Today – A lingering shower/T-storm threat will exist through 8am. Otherwise, partly cloudy skies with increasingly hot conditions are expected today. Temperatures will make a run at the upper 90s, with heat indices in the 100-105F range this afternoon. The T-storm threat will begin to increase again after 3pm, but most of the organized T-storm activity should hold off until after 8pm. Southerly winds can be expected throughout the day with gusts over 20 mph this afternoon. Forecast rainfall: Less than 0.15". **Sunrise: 5:51am / Sunset: 8:46pm**

Extended forecast – A cold front will push into southern Minnesota tonight bringing the threat for showers/T-storms to the Twin Cities. Heavy rain and gusty winds are a concern, however there is still some uncertainty to how widespread activity becomes. A final disturbance is expected to arrive during the day Friday which could lead to another round of T-storms, although confidence in impacts remains low. The front will finally clear the area for the weekend and should settle far enough south to provide dry weather this weekend. Temperatures will also be closer to normal for late July.
