Things to Know:

- Three of the top four in the Charles Schwab Cup standings beginning the week sit inside the top three on the leaderboard through 36 holes.
- Coming off a solo-third at last week's SAS Championship, **Jerry Kelly** (No. 4) positions himself for a fourth PGA TOUR Champions title of the season to tie Steve Stricker for most wins this season.
- Coming off a solo-second at last week's SAS Championship, **Steven Alker** (No.1) birdies his last three holes in his first Dominion Energy Charity Classic start to post a 7-under 65; looks to extend his lead in the Charles Schwab Cup with a fourth title of the season.
- **Padraig Harrington** (No. 2) is 6-under on the par-5s through 36 holes this week in his bid for a fourth title of the season.

- Highlighted by an eagle at his final hole of the day, the par-5 18th, **Brian Gay** posts a bogey-free 8-under 64, the field's low score through 36 holes.

Jerry Kelly – 1st / 65-67 (-12)

- Coming off a third-place finish at last week's SAS Championship, Kelly has offset two bogeys through 36 holes with 14 birdies.
- Is 4-for-9 when attempting to convert a 36-hole lead/co-lead into victory on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Making his fifth start in the Dominion Energy Charity Classic and first since producing his best finish (T18/2020).
- On the strength of three PGA TOUR Champions titles this season (Principal Charity Classic, Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship, Shaw Charity Classic) began this week's first Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs event at No. 4 in the standings.
- With a win this week, projected to move to No. 3 in the standings.
- With a win, would tie Steve Stricker for most victories this season (four); by comparison, he won three times in 625 total PGA TOUR starts, but required only 16 PGA TOUR Champions starts this season to equal that number of victories.

Other Notes

- Coming off a solo-second at last week's SAS Championship, **Steven Alker** birdied his last three holes in his first Dominion Energy Charity Classic start to post a 7-under 65 and move to 10-under 134 (2nd); looks to extend his lead in the Charles Schwab Cup and tie Steve Stricker for most wins this season (4).
- Seeking a fourth PGA TOUR Champions title in his first start at the Dominion Energy Charity Classic, **Padraig Harrington** followed a 4-under 68 in round one with a bogey-free 5-under 67 to move to within three strokes of the lead at 9-under 135 (T3).
- Doug Barron** birdied four of his last seven holes in his third start in the event to post a 5-under 67 and move to 9-under 135 (T3); seeks a fifth top-10 finish of the season in his 21st start.
- Making his second start in the Dominion Energy Charity Classic (T6/2020), **K.J. Choi** (T5/-8) posted a bogey-free 7-under 65 in his bid for a second PGA TOUR Champions title (2021 PURE Insurance Championship Impacting First Tee) and third top-5 finish of the season (2nd/Hoag Classic, T4/Senior PGA Championship).
- With six birdies and an eagle at the par-5 18th, **Brian Gay** moved to 8-under 136 (T5) after a bogey-free 8-under 64, the field's low score through 36 holes, as well as his PGA TOUR Champions low score (41 rounds); seeks a fifth top-10 finish in his 14th start as a PGA TOUR Champions rookie.
- 2017 and 2021 Dominion Energy Charity Classic winner **Bernhard Langer** carded a 1-under 71 in his sixth tournament start to reach T13 at 5-under 139; the six-time Charles Schwab Cup champion seeks an 11th top-10 and second win of the season (Chubb Classic).
