### Bernhard Langer, 64-68 – 132 (-12)

- World Golf Hall of Fame member is a three-time Chubb Classic winner (2016, 2013, 2011)
  - Two of his three wins came wire-to-wire (2016, 2013)
- In 40 rounds at the Chubb Classic, Langer has made par or better 38 times
  - Through five rounds at Tiburon Golf Club's Black Course, Langer's scoring average is 67
- Langer is the Chubb Classic's leading money winner, earning a collective \$1,509,082 in 13 previous starts
- With a victory tomorrow, Langer would:
  - Extend his current record of oldest winner on PGA TOUR Champions from 64 years, 1 month, 27 days (2021 Dominion Energy Charity Classic) to 64 years, 5 months, 23 days
  - Earn 43<sup>rd</sup> title on PGA TOUR Champions, two behind all-time leader Hale Irwin's 45 career titles
  - Extend his run of consecutive seasons with a win on PGA TOUR Champions to 16
- Six-time Charles Schwab Cup winner (2010, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2020-21), the most in PGA TOUR Champions history

**Scott Parel, 70-64 – 134 (-10)**

- In his seventh appearance, 2020 Chubb Classic winner Parel carded the lowest round of the day with bogey-free 8-under 64
- 2020 victory came at The Classics at Lely Resort when he closed with an 8-under 63, erasing a three-shot deficit to win with a tournament-record tying score of 17-under
- Parel is a three-time winner on PGA TOUR Champions who finished 11<sup>th</sup> on 2020-21 Charles Schwab Cup money list
- Finished T17 at the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai

**Retief Goosen, 67-67 – 134 (-10)**

- World Golf Hall of Fame member carded a second consecutive 5-under 67 and is 10-under through 36 holes
- Making his fourth start at the Chubb Classic (best finish: T6, 2019)
- First and only PGA TOUR Champions title came at the 2019 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship
- Two-time U.S. Open champion (2001, 2004) who owns a total of seven PGA TOUR titles

**Tim Petrovic, 66-68 – 134 (-10)**

- Followed first-round 6-under 66 with a four-under 68 on Saturday to enter the final round at 10-under
- Has finished inside the top-10 twice in his six previous starts at the Chubb Classic (T4, 2020; T2, 2018)
- 55-year-old is still seeking his first win on PGA TOUR Champions
  - Has nine runner-up finishes and 21 top-10s through 101 starts
- Winner of the 2005 Zurich Classic of New Orleans on the PGA TOUR

**Other Notes**

- 2022 Rookies **Brian Gay** and **YE Yang**, both making their first start this week, are tied at 7-under 137 (T7) and will play together in the final round
- 2019 Chubb Classic winner **Miguel Angel Jimenez**, who won the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai is T21 at 3-under 141 after carding 2-under 70 in the second round
- New Zealand native **Steven Alker**, who earned his first PGA TOUR Champions victory at the 2021 TimberTech Championship, finished with an eagle on the par-5 No. 18 en route to posting a 7-under 65 on Saturday (T5)
- 2021 PGA TOUR Champions Q-School medalist **Rob Labritz** carded a 1-under 71 and is currently T44
