Things to Know

- The 2023 Korn Ferry Tour season continues this week with the fifth playing of the NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank, the 19th tournament on the 26-event schedule
- The Glen Club in Glenview, Illinois (just outside Chicago) has hosted three of the four previous iterations of the NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank, with the exception being 2020, when several events were rescheduled amid the COVID-19 pandemic
- The three winners of the NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank with The Glen Club as its host are Scottie Scheffler (2019), Cameron Young (2021), and Harry Hall (2022)
 - Scheffler, currently No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking, is a 6-time PGA TOUR winner, the 2022 Masters Tournament champion, and the first player in history to win all three of the following awards: Korn Ferry Tour Player of the Year (2019), PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year (2019-20), PGA TOUR Player of the Year (2021-22)
 - Young, the 2021-22 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year, is a 6-time runner-up on the PGA TOUR
 - Hall, a PGA TOUR rookie this season, recently finished T3 at the 2023 Charles Schwab Challenge and ranks inside the top 10 on TOUR in Strokes Gained: Putting
- Top-25 finishers from last year's NV5 Invitational presented by Old National who earned a PGA TOUR card at season's end were Harry Hall (1st), Davis Thompson (T5), Taylor Montgomery (T8), Justin Suh (T8), Paul Haley II (T11), Ben Griffin (T13), Kevin Yu (T13), Carl Yuan (T13), Tano Goya (T18), Sam Stevens (T18), Michael Kim (T23), and Austin Eckroat (T23)
- Top players returning to the field from last year's event are **Jimmy Stanger** (T3), **Christopher Petefish** (T3), **Mac Meissner** (T5), and **Spencer Ralston** (T5)
 - Stanger, who earned his first Korn Ferry Tour win last month at the Compliance Solutions Championship, enters this week at No. 7 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
 - Meissner, who [shot one of two 59s](#) recorded on the Korn Ferry Tour this season, enters the week with a runner-up finish and six top-25s to stand No. 35 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
 - Petefish has one top-10 in 14 starts this season and stands No. 90 on the Points List
 - Ralston has five made cuts (two top-25s) in 17 starts this year to stand No. 121 on the Points List

- **Curtis Thompson** is the lone past champion of the NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank in this week's field; he held off co-runners up **Jimmy Stanger** and Will Zalatoris en route to his first Korn Ferry Tour win at the 2020 NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank at Chicago Highlands Club, and eventually earned his first PGA TOUR card at the end of the 2020-21 combined season
- **Adrien Dumont de Chassart**, a University of Illinois alum who finished No. 3 in the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking, has five consecutive top-10s in his first five Korn Ferry Tour starts, highlighted by a win in his professional debut at the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX
 - *Should Dumont de Chassart top-10 this week, he would tie a Korn Ferry Tour record for consecutive top-10s shared by Doug Martin (1993), Tom Gillis (2009), and John Mallinger (2011)*
- **Rico Hoey**, who stands No. 3 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and is one of three players already declared #TOURBound, finished T20 as a sponsor exemption at last week's Barracuda Championship in his second career PGA TOUR start
- **Zack Fischer** made the cut at last week's Open Championship, his second career major championship appearance and first since the 2013 U.S. Open (missed cut); he gained entry to The Open Championship by winning the 2022 Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro, which annually awards an Open Championship exemption to its winner and will [become a Korn Ferry Tour event in 2024](#)
- This week's NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank is one of five events being contested in a different month as part of the revamped Korn Ferry Tour schedule (more details outlined below)
 - LECOM Suncoast Classic – moved from mid-February to mid-April
 - ***NV5 Invitational presented by Old National Bank – moved from late May to late July***
 - Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation – moved from early May to mid-September
 - Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship -- moved from late August to late September
 - Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance – moved from early September to early October

Field Notes (as of 7/24/2023)

