About TPC Louisiana

As the region's headquarters of professional golf, TPC Louisiana offers an unparalleled experience of the sport in the area. The club boasts a renowned championship golf course with 18 professional-level holes, meticulously maintained to the PGA TOUR's highest standards of operation.

Master architect Pete Dye designed the course, working in conjunction with TOUR players Steve Elkington and Kelly Gibson – a New Orleans native. The course is located in Avondale, just 15 miles from the bustle of the "Big Easy" and Bourbon Street. TPC Louisiana was named "the #4 best upscale public golf course" by Golf Digest magazine when it opened back in 2004. TPC Louisiana is consistently included in GolfWeek's "Best Courses You Can Play" each year (Golf Digest 2011 Top 100 public Golf Course).

The golf course, which is part of the Audubon Golf Trail, stretches over 250 acres of wetlands across along the Mississippi River delta. True to Pete Dye's style, the golf course features over 100 bunkers, including several large waste bunkers on the first six holes of the back nine. TPC Louisiana boasts a series of short and compelling par-4 holes to balance. The five sets of tees, ranging from a fair 5,121 yard from the women's tees all the way back to the 7,400 PGA TOUR tees, offers golfers of all skill levels a great blend of challenge and playability.

The signature hole on the golf course is the par-5, 18th hole. Water is in play for the entire right side of the hole, making for a challenging finish for even the most seasoned golfer.

TPC Louisiana is host of the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, Louisiana's premier tournament and the PGA TOUR's annual stop in the state.





Hole Descriptions

HOLE #1 399-YD. PAR 4 -

This hole is one of the shortest par 4s on the golf course. Most players will hit a fairway wood off the tee into the narrow fairway, trying to avoid the long fairway bunker on the left. The right side of this green has 3 challenging pot bunkers that must be avoided.

HOLE #2 548-YD. PAR 5 -

A straight away par 5 with a large fairway bunker left of the fairway off the tee and a second to navigate on the approach, this hole is reachable for many of the TOUR players. The green was enlarged and elevated following the 2013 Zurich Classic. Players going at this green in two must be careful as plenty of trouble lurks left, right and long of the green.

HOLE #3 221-YD. PAR 3

This long par 3 is often setup so that players can play a mid-iron. The hole is framed by a water hazard that is in play to the right and behind the green. A visually deceptive tee shot is made even more challenging as a steep pot bunker face guards the front of the green. The green is one of the largest on the course and has many subtle contours.

HOLE #4 482-YD. PAR 4 -

One of the longer holes on the course, the 4th sets up for a left-to-right shot off the tee to avoid a hazard on the right. This will leave players with a mid-to-long iron shot into the green that favors a right-to-left approach. Beware of the deep pot bunkers left of the green, but don't short-side yourself if the hole location is on the right.

HOLE #5 438-YD. PAR 4

This beautiful hole requires a right to left shot off the tee box. The second shot will favor a left to right shot over a long fairway bunker and multiple pot bunkers on the right side of the green. Nick Watney holed his 2nd shot here in the final round in 2007 that set up his 3 shot victory.

HOLE #6 476-YD. PAR 4

The third long par 4 in the front side's "triangle of doom" requires a long straight drive that avoids a hazard on the left. The 2nd shot is a near 90-degree dogleg to the left, and players will hit anything from fairway woods to long irons depending on the wind conditions.

HOLE #7 561-YD. PAR 5

A fairly long par 5 that requires a well-placed drive, avoiding the massive fairway bunker on the right and some pot bunkers on the left. A lay-up is a prudent play as the fairway widens out to the right. Longer hitters must avoid the pot bunker to the left if they are trying to hit a smallish, tilting green in two.

HOLE #8 372-YD. PAR 4

This hole may be reachable downwind for big hitters but this play is quite risky. Most players will hit a fairway metal or hybrid from the tee that will leave them a short iron for their 2nd shot. The green is guarded by several pot bunkers with one pot bunker in front of the green creating another blind approach shot. This hole will provide plenty of birdie opportunities and excitement.

HOLE #9 207-YD, PAR 3

A demanding par 3 that has played over par in the Zurich Classic of New Orleans several times. Water guards the left side of this elevated green that makes for a difficult chip for players that bail out right. The defining feature of the 9th green is the large peak in the middle right side that will make for a challenging 2 putt for any player that has to putt across it.





HOLE #10 390-YD. PAR 4

A fairway wood or iron is required for this short par 4 that starts off the back nine. Players need a well-executed tee shot to be aggressive with a wedge or short iron into this narrow but deep green.

HOLE #11 575-YD. PAR 5

After pounding a driver on this long par 5, decisions must be made. Going for the green in two requires the 2nd shot to be maneuvered around the tall cypress tree in the middle of the fairway, a mere 80 yards from the green. Laying up on this hole is tricky as well. Make sure the lay-up is well to the right of the cypress tree so you will have an easier approach to a well-guarded and contoured green.

