Things to Know

- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Miguel Angel Jimenez** holds a two-stroke lead entering the final round over tournament host **Jerry Kelly** and **Jeff Sluman**
- Jimenez looks to become the first player since 2006 (Loren Roberts) to win two of the first three events of the season on PGA TOUR Champions
- Three past champions are in the top 10 entering the final round: **Woody Austin** (T4), **Bernhard Langer** (T6) and **Marco Dawson** (T8)
- The low round of the day (65) was shot by **Brandt Jobe** (T8) and **Paul Broadhurst** (T11)

Miguel Angel Jimenez, 66-67 – 133 (-11)

- This is his 15th time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - 5-for-14 converting those into victories
- Today's 67 was his sixth round of 67 or better this season (eight rounds)
- Seeking his 12th win on PGA TOUR Champions, and fourth consecutive two-win season
 - Has won at least once in all eight seasons on PGA TOUR Champions, including 2022
- With a win on Sunday, he would become the first player to win two of the first three events of the season on PGA TOUR Champions since 2006 (Loren Roberts)
 - Jimenez's 2022 finishes: Won/Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai, T5/Chubb Classic
- A win on Sunday would be the 13th victory by a player from Spain on PGA TOUR Champions
- Making his fourth start at the Cologuard Classic, his best finish is T5 (2020)

Jerry Kelly, 68-67 – 135 (-9)

- Seeking his ninth win on PGA TOUR Champions, which would give him at least one win in each of his five seasons
- Tournament host is making his sixth start at the Cologuard Classic and his best finish is T2 (2018)

Jeff Sluman, 66-69 – 135 (-9)

- Seeking his seventh win on PGA TOUR Champions and to break a winless streak of 2,820 days when he and partner Fred Funk won the 2014 Big Cedar Lodge Legends of Golf presented by Bass Pro Shops
- This is his best position entering the final round since the 2018 Rapiscan Systems Classic (was T2, finished T11)
 - Has entered the final round T2 or better 13 times, converting two of those into wins
- Making his eighth start at this event, his best finish is T6 (2015)
- Won the 1997 Chrysler Classic of Tucson, played at Omni Tucson National, on the PGA TOUR

Other Notes

- 2016 champion **Woody Austin** is T4 at 8-under, along with **Gene Sauers**.
- 2020 champion and winner of last week's Chubb Classic **Bernhard Langer** is T6 at 7-under after shooting 5-under 67 on Saturday. A win on Sunday would be Langer's 44th victory on PGA TOUR Champions, one shy of tying the all-time record (Hale Irwin, 45).
- Defending champion **Kevin Sutherland** carded 5-under 67 to move from T40 to T11 and enters the final round at 5-under.
- **Darren Clarke** withdrew following the second round.
- The par-4 18th hole is playing as the most difficult hole on the course with a scoring average of 4.541 and has yielded only seven birdies thru 36 holes.
 - No. 18 played as the most difficult hole in each of the first seven Cologuard Classics. (Note: 2022 is the eighth playing of the Cologuard Classic)
 - Three times since the inaugural Cologuard Classic in 2015, No. 18 at Omni Tucson National played as one of the top 10 most difficult holes all season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - 2021: Second-most difficult hole of the 2020-21 season (4.631 scoring average)
 - 2018: Sixth-most difficult hole of the season (4.452)
 - 2016: Eighth-most difficult hole of the season (4.399)
