GENERAL INFORMATION

NATIONWIDE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL CHAMPIONSHIP - AT A GLANCE

The Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship is held annually at The Ohio State University Golf Club, Scarlet Course. The tournament offers free admission and is one of four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events that help determine which players will earn PGA TOUR membership each season. The top 30 players in the season-long standings at the conclusion of the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Championship will earn PGA TOUR membership for the 2024 season.

For the first time since 2013 on the Korn Ferry Tour, there are no longer separate point standings for pre-Finals and Finals events, but rather a cumulative standings structure. A Finals event is no longer a competition for TOUR cards between the top 75 on the Korn Ferry Tour and Nos. 126-200 in the FedExCup standings. Beginning this year, "Finals" refers to the final four events of the season, where Korn Ferry Tour members compete for increased purses and points allocation.

The four Finals events – which includes the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship – feature \$1.5 million purses and award 600 points to each winner. The 2023 Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship is the third of the four Finals events, featuring a field of 120 players. The fields for the Finals will be progressively reduced, starting with 156 players for event No. 1, 144 players for event No. 2 and finishing with 75 players in the final event. The preceding 22 events on the schedule will have a minimum purse of \$1 million – a 67% increase from 2021 to 2023 – and award 500 points to the winner.

The field for the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship will compete in 72 holes of stroke play, with a cut to the top-60 players and ties after 36 holes. Golf Channel will broadcast tournament coverage from Thursday's opening round to the trophy presentation on Sunday.

Since its inception in 2007, the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship has raised more than \$22 million in support of pediatric cancer at Nationwide Children's Hospital, the tournament's primary charity beneficiary.

THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY GOLF CLUB

BORN TO HOST... Through the great foresight of L.W. St. John, (OSU Athletic Director, 1912-1947) The Ohio State University can claim two golf courses considered by many to be masterpieces in classical golf course architecture. The Scarlet course is rated as one of the top collegiate courses in the nation. Dr. Alister MacKenzie, a world-renowned golf course architect, submitted the original routing plans to L.W. St. John on January 6, 1931, and construction of the Scarlet course was overseen by famed architect Perry Maxwell. The Scarlet course was completed in 1938 and the Gray course was finished later in 1940.

The dedication ceremony was held on May 18, 1940, when Bob Kepler, (golf coach from 1938-1965) Chick Evans, Blanche Sohl, and Patty Berg played 18 holes on the Scarlet course. Patty Berg, one of the four charter members of the LPGA Hall of Fame, returned to OSU in 1990 to conduct a clinic at the annual OSU Pro-Am Tournament.



In the 1930's only a handful of universities had golf facilities and most of those were eastern schools. Building two golf courses when the country was in the middle of the Great Depression was quite an accomplishment. The labor for the construction of the golf course was provided under a government subsidized program known as the Works Progress Administration, a program designed to create jobs during the depression.

Few schools can boast the proud association The Ohio State University has enjoyed with the game of golf. With the many outstanding players and professionals spawned at this great facility, the name Ohio State has become synonymous with collegiate golf. The list of prominent players from Ohio State is headlined by golf's greatest champion Jack Nicklaus who was a First Team All American for the Buckeyes and the NCAA individual champion in 1961.

In 1941, Ohio State made history when it hosted the first ever women's collegiate golf championship on the Scarlet course. In 1982, Ohio State hosted the final Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) Division I National Championship. In 1991, Ohio State hosted the NCAA Women's Championship, commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the national tournament for women on the



course on which it was conceived. The women's program later went on to host the 1997 and 2006 tournaments as well. The Scarlet course has also played host to 10 men's National Championships. Over the years the Ohio State Scarlet course has been the site of several U.S. Open qualifiers, U.S. Amateur qualifiers and the 1977 USGA Junior Championship.

In 2005 and 2006 the Scarlet course underwent a major restoration project overseen by former Buckeye legend Jack Nicklaus. Jack concentrated on restoring the course to the way Alister MacKenzie originally intended it to play. The bunkers were redesigned to appear more like the classic MacKenzie designs at his numerous other courses. The course was also lengthened to play more than 7,400 yards and the par was changed to 71. The driving range was also enlarged, and a short-game practice area was built for both varsity golf teams as well as another one for the members of the club.

The Nationwide Children' Hospital Championship has been hosted on the Scarlet Course since its inception in 2007.

THE SEVENTEENTH PLAYING OF THE NATIONWIDE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Volunteers, fans, and the Korn Ferry Tour professionals are excited to build on the success of the tournament now entering its seventeenth year at The Ohio State University Golf Club.

The tournament offers FREE general admission and is open to the public from Thursday, September 21 to Friday, September 24.

The playing field for the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship includes an elite roster of 120 players, collectively representing 65 Korn Ferry Tour victories and seven PGA TOUR victories.

From the beginning, the pediatric cancer program at Nationwide Children's Hospital has been the primary beneficiary of the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship. The 2022 Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship raised a total of \$3,316,205 for central Ohio charitable organizations, including \$3,106,585 for pediatric cancer research and treatment at Nationwide Children's Hospital. This marks the largest single-season charitable donation raised for the hospital in the 16-year history of the Korn Ferry Tour Finals event. It's also the second year in a row the event has exceeded the \$3 million mark. Since its inception in 2007, the Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship has donated more than \$22.3 million in support of the hospital's pediatric cancer program.

