## Completed Third-Round Notes - Sunday, August 7, 2022

**Weather: Saturday:** Cloudy with afternoon thunderstorms. High of 89. Wind WSW 5-10 mph. The third round was suspended due to dangerous weather situations at 12:20 p.m. (resumed at 1:25 p.m.) and 4:15 p.m., with 74 players left to complete their rounds. **Sunday:** Mostly cloudy. High of 87. Wind SSW 5-10 mph. The third round resumed at 7:30 a.m. and was completed at 10:16 a.m.

### Things to Know

- Two past PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year winners sit atop the leaderboard at the Wyndham Championship, with 2019 recipient Sungjae Im holding a one-stroke lead over 2012 winner John Huh
- Six players within four shots of the lead are seeking their first PGA TOUR victory: Brandon Wu (T3), Joohyung Kim (T3), Kiradech Aphibarnrat (T5), Taylor Moore (T5), Anirban Lahiri (T7), Davis Riley (T7)
- Three players are projected to play their way into the FedExCup Playoffs (Max McGreevy, Justin Lower, Brian Stuard), with three players falling out of the top 125 (Rickie Fowler, Matt Wallace, Austin Smotherman)
- This week marks the third straight season with weather delays at the Wyndham Championship

# Sungjae Im (1st/-13)

- 2019 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year
- In search of his third victory in his 121st PGA TOUR start (2020 Honda Classic, 2021 Shriners Children's Open)
- Victory would come at the age of 24 years, 4 months, 8 days
- Holds the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the first time on TOUR
- Previous-best 54-hole position came at the 2020 Masters Tournament, where he entered the final round T2 and trailing
  eventual winner Dustin Johnson by four strokes; closed with a 3-under 69 to finish T2 and five strokes back
- At 13-under 197, records his best opening 54-hole score on TOUR (198 2021 BMW Championship/3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021 Shriners Children's Open/won)
- Would become the ninth player with multiple wins this season; last season with nine or more multiple winners: 2017-18 (9)
- Two top-10s in three prior starts at the Wyndham Championship (T6/2019, T9/2020, T24/2021)

• Entered the week No. 15 in the FedExCup; needs a two-way T2 or better to have a chance to finish in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which pays \$1 million to No. 10 (Scottie Scheffler clinched the top spot and will earn \$4 million)

#### John Huh (2<sup>nd</sup>/-12)

- 2012 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year
- At 12-under 198, records his best opening 54-hole score on TOUR (199 2016 The American Express/T24, 2020 Shriners Children's Open/T19)
- Posted his career-low score on the PGA TOUR in the first round (61); has three scores of 62 or better in his TOUR career, with two coming at Sedgefield Country Club (62, 2013 Wyndham Championship/R2/finished T3)
- First-round 61 led to his first 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR
- One top-10 in 24 prior starts this season (T9/The Honda Classic)
- Won the 2012 Mayakoba Golf Classic in his fifth career start on TOUR and via an eight-hole playoff, which remains tied for the second-longest sudden-death playoff in PGA TOUR history
- In search of his second win in his 266<sup>th</sup> start; win on Sunday would come at the age of 32 years, 2 months, 17 days

# Brandon Wu (T3/-11)

- Third-round 2-under 68 included a hole out for eagle from 147 yards on the par-4 11<sup>th</sup> hole
- Hole-out at No. 11 was the longest of his PGA TOUR career
- At 11-under 199, records his best opening 54-hole score on TOUR (204 2021 Puerto Rico Open/T7)
- PGA TOUR rookie seeks his first career TOUR title in his 36th TOUR start
- In 35 prior starts, best finishes came this season at the Mexico Open at Vidanta (T2) and Puerto Rico Open (T3)
- With a victory, would become the first player to win in his Wyndham Championship debut since Brandt Snedeker in 2007
- Win on Sunday would come at the age of 25 years, 5 months, 21 days

# Joohyung Kim (T3/-11)

- At 11-under 199, records his best opening 54-hole score on TOUR (203 2022 AT&T Byron Nelson/T17)
- Third player in the ShotLink era (est. 2003) to make a quadruple bogey or worse on the first hole of a round and go on to card an under-par score (first-round 3-under 67)
- Would become the first player to start an event with a score worse than double bogey and go on to win during that span
- At 20 years, 1 month, 17 days, would become the second-youngest PGA TOUR winner since World War II (youngest: Jordan Spieth/2013 John Deere Classic) and the first player born in the 2000s to win on TOUR
- Last Special Temporary Member to win on TOUR: Collin Morikawa/2019 Barracuda Championship

# Kiradech Aphibarnrat (T5/-10)

- Playing in his 300<sup>th</sup> round on the PGA TOUR, posts a career-low 7-under 63; has three rounds of 64 on TOUR, including during the first round of the 2019 Wyndham Championship (finished T60)
- Bogey-free in his last 36 holes (65-63), marking his second time with multiple bogey-free rounds in a tournament (2018 CIMB Classic)
- At 10-under 200, posts his best opening 54-hole score on TOUR (203 2019 AT&T Byron Nelson/T5)
- Best finish in 103 PGA TOUR starts is T3 (2013 CIMB Classic, 2019 WGC-Mexico Championship)

# Miscellaneous notes

- Brian Stuard (entered No. 137) sits T7 and is projected to move inside the top 125 in the FedExCup; Stuard needs at least a 14<sup>th</sup>-place finish to have a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs; entered the week with 11 straight missed cuts; the most consecutive missed cuts prior to a victory is eight (James Hahn/2016 Wells Fargo Championship, David Frost/1990 Zurich Classic of New Orleans)
- Joseph Bramlett (T78/+1) holes an 8-iron from 182 yards on the par-3 16<sup>th</sup> hole for his first ace on the PGA TOUR; as a result of the ace and courtesy of Birdies Fore Backpacks, four local charities focused on feeding families in the Piedmont Triad region of North Carolina will share 1 million Wyndham Rewards points
- This week's field includes two players who have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in all 15 seasons: **Adam Scott** (+2/No. 73 in FedExCup/projected No. 76) and **Charley Hoffman** (-5/No. 148 in FedExCup/projected No. 147)
- At 3-over 213, C.T. Pan withdrew following his third round
