Today – Warm, humid and breezy conditions will once again be in place today. Given the current instability levels, shower/T-storm development could occur anytime this afternoon. However, with the main frontal boundary still NW of DFW, shower/T-storm chance will be kept at 15% or less during the day. A more substantial threat for precipitation should develop this evening, likely after sunset. Overcast skies this morning will give way to sun and clouds this afternoon. Gusts of 20-25 mph can be expected much of the day.

Extended forecast – Very complex forecast over the next 48 hours and will be contingent on how the T-storm complexes evolve tonight. While timing is highly variable, a complex of T-storms should approach DFW at some, potentially in a weakening state. Regardless, of the outcome tonight, a lull in precipitation chances is expected Saturday morning before scattered shower/T-storm development takes place Saturday afternoon. The threat for showers/T-storm will persist on Sunday, however chances will be diminishing and most development will favor Sunday afternoon.
