## Things to Know

- Padraig Harrington captured the Charles Schwab Cup Championship in record-setting fashion, setting the PGA TOUR Champions record for low 72 -hole score (257) and matched the all-time record for strokes under par (27under).
- Steven Alker finished third in the event, but won the season-long race, capturing the Charles Schwab Cup by 157,980 points over No. 2 Harrington.

Padraig Harrington, 66-64-62-65-257 (-27)

- Set the low 72-hole scoring record (aggregate score) in PGA TOUR Champions history (257) - Previous record: Tom Lehman, 258 (2012 Charles Schwab Cup Championship)
- Matched the low 72-hole scoring record (strokes under par) in PGA TOUR Champions history (27-under)
- Previous instance: Jack Nicklaus (1990 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship)
- Matched the second-most birdies in a 72 -hole tournament in PGA TOUR Champions history (27)
- One shy of tying the all-time record (Jack Nicklaus, 28 birdies/1990 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship)
- This was the largest margin of victory this season on PGA TOUR Champions (7 strokes)
- Previous: 6 strokes (four times)
- 51-year-old earned his fourth win of the season (19 starts)
- Matched Steven Alker (4) and Steve Stricker (4) for the most by any player
- It is Harrington's fourth win overall on PGA TOUR Champions (21 starts)
- Finished No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings with $4,015,455$ points
- Earned 13 top-10s in 19 starts, including 10 top- 3 finishes
- Improved to 3 -for-3 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
- Is 2-for-2 in 72-hole tournaments
- Improved to 4 -for-6 when playing in the last group of the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
- Played the final 39 holes without a bogey or worse

Steven Alker, 65-64-68-68 - 265 (-19)

- Captured the Charles Schwab Cup in his first full season on PGA TOUR Champions
- Became the 11th different player to win the Charles Schwab Cup in its 21-year history
- Led the Charles Schwab Cup standings for the final 21 weeks of the 27 -week season
- Other players to lead for at least 20 weeks during a season include Bernhard Langer (2014, 2016, 2017, 2020-21), Scott McCarron (2019), Tom Lehman (2011) and Hale Irwin (2002)
- His $\$ 3,544,425$ earned in 2022 is the second-most by any player in PGA TOUR Champions history
- Most single-season money earned in season: Bernhard Langer (2017): \$3,677,359
- 51-year-old earned four wins, four runner-up finishes and 13 top- 3 s in 23 starts this season
- His four wins matched Padraig Harrington (4) and Steve Stricker (4) for the most by any player this season
- Went the first 65 holes of the tournament without a bogey or worse before the 12 th hole in the final round
- Dating back to last week's TimberTech Championship, he went 68 consecutive holes without a bogey or worse
- Made triple bogey on the 15th hole in the final round of the TimberTech Championship
- This is his low 72-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (265)
- Making his second start at the Charles Schwab Cup Championship, his position by round at this event is T4-2nd-T3-2nd-T1-1st-2nd-3rd
