Things to Know

- S.Y. Noh ties the AT&T Byron Nelson 18-hole scoring record with a personal-best 11-under 60
- Noh ties Patrick Cantlay (Shriners Children's Open/R3) for low round of the season
- World No. 2 and Dallas resident Scottie Scheffler sits T4 following a 7-under 64
- Seeking to join Tom Watson as the only players to win the AT&T Byron Nelson three straight times, defending champion K.H. Lee opens with a 1-under 70

- Records nine birdies, one eagle (No. 9) and eight pars en route to an 11-under 60, tying the AT&T Byron Nelson 18-hole scoring record (Sam Snead/1957/R2, Arron Oberholser/2006/R2, Keegan Bradley/2013/R1, Sebastian Munoz/2022/R1, S.Y. Noh/2023/R1)
- Shares low round of the season with Patrick Cantlay, who shot 60 in round three of the Shriners Children's Open
- Previous low round on TOUR was a first-round 62 at the 2012 Deutsche Bank Championship (T13)
- Playing his 665th round on TOUR, ties his career-low nine-hole score with a front-nine 30 (R3, 2015 FedEx St. Jude Classic)
- Holds first-round lead/co-lead for fourth time on TOUR; 0-for-3 to date in converting to victory, most recently finishing T8 at the 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Gained more than 6.5 strokes putting to lead the field and set a career-high
- Making sixth appearance at AT&T Byron Nelson (T69/2012, 70th/2013, MC/2016, MC/2017, MC/2022)

- T15 at the RSM Classic represents best finish in 12 starts this season
- Making his 143rd start since winning his lone PGA TOUR title at the 2014 Zurich Classic of New Orleans
- Players from Korea have won the AT&T Byron Nelson four out of the last nine times, including three straight (Sangmoon Bae/2013, Sung Kang/2019, K.H. Lee/2021 and 2022)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Adam Scott (T2/-8) cards a 63, his best opening-round score on the PGA TOUR since carrying a first-round 62 to a third-place finish at the 2014 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard; is his best round on TOUR since a second-round 63 at the 2021 CJ CUP @ SUMMIT (T5)
- Dallas resident **Zecheng Dou** (T2/-8), who plays out of TPC Craig Ranch, birdies five of his last seven holes to post his career-low round on the PGA TOUR (63); seeking first top-10 finish in 45th TOUR start (best finish: T17/2022 Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- World and FedExCup No. 2 **Scottie Scheffler** (T4/-7) eagles the par-5 18th hole to post a 64 in his fifth start at the AT&T Byron Nelson, where he made his PGA TOUR debut in 2014 as a 17-year-old amateur (T22); opens 6-under in his first six holes (birdie-par-birdie-birdie-eagle), marking his lowest score to par in his opening six holes of a round on TOUR
- Making his first start since the 2023 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play, 2018 AT&T Byron Nelson winner **Aaron Wise** (T46/-3) posts an opening-round 68
- K.H. Lee (T89/-1) opens with a 70 in bid to become the sixth player in the last 50 years to win a PGA TOUR event three straight times; the others: Johnny Miller, Tom Watson (1978-80 AT&T Byron Nelson), Tiger Woods, Stuart Appleby and Steve Stricker
