finish to have a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- This week's field includes two players who have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in all 15 seasons: **Adam Scott** (-2/No. 73 in FedExCup) and **Charley Hoffman** (-4/148th)
- Jason Day (entered the week No. 106 in the FedExCup) and Adam Long (No. 71) withdrew prior to the second round due to
  illnesses
- Defending champion Kevin Kisner, Brandon Hagy and 2011 Wyndham Championship winner Webb Simpson withdrew
  during the suspension of play; marks Simpson's first missed cut at the Wyndham Championship since his tournament debut
  in 2009