- 11 champions from the first 18 events of the 2023 season are in this week's field:
 - **Ben Kohles (x2), Paul Barjon, Ricky Castillo, Adrien Dumont de Chassart, Jorge Fernández Valdés, Rhein Gibson, Scott Gutschewski, Rico Hoey, Spencer Levin, Chandler Phillips, Jimmy Stanger**
- Field includes 44 Korn Ferry Tour winners and eight PGA TOUR winners
- Field includes three players inside top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking: **Rico Hoey** (No. 142), **Alejandro Tosti** (No. 159), **Ben Kohles** (No. 190)
- Three members in the field have ties to the state of Illinois: **Patrick Flavin** (Chicago native, Highwood resident), **Brad Hopfinger** (Lake Forest High School alum), **Vince India** (Deerfield native and Chicago resident)
- Three members in the field play collegiately in the state of Illinois, with all three playing at University of Illinois – **Brian Campbell, Adrien Dumont de Chassart, Michael Feagles**
- Unrestricted sponsor exemptions were awarded to two of the world's top amateurs in Austin Greaser (No. 5 in World Amateur Golf Ranking) and Caleb Surratt (No. 6 in World Amateur Golf Ranking)
 - Greaser, a rising fifth-year senior at University of North Carolina, is likely to be one of the top players in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking when the ranking is revealed later this year
 - Surratt, a rising sophomore at University of Tennessee, won the inaugural Elite Amateur Cup for an exemption into this week's field; he notably won individual medalist honors at the 2023 Southeastern Conference Championship and went 3-1 at the 2023 Arnold Palmer Cup

PGA TOUR University Class of 2023

- Eight of the top 10 finishers from the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking are in the field this week:
 - No. 2 **Fred Biondi** (Florida) – won individual and team national titles at 2023 NCAA Championship
 - No. 3 **Adrien Dumont de Chassart** (Illinois) – ***won professional and Korn Ferry Tour debut in June, has top-10s in each of first five Korn Ferry Tour starts***
 - No. 4 **Ross Steelman** (Georgia Tech)

- No. 6 **William Mouw** (Pepperdine) – *four top-25s in first six starts on Tour, also finished T13 at John Deere Classic*
- No. 7 **Ryan Burnett** (North Carolina) – *solo-sixth last week for first career top-10*
- No. 8 **Patrick Welch** (Oklahoma)
- No. 9 **Ricky Castillo** (Florida) – *won professional and Korn Ferry Tour debut in June*
- No. 10 **Yuxin Lin** (Florida)
- The top five finishers from the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking earned fully exempt status on the Korn Ferry Tour through the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Finals (which grants entry to its field based off the Korn Ferry Tour Points List), as well as an exemption to Final Stage of 2023 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry – where the top five finishers and ties earn PGA TOUR cards – and the ability to accept unlimited PGA TOUR sponsor exemptions for the remainder of 2023 and 2024
- Finishers Nos. 6-10 from the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking earned conditional status for the remainder of the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour season, as well as fully exempt status for the 2023 PGA TOUR Canada season, an exemption to Second Stage of 2023 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry, and exempt status through the Latin America Swing of the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas season
- For all events prior to the Korn Ferry Tour Finals, the PGA TOUR University category on the Korn Ferry Tour Priority Ranking will be filled by five players to a floor of the No. 10 finisher from the 2023 PGA TOUR University Priority Ranking
 - *Example:* No. 3 Adrien Dumont de Chassart and No. 9 Ricky Castillo now play out of the Tournament Winners category, meaning their places in the PGA TOUR University category will be filled by No. 6 William Mouw and No. 7 Ryan Burnett, respectively
 - *Additional Example:* If No. 2 Fred Biondi records a top-25, he plays the next tournament out of the “Top-25 Previous Event” category, meaning his place in the PGA TOUR University category would be filled by No. 8 Patrick Welch (since Nos. 6 and 7 will already be in field via previous example)
- **Adrien Dumont de Chassart** and **Ricky Castillo**, who finished No. 3 and No. 9 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2023, respectively, both [won their professional and Korn Ferry Tour debuts in back-to-back events](#) to earn fully exempt status for the remainder of the 2023 season
 - Dumont de Chassart won the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX (Sunday, June 11), followed by Castillo’s win a week later at the Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics (Sunday, June 18), as Castillo defeated Dumont de Chassart and Kyle Jones in a playoff
 - Castillo’s win upended Dumont de Chassart’s bid to become the second player in Korn Ferry Tour history to win their first two starts on Tour (Ben Kohles/2012)

