### Things to Know

- Starting the day four strokes back, **Steve Flesch** shot 7-under 65 to win the Mitsubishi Electric Classic by one stroke over **Padraig Harrington**, **Fred Couples** and 36-hole leader **David Toms**.
- Harrington, Doug Barron and Darren Clarke each posted 8-under 64 to match the 18-hole tournament record.

#### Steve Flesch, 67-73-65 - 205 (-11)

- The 54-year-old earns his second win on PGA TOUR Champions, and snaps a winless streak of four years and 23 days (or 1,484 days), dating back to the 2018 Mitsubishi Electric Classic
  - Since his win in 2018, he had seven top-3 finishes on PGA TOUR Champions, including five during the 2020-21 season, before today
- Becomes the first repeat of the Mitsubishi Electric Classic, which was held for the ninth time
- Matches the largest come-from-behind win in the final round in tournament history (4/Woody Austin/2016)
- Today's 65 was his lowest 18-hole score at the Mitsubishi Electric Classic (12 rounds)
  - Was his lowest 18-hole score of the 2022 season (18 rounds)
- In 10 starts at the AT&T Classic at TPC Sugarloaf (PGA TOUR), he earned four top-10s, including a T3 finish in 1998

#### **Other Notes**

- Padraig Harrington, Fred Couples and David Toms each finished T2 at 10-under 206.
  - This is Harrington's second runner-up finish in his last three starts on PGA TOUR Champions (T2/2022 Rapiscan Systems Classic)
  - Making his second start of the season, Couples earns his first runner-up finish since the 2021 American Family Insurance Championship
  - Toms, the solo leader entering the final round, earned his fifth top-10 of the season in seven starts to move up to No. 6 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Ernie Els finished fifth for his fourth top-10 in seven starts this season on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Open qualifier Mark Walker, making his 12th start on PGA TOUR Champions, finished sixth to earn a spot into the Principal Charity Classic.
- Retief Goosen, winner of the 2002 AT&T Classic at TPC Sugarloaf, finished T10 at 5-under 211.

## Page 2 of 2 | Final-Round Media Notes

- Making his second start of the season, **Steve Stricker** finished T10 for back-to-back top-10 finishes. Dating back to last season, Stricker has finished in the top-10 in 12 of his last 13 starts on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Ken Duke, who co-led after the first round and sat in second entering the final round, finished T10 at 5-under 211.
- Fran Quinn made a hole-in-one on No. 11 with a 9-iron from 125 yards.
