Things to Know

- Canadian **Mike Weir** recorded birdies on seven of eight consecutive holes in round 2, en route to a seven-under 65 on the day. He sits at 12-under for the tournament and in solo first entering the final round.
- Play was suspended for one hour and 57 minutes, from 2:58 p.m. to 4:55 p.m. ET, due to inclement weather.

Mike Weir – 67-65 – 132 (-12)

- Canada native recorded a seven-under 65 in round 2, matching the low round of the day (Bob Estes).
 - Weir's 65 is his lowest round this season and matches the fourth-lowest round of his career. His last round at 65 or better came at the 2021 Shaw Charity Classic (63 in round 1).
- Seeks his second career PGA TOUR Champions title
 - Won 2021 Insuperity Classic
- Weir looks to join R.W. Eaks (2007) Eduardo Romero (2008), Bart Bryant (2013), Paul Goydos (2016), Scott McCarron (2017) and Doug Barron (2019) as 36-hole leaders/co-leaders of the DICK'S Sporting Goods Open to convert for the win
- Weir's 132 is the second-lowest 36-hole score in his PGA Tour Champions career, trailing only the 2020 Dominion Energy Classic (131).
- Recorded four consecutive birdies in today's round, matching the longest such streak of his career.
 - Best: five consecutive (R2/2021 DICK'S Sporting Goods Open).
- Is 0-for-3 when attempting to convert a lead/co-lead into victory heading into the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - NOTE: Won 2021 Insuperity Invitational, which was shortened to a 36-hole event due to rain.

Pádraig Harrington– 66-67 – 133 (-11)

- Harrington, who currently stands at No. 4 on the Charles Schwab Cup money list, recorded a five-under 67 in round 2 and stands in second place entering the final round
 - Harrington has finished in the top three in six of his past nine starts, including winning the 2022 U.S. Senior Open Championship
- His 133 is a career low 36-hole score on PGA Tour Champions
- Seeks his second career PGA TOUR Champions title

Ernie Els – 67-68 – 135 (-9)

- South Africa native and World Golf Hall of Fame Member recorded a four-under 68 in round 2.
- Seeks his third career PGA TOUR Champions title and first since the 2020 SAS Championship
- Recorded four consecutive birdies in today's round, the second-longest such streak in his PGA Tour Champions career
 - Best: five consecutive (R2/2020 Cologard Classic).

Vijay Singh – 65-70 – 135 (-9)

- The first-round co-leader tallied a two-under 70 in round 2 and stands at T3 entering the final round.
- Matches his second-best 36-hole score this season
 - (also: 132 at Mitsubishi Electric Championship, 135 at Shaw Charity Classic)
- Seeks his fifth career PGA TOUR Champions title and first since the 2018 Charles Schwab Cup Championship

Other Notes

- **Bob Estes** shot a bogey-free 65 (-7) in round 2, matching the low round of the day and one stroke off of his career low round on PGA Tour Champions (64, three times, most recent: R1 2022 Senior PGA Championship). Estes sits at T22 entering the final round.
- First round co-leader **Jim Furyk** recorded a one-under 71 and stands at T5. Furyk's 136 is his second-best 36-hole score this season, trailing only Mitsubishi Electric Championship.
- **Tom Pernice** registered a 68 for the second consecutive day and sits at -8 for the week, currently T4. The 136 marks his lowest 36-hole score this season and lowest since 2021 Shaw Classic.
- **Gene Sauers** tallied a five-under 67 in round 2 and currently stands at T5. Sauers registered a T8 finish last week at the Boeing Classic.
- Defending champion **Cameron Beckman** recorded with a 2-under 71 and stands T51.