PROS FORE PATIENTS

The Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship's Pros Fore Patients is a special program designed to celebrate the tournament's support of Nationwide Children's Hospital and the more than \$22.3 million that has been raised for pediatric cancer treatment and research since the tournament began in 2007.



Pros Fore Patients highlights Patient Champions from Nationwide Children's with challenging conditions and diseases, including pediatric cancer. The Pros Fore Patients campaign provides these brave Patient Champions and their families the opportunity to meet and interact with Korn Ferry Tour players from the tournament's field of competitors in a number of special activities, including a putting challenge, hitting stations, interactive games, face painting, balloon art and more. The Patient Champions and their families, along with the Tour professionals, also pay it forward by creating care packages that are delivered to inpatients at Nationwide Children's Hospital during tournament week.

The 2023 Pros Fore Patients event will take place on Tuesday, September 19, 2023, from 4:00-6:00 p.m.

The event is located at the Volunteer Center tent complex adjacent to the main tournament entrance and putting green. Note: The activities will take place on the driving range, putting green and outside the Volunteer Center. The care packages will be assembled inside the Volunteer Center.

New this year, media will have the opportunity to compete against the patient champions and Korn Ferry Tour players in a media putting competition during the event.

There will be opportunities to interview Patient Champions and their families, Nationwide Children's Hospital and Tournament Officials along with Korn Ferry Tour pros and their spouses/significant others. Photo and video opportunities to capture Patient Champions interacting with Tour professionals during the scheduled activities and Care Package assembly.

FIRST SHOT TO FIGHT CANCER

The Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship's First Shot to Fight Cancer is the manner by which the tournament customarily begins its professional competition. It is a tradition that helps boost the spirits of all patients being treated for cancer and brings hope to the countless families affected by the disease. It also serves as a reminder of the most important reason the tournament is staged.

The First Shot to Fight Cancer ceremony will begin at 7:10 a.m. on Thursday, September 21, immediately prior to the tournament's first starting time. Professional tee times for Thursday and Friday start at 7:40 a.m. on tee Nos. 1 and 10.



Hitting the First Shot to Fight Cancer at the 2023 Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship will be 16-year-old "Patient Champion," Reid Zupanc of Delaware, Ohio.

In autumn of 2011, four-year old Reid was excused from school for a routine visit with his ear, nose, and throat (ENT) specialist. As he prepared to have a second set of ear tubes placed in both eardrums, his mom, Lani, noticed an unusual bump on the top of Reid's head. Although small, it was still a cause for concern. Lani informed the ENT specialist that she had told their pediatrician about the unusual bump months ago. The pediatrician had assured her it was a fatty cyst that would go away with time. To be certain, the ENT decided to schedule a surgery to remove the cyst and have it tested by pathology.

"A month later, the doctor called to tell us that the bump was benign," says Lani. "We were so relieved!"

A few months after receiving the benign diagnosis, the bump reappeared on both ends of the incision. Five months later, several bumps appeared in different areas on Reid's head. The bumps were retested by a different doctor. The results showed the bumps were not at all benign; they were tumors. Reid was diagnosed with a vascular cancer called Epithelioid Hemangioendothelioma in August 2011. This rare cancer affects the lining of the blood vessels in the liver and lungs. Reid's cancer was even more rare due to the area of its initial growth. Reid immediately began treatment at Nationwide Children's Hospital. He endured six months of chemotherapy and more than 15 surgeries, including: tumor and lymph node removals, a skin graft, and a lung biopsy.

Reid has remained positive and "full of life" throughout his fight with cancer. Today, Reid is stable and follows up with his oncologist every few months to monitor his health. He is currently in his junior year of high school and is taking college courses. After graduation, he plans to study Neuropathology at the University of London.

During the 2023 First Shot to Fight Cancer ceremony, Reid Zupanc will be awarded a \$10,000 scholarship from Nationwide. The scholarship is a SURPRISE for Reid and his family until the ceremony.

STAYING CONNECTED AT THE NATIONWIDE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship will permit fans to bring their mobile phones and devices in the tournament as part of the Korn Ferry Tour mobile device policy (see below).

Upon reasonable request by TOUR, at TOUR's cost and expense, you will sign any documents necessary to effect TOUR's ownership of all Reproductions. Without limiting the foregoing, you shall not collect, transmit, distribute, publish or sell any scoring, statistical, competition or other data at or from the tournament for purposes of any betting or gambling-related activity. For security purposes, you consent to the reasonable inspection of your person and property before entering the tournament, which may include metal detection. No standalone photo or video cameras (outside of mobile devices) on competition days (allowed practice days only), coolers, ladders, signs, firearms, explosive devices, etc. will be permitted onto the tournament grounds. Mobile devices are permitted to the extent they are on silent and used in accordance with this license and the posted Mobile Device Policy.

- Stay quiet and stand still when the players are about to hit the ball
- "Hands in the air" means to stop and be quiet while golfers are playing their shots
- Stay behind the rope at all times



- Help patrons be considerate of each other and kneel or sit down whenever possible, to allow better viewing for those behind you
- For your own safety, follow the directions of the tournament marshals

Any misconduct, illegal activity, intoxication, use of illegal substance, or violation of any rule or instruction of tournament representatives is prohibited and shall be grounds for forfeiture of your ticket & for your removal from the premises.
