Today – Dry conditions are favored much of the day, however slight chances for showers/T-storms exist. First, weakening activity across central Texas may affect the area between 11am-2pm if it doesn't completely diminish. Additionally, a conditional isolated shower/T-storm threat will be in place this evening, mainly after sunset. Otherwise, low overcast and patchy drizzle will eventually give way to partly cloudy skies and increasing southerly winds. Gusts of 20-25 mph are expected after 2pm. **Sunrise: 6:30am / Sunset: 8:16pm**

Extended forecast – An upper level-trough will become positioned over the western U.S. this weekend with occasional impulses of energy moving across Texas. This will lead to waves of showers/T-storms for the DFW Metro, although timing out the periods of highest rain chances remains difficult. Regardless, the axis of heaviest rains likely remains west of DFW with 0.50-1.00" most likely around the golf course during the Saturday-Sunday period. The threat for showers and embedded T-storms may persist into Monday but chances will be decreasing.
