# Things to Know / New Korn Ferry Tour Finals Structure

- The 2023 Korn Ferry Tour season concludes with the 30th playing of the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance, the 26th and final event of the season
- Upon conclusion of this week's season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing
   & Finance, PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top 30 players on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- Victoria National Golf Club hosts the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance for a fifth consecutive year, though the Tour's season-ending event will move to The Dye Course at French Lick Resort for 2024 and beyond
- Notable changes announced in June 2022 and implemented for the first time this season include:
  - Increase from 25 to 30 PGA TOUR cards annually awarded via the Korn Ferry Tour Points List
  - Reimagined Korn Ferry Tour Finals
    - Previous Finals System: Three-event competition for 25 PGA TOUR cards between the top 75 from the Korn Ferry Tour Points List and Nos. 126-200 on the FedExCup standings
    - 2023 and Beyond Finals System: Final four events of the season where members will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning one of the four Finals events, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race, in addition to a progressive reduction in field sizes
  - One season-long Korn Ferry Tour Points List as opposed to separate points lists for the regular season and Korn Ferry Tour Finals
  - Purse increases to \$1.5 million for the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events and \$1 million for the 22 preceding events, with the \$28 million season purse representing the highest single-season total in Korn Ferry Tour history

#### **Bubble Watch**

PGA TOUR cards will be awarded to the top 30 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List following the conclusion of this week's season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance.

Players ranked Nos. 26-44 are separated by 100 points, roughly a top-seven finish this week (solo-seventh is worth 100 points in the Finals). Players ranked Nos. 30-39 are separated by 53 points, roughly a top-19 finish this week (solo 19th is worth 53 points in the Finals).

# Field Notes (as of 10/3/2023)

- Of the 21 champions from the first 25 events this season, 19 of those winners are in this week's field:
  - Pierceson Coody (two wins), Chan Kim (two wins), Ben Kohles (two wins), Paul Barjon, Ricky Castillo, Trace Crowe, Adrien Dumont de Chassart, Jorge Fernández Valdés, Rhein Gibson, Scott Gutschewski, Rico Hoey, Spencer Levin, Chandler Phillips, Ben Silverman, David Skinns, Roger Sloan, Jimmy Stanger, Alejandro Tosti, Norman Xiong
- Three-time winner **Pierceson Coody**, two-time winner **Chan Kim**, and four-time winner **Ben Kohles** are bidding to become the 13th player in history to earn the Three-Victory Promotion, which grants an immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR; they would become eligible for the 2023 FedExCup Fall
- Field includes 13 players currently inside the top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking: Alejandro Tosti (No. 100), Pierceson Coody (No. 106), Chan Kim (No. 124), Rico Hoey (No. 131), Ben Silverman (No. 143), Ben Kohles (No. 146), Norman Xiong (No. 158), Jake Knapp (No. 172), Max Greyserman (No. 180), Chris Gotterup (No. 182), Jacob Bridgeman (No. 191), Parker Coody (No. 192), Adrien Dumont de Chassart (No. 198)

# **PGA TOUR University Class of 2023**

- Three of the top 10 finishers from the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking qualified for this week's Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance:
  - No. 3 Adrien Dumont de Chassart (Illinois) declared #TOURBound; won professional and Korn Ferry Tour debut in June, recorded top-10s in each of first six Korn Ferry Tour starts (tied Korn Ferry Tour record for consecutive top-10s)
  - No. 8 **Patrick Welch** (Oklahoma) stands No. 74 on Korn Ferry Tour Points List, earned fully exempt status for 2024 Korn Ferry Tour season
  - No. 9 Ricky Castillo (Florida) stands No. 52 on Korn Ferry Tour Points List, won professional and Korn Ferry Tour debut in June, earned fully exempt status for 2024 Korn Ferry Tour season
- The top five finishers from the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking earned fully exempt status on the Korn Ferry Tour through the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Finals (which grants entry to its field based off the Korn Ferry

- Tour Points List), as well as an exemption to Final Stage of 2023 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry where the top five finishers and ties earn PGA TOUR cards and the ability to accept unlimited PGA TOUR sponsor exemptions for the remainder of 2023 and 2024
- Finishers Nos. 6-10 from the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking earned conditional status for the remainder of the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour season, as well as fully exempt status for the 2023 PGA TOUR Canada season, an exemption to Second Stage of 2023 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry, and exempt status through the Latin America Swing of the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas season
- Adrien Dumont de Chassart and Ricky Castillo, who finished No. 3 and No. 9 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2023, respectively, both won their professional and Korn Ferry Tour debuts in back-to-back events to earn fully exempt status for the remainder of the 2023 season
  - Dumont de Chassart won the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNNEX (Sunday, June 11), followed by Castillo's win a week later at the Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics (Sunday, June 18), as Castillo defeated Dumont de Chassart and Kyle Jones in a playoff
    - Castillo's win upended Dumont de Chassart's bid to become the second player in Korn Ferry Tour history to win their first two starts on Tour (Ben Kohles/2012)

- Justin Suh earned his first PGA TOUR-sanctioned victory to finish No. 1 on the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, which earned him fully exempt status on TOUR for 2023, as well as exemptions for the 2023 PLAYERS Championship and U.S. Open
- Austin Eckroat and Eric Cole solidified PGA TOUR cards with their respective finishes, with both earning PGA TOUR membership for the first time

- Three additional players Jake Knapp, Nicholas Lindheim, and Chandler Phillips were declared #TOURBound and are assured of PGA TOUR membership for 2024, with Knapp and Phillips earning their first TOUR cards
- Joe Highsmith's career-high finish moved him from No. 48 to No. 27 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- **Curtis Luck** closed in 5-under 66, the low round of the final round, and rose from No. 61 to No. 47 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List with his second top-10 of the season and his best finish on Tour since winning the 2020 Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship
- Chris Petefish recorded his second runner-up finish of the 2023 season and rose from No. 55 to No. 44 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- **Joey Garber** (T7) and **Patrick Welch** (T24) both moved inside the top 75 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List and earned fully exempt status for the 2024 season, as well as a spot in this week's Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance
