# **TOP STORYLINES**

The 3M Open is the 43rd of 44 PGA TOUR events in the FedExCup Regular Season, with just two weeks remaining until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs. New in 2023, only the top 70 in the FedExCup standings will qualify for the FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first Playoffs event), down from 125 (2009-2022). Notable players outside the top 70 in the FedExCup standings include No. 75 Justin Thomas, No. 90 Gary Woodland and No. 118 Billy Horschel.

Tony Finau, the second-highest-ranked player in the field at No. 19 in the Official World Golf Ranking, is making his second start this season as the defending champion, previously missing the cut at the Rocket Mortgage Classic. With wins this season at the Cadence Bank Houston Open and the Mexico Open at Vidanta, Finau is one of six players with multiple titles on TOUR this season, along with Jon Rahm (4), Max Homa (2), Scottie Scheffler (2), Wyndham Clark (2), Keegan Bradley (2) and Rory McIlroy (2). With a win, Finau would become the fourth player to successfully defend a title this season, joining Homa (Fortinet Championship), McIlroy (THE CJ CUP) and Scheffler (WM Phoenix Open) and the second with three or more victories this season, joining Rahm.

**Justin Thomas** is currently No. 75 in the FedExCup standings with two weeks remaining until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs. Thomas, in his ninth season as a TOUR member, has never missed the Playoffs. He has advanced to the TOUR Championship in each of the last seven seasons and finished in the top 10 in the standings in the last six, including his FedExCup title in 2017. Thomas has the most PGA TOUR wins (15) and major championship titles (2) of any player in the field and is also the most recent PLAYERS Championship winner (2021) and FedExCup Champion (2017).

24 players in the field are making the trip from The Open Championship, including three that finished in the top 10: **Sepp Straka** (T2), **Emiliano Grillo** (T6) and **Cameron Young** (T8).

Straka has a win (John Deere Classic) and a T2 (The Open Championship) in his last two starts, becoming the first player to win on TOUR and finish runner-up in his next start since Jordan Spieth in 2022 (Won/RBC Heritage, 2nd/AT&T Byron Nelson). Straka is No. 15 in the FedExCup standings, the second-highest of any player in the field (Finau/10), and is attempting to qualify for the TOUR Championship for the second consecutive season.

Grillo, who won the Charles Schwab Challenge earlier this season for his second career PGA TOUR title, has two top-fives in three starts at the 3M Open, including a T2 in 2022. His T6 at The Open Championship was his first career top-10 in a major.

At No. 15 in the Official World Golf Ranking, Young is the highest-ranked player in the field. He is also the highest-ranked player in the OWGR that has not won on the PGA TOUR. Young is making his tournament debut at the 3M Open.

Patrick Rodgers lost in a playoff to Akshay Bhatia at last week's Barracuda Championship, earning the fourth runner-up of his career and second via playoff (2018 RSM Classic). Since Rodgers joined the PGA TOUR at the start of the 2015-16 season, he has made 219 starts, the most of any player without a win in that span (second: 212, Scott Stallings). The last player to lose in a playoff and win the following week was Patrick Cantlay in 2022 (lost in a playoff at the RBC Heritage, won the Zurich Classic of New Orleans the following week with partner Xander Schauffele).

Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Sungjae Im** finished T2 at the 2022 3M Open and is making his 150th career start on the PGA TOUR. Since the start of his rookie season, only two players have made more starts on the PGA TOUR than Im's 147 (149/Tom Hoge, 149/Adam Schenk). Im has seven top-10s this season but none in his last eight starts.

Stillwater, Minnesota native **Frankie Capan III** is competing on a sponsor exemption. Capan is currently No. 34 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List and the top 30 at the end of the season will earn PGA TOUR cards for 2024. This is his third career start on the PGA TOUR (MC/2016 Puerto Rico Open, MC/2023 U.S. Open).

### ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

2023 PGA TOUR University No. 1 **Ludvig Aberg** is making his sixth start since joining the PGA TOUR directly out of Texas Tech University, with his best result coming at the John Deere Classic (T4). Aberg is No. 146 in the FedExCup standings and is eligible for the 2023 FedExCup Playoffs if he finishes in the top 70 in the FedExCup standings through next week's Wyndham Championship. He is exempt through next season via PGA TOUR University.

**Paul Haley II** is playing on the PGA TOUR for the eighth consecutive week, the longest active streak of any player in the field. Haley, in his second season as a TOUR member and first since 2013, is No. 132 in the FedExCup standings.

The four Open Qualifiers for the 3M Open are **Kaito Onishi**, **Noah Hofman**, **Alex Gaugert** and **Daniel Gale**. Onishi is making his fourth start on the PGA TOUR this season and second as an Open Qualifier. He got into the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP via the Japan Golf Tour (76th), received a sponsor exemption for the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC) and most recently got into the John Deere Classic as an Open Qualifier. This is Gale's second consecutive year getting into the 3M Open via Open Qualifying (MC/2022). Gaugert, who regularly caddies for Erik van Rooyen, played collegiately at the University of Minnesota and will make his PGA TOUR debut, as will Hofman.

The 18th hole at TPC Twin Cities was the most difficult par 5 on the PGA TOUR schedule last season, playing to an average of 5.105. There were 85 bogeys made (the most of any par 5 in 2021-22), 23 double bogeys (second-most behind No. 13 at TPC River Highlands) and 12 scores higher than double bogey (most). Only two other par 5s, including major championships, averaged an over-par score in 2021-22, and the only par 5 that has played harder to date in 2022-23 is the 14th at Los Angeles Country Club during the U.S. Open.