2023 Korn Ferry Tour Season

- A number of changes to the Korn Ferry Tour [announced this past June](#) will be implemented for the first time this season, with the most notable changes being:
 - **Increase from 25 to 30 PGA TOUR cards** annually awarded via the Korn Ferry Tour Points List
 - Reimagining of the Korn Ferry Tour Finals
 - *Previous Finals System:* Three-event competition for 25 PGA TOUR cards between the top 75 from the Korn Ferry Tour Points List and Nos. 126-200 on the FedExCup standings
 - **2023 and Beyond Finals System:** Final four events of the season where members will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning one of the four Finals events, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race, in addition to a progressive reduction in field sizes
 - Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron (August 24-27) – 156 players
 - Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation (September 14-17) – 144 players
 - Nationwide Children’s Hospital Championship (September 21-24) – 120 players
 - Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance (October 5-8) – 75 players [no cut]
 - **One season-long Korn Ferry Tour Points List** as opposed to separate points lists for the regular season and Korn Ferry Tour Finals

- **Purses increasing** to \$1.5 million for the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events and \$1 million for the 22 preceding events, with the \$28 million season purse representing the highest single-season total in Korn Ferry Tour history

- Harry Hall captured his second career Korn Ferry Tour victory as he birdied five of the final seven holes of regulation and made three consecutive playoff birdies, defeating local hero and Northbrook, Illinois native Nick Hardy on the third hole of a sudden-death playoff
- Hall made three bogeys across the 72 holes of regulation, the fewest in the field
- Hardy's solo-second marked a career-high finish in what was his 53rd Korn Ferry Tour start; Hardy, who earned his first PGA TOUR card as a 2020-21 Korn Ferry Tour graduate, returned to the PGA TOUR two weeks later and, across three consecutive weeks, finished T35 at the RBC Canadian Open, T14 at the U.S. Open, and T8 at the Travelers Championship
- **Jimmy Stanger** recorded the fourth top-three finish of his career and second of the 2022 season; he previously finished T2 at the 2022 Panama Championship
- **Christopher Petefish** recorded a career-high finish in what was his ninth Korn Ferry Tour start; his previous career-high finish was T24/2022 Visit Knoxville Open, which he Monday qualified into

- Pierceson Coody earned his third career win in his 26th career start on the Korn Ferry Tour, joining Stewart Cink, Russell Henley, Nick Flanagan, and Carlos Ortiz as the only players in Tour history to win three times before turning 24 years old
- The win vaulted Coody to No. 109 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Coody became the second 18-hole leader/co-leader who went on to win this season (Nicholas Lindheim/The Ascendant presented by Blue) and the fourth 54-hole leader/co-leader to win this season
- **Parker Coody**, who began the season with conditional status, posted his second consecutive top-three finish, and his fourth top-five finish in his last eight starts
- Ben Silverman recorded his second runner-up finish of the season and, combined with his win earlier this season, became the third player declared #TOURBound; he will return to the PGA TOUR next season for the first time since graduating via the Korn Ferry Tour at the end of the 2017 season
- **Thomas Walsh** led the field with 29 total birdies en route to a career-high finish in his 33rd start on Tour; his only previous top-10 on Tour was earlier this season (T9/AdventHealth Championship)
- **Chandler Phillips** recorded his first top-10 since winning the season-opening The Bahamas Great Exuma Classic at Sandals Emerald Bay
- **Ryan Burnett**, who finished No. 7 in the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking, recorded his first top-10 in his fifth career start, snapped a streak of three consecutive missed cuts
