Things to Know

- Justin Rose wins the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am by three strokes over Brendon Todd and Brandon Wu, earning his 11th career PGA TOUR title and first since the 2019 Farmers Insurance Open
- Rose becomes first player from Europe to win the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am in tournament history
- At age 42 years, 6 months, 7 days, Rose becomes the oldest player to win on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at the 2021 PGA Championship
- Three-time PGA TOUR winner Brendon Todd finishes runner-up for the first time in his career on the PGA TOUR
- 2022 winner Tom Hoge finishes T48 in his first career title defense
- First unscheduled Monday finish on the PGA TOUR since the 2022 PLAYERS Championship

- Earns his 11th career victory in his 394th start at the age of 42 years, 6 months, 7 days; oldest player to win on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at the 2021 PGA Championship
- First win on TOUR since 2019 Farmers Insurance Open, a span of 1,471 days between victories
- Becomes 105th player to reach 11 wins on the PGA TOUR
- Collects 500 points and moves to No. 10 in the FedExCup standings
- First player from Europe to win the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am in tournament history
- Improves to 6-for-16 converting 54-hole leads/co-leads to victory in 72-hole individual stroke-play events on TOUR (wins: 2010 AT&T National, 2011 BMW Championship, 2015 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2018 Charles Schwab Challenge, 2019 Farmers Insurance Open, 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- 11 PGA TOUR wins marks most of any player from England since World War II (second-most: Nick Faldo, 9)
- First player from England to win on TOUR since Matt Fitzpatrick, 2022 U.S. Open
- Made a hole-in-one during the second round at Spyglass Hill (No. 15), his third career ace on the PGA TOUR and first since the 2007 FedEx St. Jude Championship (formerly The Barclays)
- Becomes first player to make a hole-in-one and go on to win since Webb Simpson, 2020 WM Phoenix Open

Miscellaneous notes

- **Brendon Todd** (T2/-15) ties his low score in 35 rounds at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (65) to finish runner-up for the first time in his career on TOUR and earn his third top-10 in 10 starts at the event (T9/2012, T10/2015, T2, 2023)
- California native **Brandon Wu** (T2/-15) earns second runner-up finish on TOUR in his 48th career start (T2/2022 Mexico Open at Vidanta)
- **Denny McCarthy** (T3/-14) posted a front-nine 29, the seventh time he has posted a 29-or-better on TOUR (either nine) and most of any player in the last five PGA TOUR seasons; following an 8-under 64, his 10 birdies tie his career-best in a round (three times; most recent: R3, 2019 Shriners Children's Open)
- Defending champion **Tom Hoge** finished T48; last player to win consecutive AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am titles was Dustin Johnson (2009-10)

Tournament weather summary

- **Saturday**
 - **Forecast:** *Partly cloudy with scattered showers. High of 59. Wind S 15-20 mph with gusts to 30 mph*
 - **Suspensions:** Play was suspended due to wind conditions at 12:12 p.m. PT at Monterey Peninsula Country Club and at 12:20 p.m. PT at the other two golf courses (Pebble Beach Golf Links, Spyglass Hill Golf Course)
 - **Called for the day:** Play did not resume at any point after the initial suspensions and was called for the day at 2:45 p.m. PT
Wind gusts: The highest recorded wind gust during competition at Pebble Beach Golf Links was 32 mph (no meter at the other two golf courses)
- **Sunday**
 - **Forecast:** *Partly cloudy with scattered showers. High of 52. Wind WNW 15-25 mph, with gusts to 30 mph*
 - **Resumption and completion of third round:** The third round resumed at 8:01 a.m. PT and was completed at 11:37 a.m. PT
 - **Suspension:** Play was suspended at Pebble Beach Golf Links only due to wet course conditions at 8:36 a.m. PT and resumed at 8:49 a.m. (delay of 13 minutes)
 - **Final-round summary:** Final-round tee times were from 12:20 p.m. to 2:32 p.m. PT in threesomes off Nos. 1 and 10. Play was suspended for the day due to darkness at 5:33 p.m. PT, with 55 players left to complete the round.

Format changes

- **Preferred lies:** It was announced prior to the start of the tournament that preferred lies are in effect for the first three rounds. Preferred lies were in effect for the final round.
- **Change to rule regarding those playing in final round:** The low 65 professionals and ties competed in the final round; **original cut rule:** *low 60 professionals (and ties) played the final round and players finishing 61-65 were credited with a made cut and received official money and FedExCup points, despite not playing the final round*
