Things to Know

- 65-year-old **Bernhard Langer** carded the low round for the second consecutive day, this time a 6-under 66, en route to a six-stroke win at the TimberTech Championship. It is Langer's 44th win on PGA TOUR Champions, as he moves within one victory of tying Hale Irwin (45) for the most all-time.
- **Weather Delays**: There were two suspensions of play due to heavy rain during Sunday's final round. Each suspension lasted five minutes one at 9:00 a.m., and one at 2:16 p.m.

Bernhard Langer, 70-63-66 - 199 (-17)

Charles Schwab Cup standings - Start: 7th / Projected: 5th

- Extended his record as the oldest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history (65 years, 2 months, 10 days)
 - Now holds the Top 3 spots on the oldest winners list
 - No. 2: 2022 Chubb Classic (64 years, 5 months, 24 days)
 - No. 3: 2021 Dominion Energy Charity Classic (64 years, 1 month, 27 days)
- Earned his 44th win on PGA TOUR Champions (315 starts)
 - o Is one win shy of tying Hale Irwin (45) for the most wins in PGA TOUR Champions history
- Earned his second win of the season after capturing the Chubb Classic in February (21 starts)
 - o Becomes the seventh multi-time winner this season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - This is his 13th multi-win season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - This is his 10th consecutive multi-win season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Note: 2022 is his 15th season since joining PGA TOUR Champions
- Has won 13.9% of his starts on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o Ranks second among players who have at least 10 wins, behind only Steve Stricker (23.4%)
- This is his 11th win since turning 60 years old, most in PGA TOUR Champions history
- The 199 total is his lowest 54-hole score of the season
- Matched the largest margin of victory by any player this season on PGA TOUR Champions (6)
- Boca Raton resident earned his ninth win in the state of Florida on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o It's his second win in Florida this season (Won the Chubb Classic in Naples, Florida)

- Becomes the first three-time winner of the TimberTech Championship (2010, 2019, 2022)
 - This is the sixth tournament he has won at least three times on PGA TOUR Champions, joining the Chubb Classic (4), The Senior Open presented by Rolex (4), Insperity Invitational (4), Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (3) and Kaulig Companies Championship (3)
- Improved to 28-for-44 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
- Improved to 2-for-4 when playing in the last group of the final round this season

Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs Implications

The Top 36 players in the Charles Schwab Cup standings have qualified for the Charles Schwab Cup Championship. 2017 Charles Schwab Cup champion **Kevin Sutherland** and **John Huston** each moved inside the Top 36 after starting the week 37th and 42nd in the standings, respectively.

Other Notes

- 2015 champion Paul Goydos and Thongchai Jaidee each finished T2 at 11-under.
 - This is Goydos' best finish since the 2021 Mitsubishi Electric Classic (T2)
 - This is Jaidee's fourth top-3 finish this season (20 starts)
- Charles Schwab No. 2 Padraig Harrington finished fourth at 10-under.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader and defending TimberTech Championship winner Steven Alker finished T6 at 7under.
 - Alker leads No. 2 Harrington by 617,980 points entering the Charles Schwab Cup Championship.
- Jerry Kelly moved up to No. 3 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings after finishing T16 at 3-under.