HOLE #12 492-YD. PAR 4

Perhaps the toughest hole on the golf course. The tee shot should be hit with a slight right to left shot shape. This will leave a long-to-mid iron into a green that requires a left to right shot. A deep bunker is on the right, while a large chipping area dominates the left side of the big green.

HOLE #13 403-YD. PAR 4

Another tricky, short par 4 that long hitters may try to press their luck and drive the green. Deep pot bunkers surround the green, so an errant shot could result in a double bogey. The green is the smallest on the golf course so a better play is a fairway wood to the right of the large cypress tree to set up a wedge into what should be a birdie hole.

HOLE #14 216-YD. PAR 3

This is the only par 3 on the course that doesn't have water in play. The hole is framed by a large bunker in front of the green and 4 pot bunkers that guard the left and right. Different tee complexes can make this hole play as short as 167 yards.

HOLE #15 490-YD. PAR 4

This is the last hole on the course that requires a long tee shot. The ideal drive would be a right-to-left ball flight that avoids the large fairway bunker on the left. Approach shots need to be high and soft as this saddle shaped green is one of the few on the course that are not protected by a bunker. This tricky green complex will test even the best short games on the PGA TOUR. Par is a great score and birdies are a rare delight.

HOLE #16 355-YD. PAR 4

Number 16 is a really interesting hole where players can choose to hit driver over a fairway bunker complex with overhanging trees to a green protected by water to the front and left. The other play is a hybrid or a long iron followed by a wedge into the green. A birdie hole.

HOLE #17 215-YD. PAR 3

The last and most difficult of the par 3's, this hole will produce everything from aces to triple bogeys. Water runs down the entire left hand side of the hole and the green is guarded by two small bunkers to the right.

HOLE #18 585-YD. PAR 5

This exciting par 5 features one of the largest fairways on the golf course but water runs down the entire right side. Big hitters off the tee can sometimes catch a slope on the right side that adds extra yards to the drive to set up a go for the green in two. The bunkering around the green complex is spectacular and produces all sorts of interesting shots. A true risk-reward-gambling par 5, the 18th at TPC should ensure great theater and a great champion for the Zurich Classic of New Orleans.





2022 Zurich Classic Team Profiles

Collin Morikawa/Viktor Hovland

This will be the highest ranked partnership in the five team versions of the Zurich Classic, with Collin Morikawa ranked 2nd and Viktor Hovland ranked 3rd in the world as of this publication. Both are incredibly accomplished at such a young age. Morikawa has won two majors, the 2020 PGA Championship and the 2021 Open Championship. He and Tiger Woods are the only two players to win a Major and WGC event before the age of 25. In 61 career starts, he has 22 top-10 finishes. He was a member of the 2017 Walker Cup team, the 2017 and 2018 Palmer Cup teams, and the 2021 Ryder Cup team where he compiled a 3-0-1 record. He represented the US in the 2020 Olympics. He was a three-time All-American at Cal and also reached #1 in the World Amateur rankings. Hovland has three PGA Tour wins and two International victories and was a member of the European Ryder Cup team in 2021. He represented Norway in the 2020 Olympics. He won the 2018 US Amateur at Pebble Beach. He played on the Palmer Cup team in 2017 and 2018. At Oklahoma St he was a two-time 1st team All-American and was named Big 12 Player of the Year.

Sam Burns/ Billy Horschel

After a 4th place finish at the 2021 Zurich Classic, this team, from SEC rival Schools, returns with its eyes on the title. University of Florida's Billy Horschel and LSU's Sam Burns also partnered to finish 2nd by one shot at the 2021 QBE Shootout. Billy is the only winner of the Zurich Classic at both medal play (2013) and team play (2018). He has six PGA Tour wins and was the 2014 FedExCup champion. Horschel was a member of the 2007 winning US Walker Cup team. Sam has three PGA Tour wins and has jumped into the top 10 in the OWGR as this goes to print. He was an All American at LSU, as well as the Jack Nicklaus College Player of the Year. Both players have represented the US in the Arnold Palmer Cup.

Justin Rose/Henrik Stenson

Justin Rose and Henrik Stenson will pair for the 4th time at the Zurich Classic. Their best previous finish was T-11 in 2021. Rose has 10 PGA TOUR wins, including the 2013 US Open and 2015 Zurich Classic, and another 12 International victories. He's been a member of five Ryder Cup teams, and also won the Gold Medal at the 2016 Olympic Games. Stenson has 5 PGA TOUR wins including the 2016 Open Championship in a thrilling duel over Phil Mickelson. Stenson was the Olympic Silver medalist in 2016 finishing one shot behind his partner. He has also been on five Ryder Cup teams, and the duo is 6-2 in Ryder Cup matches as partners.

