### Things to Know

- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Miguel Angel Jimenez** won for the second time in the first three events of the 2022 season with a four-stroke victory at the Cologuard Classic.
- Past champions **Bernhard Langer** (2020) and **Woody Austin** (2016) shared runner-up honors, while tournament host **Jerry Kelly** finished fourth.
- **Rocco Mediate** carded the round of the day and matched the 18-hole tournament scoring record with 9-under 63 on Sunday.
  - (Note: Omni Tucson National played as a par 73 from 2017 to 2021)

### Miguel Angel Jimenez, 66-67-65 – 198 (-18)

- 58-year-old earns his 12th win on PGA TOUR Champions
  - This is his fourth consecutive two-win season
  - He has won at least once in all eight seasons on PGA TOUR Champions
- Becomes the first player since 2006 (Loren Roberts) to win two of the first three events of the season on PGA TOUR Champions
  - Won the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai in January
  - Finished T5 at last week's Chubb Classic
- Made a hole-in-one on the par-3 14th hole with a 6-iron from 188 yards in the final round
  - Was his second ace this week (No. 7/Round 1)
  - Was the 10th hole-in-one in tournament history
    - (Note: Tim Petrovic made two aces at the 2021 Cologuard Classic)
- Posted 198 to set the Cologuard Classic 54-hole aggregate scoring record
- Matched the largest margin of victory (4) in Cologuard Classic history (Mark O'Meara/2019)
  - MARKED the largest margin of victory on PGA TOUR Champions since the 2021 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship, won by Steve Stricker (six strokes)
    - (Note: The 2021 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship was a 72-hole tournament)
    - The last 54-hole tournament with a four-stroke margin of victory or more on PGA TOUR Champions was the 2020 Charles Schwab Series at Ozarks National, won by Phil Mickelson (four strokes)

- Extends his lead in the Charles Schwab Cup standings to \$232,295 over No. 2 Bernhard Langer after entering the week with a lead of \$106,295
- Improves to 6-for-15 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
- Earns the 13th victory by a player from Spain on PGA TOUR Champions
- Earns his 11th top-10 in his last 12 starts on PGA TOUR Champions, dating back to last season

#### Other Notes

- 2020 champion and winner of last week's Chubb Classic **Bernhard Langer** recorded a bogey-free 7-under 65 in the final round to finish T2 along with 2016 champion **Woody Austin**, who carded 14-under 202. Langer sits No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- In his sixth start at the Cologuard Classic, tournament host **Jerry Kelly** finished the event at 11-under 205 for fourth place.
- Defending champion **Kevin Sutherland** finished T13 after carding 7-under 209.
- The par-4 18th played as the most difficult hole with a scoring average of 4.492 and yielded only 14 birdies in 54 holes.
  - No. 18 played as the most difficult hole in each of the first seven Cologuard Classics. (Note: 2022 is the eighth playing of the Cologuard Classic)
  - Three times since the inaugural Cologuard Classic in 2015, No. 18 at Omni Tucson National played as one of the top 10 most difficult holes all season on PGA TOUR Champions
    - 2021: Second-most difficult hole of the 2020-21 season (4.631 scoring average)
    - 2018: Sixth-most difficult hole of the season (4.452)
    - 2016: Eighth-most difficult hole of the season (4.399)
