Things to Know

- Justin Rose holds a one-stroke lead entering the final round of the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (5-for-15 to date in his career with the 54-hole lead/co-lead in 72-hole individual stroke-play events)
- Rose has 10 PGA TOUR wins, the most of any player from England since World War II, and is in search of his first title since the 2019 Farmers Insurance Open
- The third round resumed at 8:01 a.m. PT on Sunday and was completed at 11:37 a.m. PT
- Final-round tee times: 12:20 p.m. to 2:32 p.m. PT in threesomes off Nos. 1 and 10; the tournament is scheduled to conclude Monday
- Ben Silverman and Aaron Rodgers win the pro-am portion of the event by one stroke over Peter Malnati and Don Colleran (shortened to 54 holes due to suspensions of play)

Saturday weather summary

- **Forecast:** *Partly cloudy with scattered showers. High of 59. Wind S 15-20 mph with gusts to 30 mph.*
- **Suspensions:** Play was suspended due to wind conditions at 12:12 p.m. PT at Monterey Peninsula Country Club and at 12:20 p.m. at the other two golf courses (Pebble Beach Golf Links, Spyglass Hill Golf Course)
- **Called for the day:** Play did not resume at any point after the initial suspensions and was called for the day at 2:45 p.m. PT
- **Wind gusts:** The highest recorded wind gust during competition at Pebble Beach Golf Links was 32 mph (no meter at the other two golf courses)

Sunday weather summary

- **Morning forecast:** *Partly cloudy with scattered showers. High of 52. Wind WNW 15-25 mph, with gusts to 30 mph.*
- **Resumption and completion of the third round:** The third round resumed at 8:01 a.m. PT and was completed at 11:37 a.m. PT
- **Suspension:** Play was suspended at Pebble Beach Golf Links only due to wet course conditions at 8:36 a.m. PT and resumed at 8:49 a.m. (delay of 13 minutes)

Format changes

- **Preferred lies:** It was announced prior to the start of the tournament that preferred lies are in effect for the first three rounds. Preferred lies will be in effect for the final round.
- **Change to rule regarding those playing the final round:** The low 65 professionals and ties will compete in the final round; **original cut rule:** *low 60 professionals (and ties) play the final round and players finishing 61-65 (and ties) are credited with a made cut and receive official money and FedExCup points, despite not playing the final round*
- **Pro-am format:** The pro-am portion of the event was shortened to 54 holes (professionals only in final round); amateurs were not required to resume third-round play Sunday morning

The last time

- **Last round on the PGA TOUR suspended by wind:** First round, 2021 Butterfield Bermuda Championship
- **Last round at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am suspended by wind:** Third round, 2014 (2 hour, 20 minute delay)
- **Last unscheduled Monday finish on the PGA TOUR:** 2022 PLAYERS Championship
- **Last unscheduled Monday finish at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am:** 2019

- 16th career 54-hole lead/co-lead in 72-hole individual stroke-play events on TOUR, the eighth-most of any player since Rose joined the PGA TOUR at the start of the 2004 season (most: 27, Tiger Woods)
- 5-for-15 to date converting 54-hole leads/co-leads to victory in 72-hole individual stroke-play events on TOUR (wins: 2010 AT&T National, 2011 BMW Championship, 2015 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2018 Charles Schwab Challenge, 2019 Farmers Insurance Open)
- 10 PGA TOUR wins, the most of any player from England since World War II (second-most: Nick Faldo, 9); most recent: 2019 Farmers Insurance Open
- One of two players in the field with 10 or more PGA TOUR victories (other: Jordan Spieth, 13)
- Last player from England to win on TOUR: Matt Fitzpatrick, 2022 U.S. Open
- Entered the 2019 Farmers Insurance Open (most recent win) as the No. 1 player in the Official World Golf Ranking and held the position most recently the week of Monday, April 8, 2019; currently No. 71
- One top-10 in five prior starts this season (T9/Cadence Bank Houston Open)
- One top-10 in three prior starts at the event (T6/2016)
- At the 2019 U.S. Open, the last men's major championship held at Pebble Beach, entered the final round alone in second place (one stroke behind champion Gary Woodland) and went on to finish T3
- Made a hole-in-one during the second round at Spyglass Hill (No. 15), his third career ace on the PGA TOUR and first since the 2007 FedEx St. Jude Championship (formerly The Barclays)
- Last player to make a hole-in-one and go on to win: Webb Simpson, 2020 WM Phoenix Open

Miscellaneous notes

- **Peter Malnati** (T2/-11) holds the best 54-hole position of his career; previous-best: T3, twice (2015 Sanderson Farms Championship/Won, 2019 Cadence Bank Houston Open/T17)
- Second-round leader **Kurt Kitayama** (T2/-11) has three runner-up finishes in his career, including one earlier this season at THE CJ CUP in South Carolina; Kitayama finished T18 at the 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am competing on a sponsor exemption (2022/MC)
- **Keith Mitchell** (4th/-10) is making his sixth career start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and his best result came in 2022 (T12); Mitchell has one career PGA TOUR victory (2019 Honda Classic)
- Stanford, California, native and Stanford University graduate **Joseph Bramlett** (T5/-9) is making his sixth career start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, including appearances in 2011 (MC) and 2012 (T40); Bramlett has three top-10s in 114 starts on TOUR
- First-round leader **Hank Lebioda** (T5/-9) seeks first career PGA TOUR victory after entering the week having missed the cut in his last seven events (first five this season and last two in 2021-22); last made cut: 2022 3M Open (T16)
- **Viktor Hovland** (T5/-9) has three career wins on the PGA TOUR but has not won on TOUR in the United States (2020 Puerto Rico Open, 2020 and 2021 World Wide Technology Championship in Mexico)
- **Maverick McNealy** withdrew during the third round on Saturday due to a left shoulder injury
- **Dylan Frittelli, Brian Gay, Doug Ghim, Will Gordon, Bill Haas, Nate Lashley, Trey Mullinax, Kyle Stanley and Carson Young** withdrew during the third round (after play was called for the day on Saturday)
- **Ben Silverman**, who won The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club on the Korn Ferry Tour last week, and four-time NFL Most Valuable Player **Aaron Rodgers** win the pro-am portion of the event by one stroke over Malnati and Don Collieran (shortened to 54 holes due to suspensions of play)