Patrick Cantlay/ Xander Schauffele

A pair of top 10 players, 2021 FedEx Cup champion Patrick Cantlay will again partner with 2020 Olympic gold medalist Xander Schauffele at the Zurich Classic. The pair went 2-2 as a 2019 Presidents Cup team, finished T-11 together at the 2021 Zurich Classic, and went 2-0 as a team, winning the 2021 Ryder Cup. Cantlay was named PGA Tour Player of the Year in 2021 winning four titles including the Tour Championship and has six PGA Tour victories. He was an All-American at UCLA, won the Jack Nicklaus Award as collegiate Player of the Year and was on the 2011 Walker Cup team. Schauffele has four PGA Tour wins and made a putt on the 72nd hole to secure the Olympic gold medal in Tokyo. He was named PGA Tour Rookie of the Year in 2017 and has made the Tour Championship every year he's been on Tour, never finishing worse that 7th. He was an All-American at San Diego State University and won the California State Amateur in 2014.





Scottie Scheffler/Ryan Palmer

Scottie Scheffler will make his 2nd appearance at the Zurich Classic, this time with past champion Ryan Palmer as his partner. Scheffler is ranked #5 in the world as of this publication and has two victories in the '21-'22 season. He was a member of the winning 2021 US Ryder Cup team, taking down world #1 Jon Rahm in Sunday singles. He was also a member of the 2017 Walker Cup team that included Collin Morikawa, Will Zalatoris, Cameron Champ, and Maverick McNealy. He finished T-8 with Bubba Watson in his first Zurich Classic appearance in 2021. Ryan Palmer is a long-time favorite in New Orleans and has the 2019 Zurich Classic title on his resume with Jon Rahm as his partner. Palmer has four PGA Tour victories. Palmer also finished 4th in the 2017 Zurich Classic with partner Jordan Spieth.

Shane Lowry/ Ian Poulter

International teammates Ian Poulter and Shane Lowry will partner for the first time at the Zurich Classic in 2022. Poulter, well-known as a fiery Ryder Cup competitor, has compiled a 15-8-2 career record in the matches, earning the nickname The Postman, because he always delivers. He has three PGA Tour wins, two of them World Golf Championships and 12 International victories. He's played on seven European Ryder Cup teams. Poulter has made the cut three times with three different partners at the Zurich Classic, including a T9 with Sam Horsfield in 2019. Irishman Shane Lowry won the 2019 Open Championship at Royal Portush, the first played in Ireland since 1951. It was a very popular win. He has three PGA wins and three International titles. He was a member of the 2020 European Ryder Cup team and represented Ireland in the 2020 Olympics. He partnered with Padraig Harrington at the 2018 Zurich Classic.

Tommy Fleetwood/ Sergio Garcia

Sergio Garcia and Tommy Fleetwood will partner at the Zurich Classic for the second time after a 2nd place team finish in 2019, behind Jon Rahm and Ryan Palmer. Both are known for Ryder Cup exploits, as Garcia is the all-time leading points scorer in Ryder Cup history, and Fleetwood partnered with Francesco Molinari to win all four of their team matches in a winning effort in the 2018 Ryder Cup. Garcia has 11 PGA Tour wins, including the 2017 Masters and has 14 European Tour titles. He has made 10 Ryder Cup teams and represented Spain in the 2016 Olympics. Fleetwood has won six times internationally, and while he hasn't won on the PGA Tour, he has posted 20 top ten finishes. He had a 4th place finish with fellow Englishman Chris Paisley in the 2018 Zurich Classic and has made the last two Ryder Cup teams. Fleetwood won the English Amateur in 2009 and was a member of the GB&I Walker Cup team. He represented England in the 2020 Olympics.

Harold Varner III / Bubba Watson

Bubba Watson, two-time Masters champion and winner of the 2011 Zurich Classic will team with Harold Varner III in the 2022 Zurich Classic. Watson has 12 PGA Tour wins and has played on four Ryder Cup teams and two Presidents Cup teams. He finished T-8 in the 2021 Zurich Classic with Scottie Scheffler and T-5 with JB Holmes in 2017. Varner is an extremely popular player and is currently ranked 40th in the world. He's won two international titles, the 2016 Australian PGA and the 2022 PIF Saudi International. He has qualified for the FedEx Cup Playoffs for six consecutive years. He played collegiately at East Carolina University and was named Conference USA Player of the Year in 2012.

Zurich Classic of New Orleans Record Book (est. 2017, thru 2021 event)

*2017 & 2018 Format Information:

An historic change was made to the format of the Zurich Classic of New Orleans in 2017, making the event a two-player team event featuring Foursomes (alternate shot) during the first and third rounds and Four-ball (best ball) during the second and fourth rounds. A change was made at the **2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans**, with the two formats switching rotations. Rounds one and three in the two-player team event featured the Four-ball (best ball) format, while the second and fourth rounds used the Foursomes (alternate shot) format.

Since the formation of the PGA TOUR (1968), the Zurich Classic became the first official event to utilize Foursomes as part of a team competition.

The 2017 Zurich Classic was the first official PGA TOUR team event in 36 years. Before that, the last official PGA TOUR team event was the 1981 Walt Disney World National Team Championship held at the Magnolia, Palm and Lake Buena Vista courses at Disney. Vance Heafner and Mike Holland won that title. The tournament became an individual stroke-play event in 1982.

The Zurich Classic awards FedExCup points and official money and counts as an official victory for the members of the winning team.
