Lee Hodges (Winner/-24)

- Earns his first PGA TOUR title in his 65th career start at the age of 28 years, 1 month, 16 days
- Collects 500 points and moves from No. 74 to No. 33 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves from No. 110 to projected No. 54 in the Official World Golf Ranking, the highest position of his career
- First wire-to-wire winner in tournament history and first on TOUR since J.T. Poston at the 2022 John Deere Classic
- Becomes 11th first-time winner of the season and third in as many weeks
 - Akshay Bhatia/Barracuda Championship (note: Brian Harman at The Open Championship won the same week)
 - Vincent Norrman/Barbasol Championship
- Marks second player to win the 3M Open for maiden TOUR victory (Matthew Wolff/2019)
- Largest victory margin at the 3M Open (previous: 3/Tony Finau/2022)
- **Largest margins of victory on the PGA TOUR since 2019**

- Moves to 1-for-2 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (T3/2022 American Express)
- Third 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the 3M Open (2019/Matthew Wolff, 2020/Michael Thompson)
- 23rd 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2022-23
- 260 sets the 72-hole scoring record at 3M Open (previous: 263/Matthew Wolff/2019)
- Wins in his second start at the 3M Open (T16/2022)
- Led the field in birdies (25), Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (9.393) and Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (12.383)
- With eagles on Nos. 6 and 12, becomes sixth 54-hole leader on record (1983-present) to make multiple eagles in the final round (all went on to win)

- Third top-10 in 30 starts this season (T7/THE CJ CUP in SC, T6/Valero Texas Open, Won/3M Open)
- Qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in his rookie season on TOUR (2021-22), finishing No. 76 in the FedExCup standings

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Martin Laird** (T2/-17) records seventh runner-up on TOUR and his best result since winning the 2020 Shriners Children's Open
- **Kevin Streelman** (T2/-17) earns sixth runner-up and 52nd top-10 of his career; was seeking his third TOUR title and first since the 2014 Travelers Championship
- **J.T. Poston** (T2/-17) earns his third career runner-up and first since 2022 Travelers Championship (went on to win the following week at the 2022 John Deere Classic)
- Defending champion **Tony Finau** finishes T7 at 15-under 269 in his bid to become the fourth player this season to successfully defend a title on TOUR and first since Scottie Scheffler (WM Phoenix Open)
- With a T7 finish, **Aaron Baddeley** earns a spot in next week's field at the Wyndham Championship
