Things to Know

- Five players share the first-round lead at 5-under at the Boeing Classic: Tim Petrovic, 2014 champion Scott Dunlap, Billy Mayfair, Scott McCarron and K.J. Choi.
- This is the most number of players tied for the lead after 18 holes this season, and the most in Boeing Classic history.
 - The last time five players shared the first-round lead on PGA TOUR Champions was the 2020 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship.

Tim Petrovic, 32-35 - 67 (-5)

- This is his fifth time co-leading after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 0-for-4 converting those into victories
- 55-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (116th start)
 - Owns 10 runner-up finishes (Last: 2022 Chubb Classic)
- Making his fifth appearance at the Boeing Classic, his best finish is T7 (2021)

Scott Dunlap, 35-32 - 67 (-5)

- This is his sixth time leading/co-leading after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o Is 0-for-5 converting those into victories
 - Last: 2019 Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex (T1)
- 58-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (169th start)
 - Won the 2014 Boeing Classic
- Making his 14th start of the season, his best finish is T14 (Mitsubishi Electric Classic)
- Making his seventh appearance at the Boeing Classic, the 2014 champion has three top-10s at this event

Billy Mayfair, 33-34 - 67 (-5)

- This is his fifth time leading/co-leading after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 0-for-4 converting those into victories
 - Last: 2021 Boeing Classic (T1)
- 56-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (130th start)
 - Owns four runner-up finishes (Last: 2021 Boeing Classic)
- Making his 13th start of the season, his best finish is T14 (KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship)
- Making his sixth appearance at the Boeing Classic, he owns two top-3s (T2/2021, T3/2017)

Scott McCarron, 34-33 - 67 (-5)

- This is his 10th time leading/co-leading after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 2-for-9 converting those into victories
 - Last: 2019 Ally Challenge (T1)
- 57-year-old seeks his 12th win on PGA TOUR Champions (151st start)
 - o Last win: 2019 Japan Championship
- Making his 15th start of the season, his best finish is T14 (American Family Insurance Championship)
- Making his fifth appearance at the Boeing Classic, his best finish is T6 (2018)

K.J. Choi, 33-34 - 67 (-5)

- This is his second time leading/co-leading after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 0-for-1 converting those into victories
- 52-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (34th start)
 - Won the 2021 PURE Insurance Championship
- Making his 14th start of the season, his best finish is 2nd (Hoag Classic)
- Making his second appearance at the Boeing Classic, he finished T26 in his debut in 2021

Other Notes

- Four players are T6 at 4-under 68, including 2015 champion Billy Andrade, 2019 champion Brandt Jobe,
 Charles Schwab No. 5 Steve Stricker and Charles Schwab No. 6 Stephen Ames.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Steven Alker and Seattle native Fred Couples are among the seven players sitting T10 at 3-under.
- Seeking his fourth win in his last seven starts this season, 2017 Boeing Classic champion Jerry Kelly sits T17 after carding 2-under 70.
- Defending champion Rod Pampling posted 1-under 71 and sits T24.
