Vincent Norrman (Won/-22)

- PGA TOUR rookie from Sweden wins first PGA TOUR title in his 23rd start at 25 years, 6 months, 22 days
- 72nd-hole bogey was his first of the day, leading to a playoff with England's Nathan Kimsey, which he won with a par at the first extra hole
- Third playoff in tournament history (2016, 2021, 2023) and eighth this season
- Earns 300 FedExCup points and moves from No. 113 to No. 61 in the standings, with the top 70 players following the Wyndham Championship advancing to the FedExCup Playoffs; earns full exempt status on the PGA TOUR and DP World Tour through 2025
- First player from Sweden to win on TOUR since 2017 (Henrik Stenson/Wyndham Championship)
- Ninth first-time winner this season (first since Wyndham Clark/Wells Fargo Championship)
- Joins Scott Piercy (2015), Grayson Murray (2017) and Jim Herman (2019) as winners in their debut appearance at the Barbasol Championship
- Fourth player to make the Barbasol Championship his maiden TOUR title (Murray/2017, Seamus Power/2021, Trey Mullinax/2022, Vincent Norrman/2023)
- Second rookie to win on TOUR this season (Nico Echavarria/Puerto Rico Open)
- With a final-round 66, records his ninth straight under-par round on TOUR
- Played the front nine 16-under this week, including a 6-under 30 in the final round
- Third top-10 finish on TOUR this season (T9/Zurich Classic of New Orleans with teammate Matthias Schwab, T8/AT&T Byron Nelson, Win/Barbasol Championship)

Additional Notes

- In his PGA TOUR debut, 2022 Challenge Tour Rankings winner **Nathan Kimsey** (2nd/-22) was attempting to become the first player since Jim Benepe at the 1988 Beatrice Western Open to win his first TOUR start; posts a bogey-free final-round 64 to tie **JC Ritchie** (T24/-14) for low round of the day; ranks No. 1 in Strokes Gained: Putting (+8.804)
- Making his PGA TOUR debut, Frenchman Adrien Saddier (T3/-21) earns a spot in the field at next week's Barracuda Championship; ranks No. 1 in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (+5.039); lone professional win came at the Challenge Tour's 2016 Fred Olsen Challenge de Espana
- Third-round leader and PGA TOUR rookie Trevor Cone (T3/-21) was 23-under and tied for the lead through 69 holes before making double bogey at the par-3 16th hole; his best finish in 20 prior starts this season was T23 at the AT&T Byron Nelson
- First- and second-round leader Lucas Glover (5th/-20) posts a 3-under 69, his 12th straight round in the 60s; came into this week off back-to-back top-10 finishes at the Rocket Mortgage Classic (T4) and John Deere Classic (T6); records three top-10s in three consecutive starts for the first time since 2019 (T7/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T4/The Honda Classic, T10/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)

- **Taylor Pendrith** (6th/-19) posts his best result of the season (previous: T7/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am) while attempting to become the fifth different Canadian to win on TOUR this season (Mackenzie Hughes, Adam Svensson, Corey Conners, Nick Taylor)
- With a 3-under 69, Barbasol ambassador **Ryan Armour** (T16/-15) records his 21st straight par-or-better round at the event, dating to a final-round 67 at Grand National in 2015
- There were 12 instances this week of players with two eagles in a round, the most in Barbasol Championship history and one shy of the most at any tournament since 2009 (13/2022 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- The par-5 15th hole at Keene Trace (Champions) gave up 33 eagles this week, the most eagles on any hole on the PGA TOUR this season (previous: 30/No. 9/Waialae Country Club)
