Things to Know

- Charles Schwab Cup leader Steven Alker posted his second consecutive bogey-free round to take a one-stroke lead over Charles Schwab No. 2 Padraig Harrington at the halfway point of the Charles Schwab Cup Championship.
- Alker entered the week with a 617,980-point lead over No. 2 **Padraig Harrington** (2nd). Harrington needs a win, and help from Alker to capture the Charles Schwab Cup.

Steven Alker, 65-64 - 129 (-13)

Charles Schwab Cup standings – Start: 1st / Projected: 1st

- Is the lone player in the field without a bogey after 36 holes
- This is his sixth time leading/co-leading after the second round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 2-for-5 converting those into victories
 - o It is his second time in a 72-hole event (0-for-1)
- This is his low 36-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (129)
 - o Previous best: 131 (three times)
- Charles Schwab Cup leader seeks his fifth win of the season (23rd start)
 - Would be the most by any player on PGA TOUR Champions this season
 - Currently tied with Steve Stricker (4) for the most wins this season
 - Would be the most single-season wins by a player on PGA TOUR Champions since Bernhard Langer (7 wins in 2017)

- 51-year-old seeks his sixth win on PGA TOUR Champions (33rd start)
- Making his second start at the Charles Schwab Cup Championship, his position by round at this event is T4-2nd-T3-2nd-T1-1st
- Has led the Charles Schwab Cup standings for 20 consecutive weeks, and is currently projected to win the Cup by 997,980 points over No. 2 Padraig Harrington

Padraig Harrington, 66-64 - 130 (-12)

Charles Schwab Cup standings - Start: 2nd / Projected: 2nd

- Charles Schwab No. 2 matched his low round on PGA TOUR Champions (62nd round)
 - o Previous instances: R3/2022 Mitsubishi Electric Classic, R1/2022 Shaw Charity Classic
- This is his low 36-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (130)
 - o Previous best: 131 (2022 Ascension Charity Classic)
- 51-year-old seeks his fourth win of the season (19th start)
 - Would match Steven Alker (4) and Steve Stricker (4) for the most by any player on PGA TOUR Champions this season
- Making his debut at the Charles Schwab Cup Championship, he owns nine top-3s in 20 starts on PGA TOUR Champions
- Needs a win on Sunday, and help from No. 1 Steven Alker, to claim the 880,000 points necessary to capture the Charles Schwab Cup
 - Alker would have to finish in a 10-way T2 -OR- 8-way T3 -OR- 5-way T4 -OR- 3-way T5 -OR- 6th place or worse for Harrington, with a win, to claim the Charles Schwab Cup

Other Notes

- World Golf Hall of Fame member Retief Goosen and PGA TOUR Champions rookie Brian Gay are T3 at 10-under.
 - o Goosen seeks his second win of the season (Won the Hoag Classic in March)
 - Gay's best finish of the season: 4th (Chubb Classic)
- Seeking his second win in the state of Arizona this year, Miguel Angel Jimenez sits T5 at 9-under, along with
 first-round co-leader Stephen Ames. Jimenez owns three victories this season, including the Cologuard Classic
 in Tucson.
- Winner of last week's TimberTech Championship Bernhard Langer sits T8 at 7-under. The six-time Charles Schwab Cup winner is one victory away from tying Hale Irwin (45) for the most wins all-time on PGA TOUR Champions.
- First-round co-leader John Huston posted even-par 71 and sits T13 at 6-under.
